APPOINTMENT OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS  
FOR THE 1966-67 COCOA SEASON

It is notified for general information that the Board is prepared to consider applications for appointment as Licensed Buying Agents for the 1966-67 Cocoa Season which will open about the middle of September 1966 (the exact date will be notified later by publication in Mid-Western Nigeria Gazette).



2. Applicants will be required to produce evidence that they are likely to be able to fulfil the minimum conditions set out in the following paragraphs which are based on :

(a) the normal functions which a Licensed Buying Agent is required to perform :

(b) ability to purchase and handle a minimum purchase requirement of an average crop. This is felt to be the lowest possible figure of purchases compatible with orderly Marketing and is taken as a quantity of 250 tons for an average season.

### 3. FUNCTIONS OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS

The main functions which Licensed Buying Agents will be required to perform on behalf of the Board are :—

- (a) to purchase Cocoa at buying stations at not less than the minimum prices ;
- (b) to bag and arrange for inspection in accordance with the regulations ;
- (c) to finance purchases and provide suitable storage until the time of shipment ;
- (d) to make returns of purchases and stocks as the Board or its duly authorised executive may require ;
- (e) to arrange for approved conveyance to port and for shipment in accordance with shipping instructions given by the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited ;
- (f) to arrange for chekweighing and inspection at port in accordance with the regulations ;
- (g) to arrange for delivery of Cocoa to ocean-going vessel and to hand without delay shipping documents as required to the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited ;
- (h) to arrange for delivery of Cocoa as to Board may direct.

### 4. MINIMUM CONDITIONS

(a) *Purchases.*—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout a season a minimum of 250 tons of Cocoa (*i.e.*, main crop and light crop inclusive).

(b) *Bag and Twine.*—'B' Twill bags will be supplied Licensed Buying Agents by the Board. Applicants must, however, produce evidence of ability to provide sufficient twine to cover at least the minimum purchase requirement.

(c) *Capital.*—Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement necessary to fulfil the obligations of a Licensed Buying Agent. The minimum capital requirement is £5,000.

(d) *Storage.*—Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposed areas of operation proper storage to cover at least 150 tons of Cocoa, and adequate port storage. All stores must comply with the requirements of, and be approved by the Mid-Western Nigeria Produce Inspection Service. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request, in writing, the Produce Officer of the area to inspect and approve the stores.

(e) *General.*—Applicants must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence to show that they are fully conversant with the Cocoa trade and likely to be able to fulfil the following conditions.

(f) *Inspection of Cocoa.*—That they will be able to provide an adequate labour force at all stores to handle Cocoa at the time of inspection.

(g) *Return.*—That they will render promptly and accurately all returns, particularly of purchases and stocks, which may be called for.

(h) *Evacuation.*—That they will be able to make arrangement to secure the necessary transport by road and water, to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of Cocoa by approved routes.

(i) *Shipping documents.*—That they possess the necessary organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the accurate preparation and prompt submission of shipping documents as required by the Board, and the carrying out of all duties involved in the delivery of Cocoa to f.o.b. point.

### 5. METHOD OF APPLICATION

Application forms and details as to their completion can be obtained from the Headquarters of the Mid-Western Nigeria Marketing Board, Ikpoba Slope, Private Mail Bag 1084, Benin City.

6. Firms and persons wishing to apply must forward their application forms, duly and correctly completed in duplicate, to reach the Secretary, Mid-Western Nigeria Marketing Board, Ikpoba Slope, Private Mail Bag 1084, Benin City, not later than 15th June, 1966. Applications received after the closing date will not be considered. Firms and persons already appointed as Licensed Buying Agents under the current Marketing Scheme are not required to re-apply.

3. **Qualifications.**—Associate Membership of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors or Associate Membership of the Chartered Institute of Auctioneers and Estate Agents, or a Science Degree in Estate Management. A holder of the last qualification will be appointed a Pupil Lands Officer and will enter the salary scale at £762 per annum.

