- (c) to finance purchases and provide suitable storage until the time of shipment ;
- (d) to make returns of purchases and stocks as the Board or its duly authorised executive may require ;
- (e) to arrange for approved conveyance to port and for shipment in accordance with shipping instructions given by the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited ;
- (f) to arrange for checkweighing and inspection at port in accordance with the regulations ;
- (g) to arrange for delivery of cocoa to ocean going vessel or the Board's Stores, Apapa, and to hand without delay shipping documents as required to the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited.

4. MINIMUM CONDITIONS

(a) *Purchases*—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout a season a minimum of 400 tons of cocoa (i.e., Main and Light Crops inclusive) ;

(b) *Bags and Twine*—"B" Twill bags will be supplied Licensed Buying Agents by the Board. Applicants must, however, produce evidence of ability to provide sufficient twine to cover at least the minimum purchase requirement ;

(c) *Capital*—Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement necessary to fulfil the obligations of a licensed buying agent. The minimum capital requirement is £9,000.

(d) *Storage*—Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposed areas of operation proper storage to cover at least two hundred tons of cocoa, and adequate port storage where appropriate.

All stores must comply with the requirement of, and be approved by the Western Nigeria Produce Inspection Service. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request, in writing, the Produce Officer of the area concerned to inspect and approve his stores.

(e) *General*—Applicants must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence to show that they are fully conversant with the cocoa trade and likely to be able to fulfil the following conditions :—

(f) *Inspection of Cocoa*—That they will be able to provide an adequate labour force at all stores to handle cocoa at the time of inspection.

(g) *Returns*—That they will render promptly and accurately all returns, particularly of purchases and stocks, which may be called for.

(h) *Evacuation*—That they will be able to make arrangement to secure the necessary transport by road, rail and water to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of cocoa by approved routes.

(i) *Shipping Documents*—That they possess the necessary organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the accurate preparation and prompt submission of shipping documents as required by the Board, and the carrying out of all duties involved in the delivery of cocoa to f.o.b. point.

ACCOUNTS

The Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account of the Bank, which appear on the following pages, reflect the financial results of the Bank's activities during 1965.

Total external reserves were maintained at the 1964 level, but the increase in the value of 'Other Securities' which was mainly accounted for by additional holdings of external securities, the Bank's overall external assets increased during the year. The increase reflects the improvement in the balance of payments in 1965.

The increase in the Bank's holdings of 'Federal Government Securities' is a reflection of the Bank's underwriting of further Federal Government stocks issued in March, and of increased holdings of treasury bills.

The fall in 'Rediscounts and Advances' reflects the substantial reduction in the use of the Central Bank's facilities for crop finance during the 1965-66 season. Although currency in circulation reached a new peak in 1965, the rate of increase during the year was the lowest in recent years.