*Government Notice No. 798 (2nd publication)***INVITATION FOR PROPOSALS FOR A PASSENGER MOTOR VEHICLE ASSEMBLY PLANT IN NIGERIA**

1. Whereas the Government, desiring to encourage the establishment of an automobile assembly plant in Nigeria; has provided in Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) (No. 1) Order 1966 of 26th March, 1966 that components for passenger cars (including station wagons and estate cars) may be imported CKD (completely knocked down) for local assembly by a manufacturer approved in that behalf by the Ministry, and that such components will be dutiable at 15 per centum less than the rate applicable to a similar vehicle imported assembled, the Government now wishes to solicit proposals from producers of established reputation from which will be selected a single producer who will be granted approved status for the above described tariff differential.

2. All proposals must meet the following conditions:—

(a) that no assumption of risk by the Federal Government be required such as Federal Government ownership of equity, Federal Government guarantee of debt;

(b) that the group or groups responsible for the technical and economic performance of the proposed project maintain a sufficient stake in the enterprise to insure their continued concern for its sound economic performance;

(c) that the proposed project be economically viable on the basis of the concessions herein offered;

(d) that sufficient data be included in the proposal to enable the Government to evaluate the economic costs and benefits of the proposed project to the Nigerian economy and its impact upon Nigeria's foreign exchange position. Data should deal with planned programmes of expansion and planned increases in local procurement as specifically requested below in paragraphs 4 and 5.

(e) that assembly must be from completely knocked down (CKD) components. A definition of CKD is obtainable from the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Industries.

(f) that components from local sources be used if and when available in sufficient quantity and quality;

(g) that provision be made for initial or eventual Nigerian participation in the ownership of all or a portion of the equity;

(h) that provision be made for satisfactory servicing facilities in major areas of distribution including the maintenance of adequate levels of inventory;

3. Importance will be attached to the qualifications of the group or groups that have an economic stake in the proposed enterprise. In judging the proposals weight will be given to evidence that this group has:—

(a) experience in the development of automobile technology and ready access to the latest improvements of product quality;

(b) experience in assembling automobiles in other developing countries;

(c) a policy of, and experience in encouraging the local supply of components;

(d) experience in the establishment and training of independent local dealership organisations;

(e) willingness to train local personnel for technical and managerial positions, and experience in doing so;

(f) an established market position in Nigeria for the products to be manufactured and demonstrated high standards of quality and efficiency in their servicing.

4. The Government views automobile assembling as a germinal industry whose establishment can be an important stimulus to other types of economic activity. By encouraging a single assembler the Government hopes that economies of scale can be achieved that will justify increases in the value added in Nigeria. Proposals should therefore include:—

(a) a programme of production expansion, over at least the next eight years indicating proportion allocable to each make, model and body style proposed. Such programme should be based upon realistic estimates of market growth and the ability of the producer to compete under the duty differential incentive being offered by Government as described herein in paragraph 1 of this notice;

(b) a realistic estimate when, and the extent to which, the proposed assembler could expect to procure, manufacture, or assemble additional components not now available locally without any increase in Government concessions;

(c) an estimate of the additional investment, capacity, employment, value of production and value of imports involved in the programme described in (a) and (b) above.

5. It is realised that additional incentives may be required if proposers are to make commitments to establish a large assembly plant in Nigeria. Proposals should therefore indicate whether proposers would be willing to increase the size of the planned projects and seek the procurement, manufacture, or assembly locally of additional components if the Government were willing to guarantee all or a portion of the market to the local assembler. If, with such a guarantee, but without any increase in import duty on assembled passenger vehicles and without any increase in percentage points between CKD and assembled passenger vehicles, proposers would substantially increase the size and scope of their projects, the proposal should describe such revised project in complete detail including:—

(a) the programme of market guarantees that would be requested from Government and the preferred form that such market guarantees should take;



- (b) the size of initial investment, capacity, production, employment and value of imported components ;
- (c) the planned programme on an annual basis of expansion of investment, capacity, production (indicating proportion allocable to each make, model and body style proposed) and employment ;
- (d) the planned levels of imported components ; describing specifically the types of components that would be imported ;
- (e) plans to procure, manufacture or assemble locally components not at this time available locally, indicating the amount and probable value of such components.
- (f) sufficient cost and financial detail to enable the Government to make a calculation of benefits and costs to the economy of the revised project called for under this paragraph.

6. All applications already submitted should be revised along the terms set out in this notice and re-submitted. Revised as well as fresh proposals should be marked "Secret" and forwarded to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Industries, Broad Street, Lagos not later than 15th July, 1966. All proposals received will be evaluated in accordance with the normal Government procedures.
