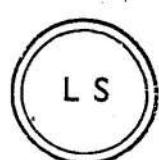

INVITATION FOR PROPOSALS FOR A PASSENGER MOTOR VEHICLE ASSEMBLY PLANT IN NIGERIA

1. Whereas the Government, desiring to encourage the establishment of an automobile assembly plant in Nigeria, has provided in Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) (No. 1) Order 1966 of 26th March, 1966 that components for passenger cars (including station wagons and estate cars) may be imported CKD (completely knocked down) for local assembly by a manufacturer approved in that behalf by the Ministry, and that such components will be dutiable at 15 per centum less than the rate applicable to a similar vehicle imported assembled, the Government now wishes to solicit proposals from producers of established reputation from which will be selected a single producer who will be granted approved status for the above described tariff differential.

2. All proposals must meet the following conditions:—

(a) that no assumption of risk by the Federal Government be required such as Federal Government ownership of equity, Federal Government guarantee of debt;

(b) that the group or groups responsible for the technical and economic performance of the proposed project maintain a sufficient stake in the enterprise to insure their continued concern for its sound economic performance;

(c) that the proposed project be economically viable on the basis of the concessions herein offered;

(d) that sufficient data be included in the proposal to enable the Government to evaluate the economic costs and benefits of the proposed project to the Nigerian economy and its impact upon Nigeria's foreign exchange position. Data should deal with planned programmes of expansion and planned increases in local procurement as specifically requested below in paragraphs 4 and 5.

(e) that assembly must be from completely knocked down (CKD) components. A definition of CKD is obtainable from the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Industries.

(f) that components from local sources be used if and when available in sufficient quantity and quality;

(g) that provision be made for initial or eventual Nigerian participation in the ownership of all or a portion of the equity;

(h) that provision be made for satisfactory servicing facilities in major areas of distribution including the maintenance of adequate levels of inventory;

3. Importance will be attached to the qualifications of the group or groups that have an economic stake in the proposed enterprise. In judging the proposals weight will be given to evidence that this group has:—

(a) experience in the development of automobile technology and ready access to the latest improvements of product quality;

(b) experience in assembling automobiles in other developing countries;

(c) a policy of, and experience in encouraging the local supply of components;

(d) experience in the establishment and training of independent local dealership organisations;

(e) willingness to train local personnel for technical and managerial positions, and experience in doing so;

(f) an established market position in Nigeria for the products to be manufactured and demonstrated high standards of quality and efficiency in their servicing.

4. The Government views automobile assembling as a germinal industry whose establishment can be an important stimulus to other types of economic activity. By encouraging a single assembler the Government hopes that economies of scale can be achieved that will justify increases in the value added in Nigeria. Proposals should therefore include:—

(a) a programme of production expansion, over at least the next eight years indicating proportion allocable to each make, model and body style proposed. Such programme should be based upon realistic estimates of market growth and the ability of the producer to compete under the duty differential incentive being offered by Government as described herein in paragraph 1 of this notice;

(b) a realistic estimate when, and the extent to which, the proposed assembler could expect to procure, manufacture, or assemble additional components not now available locally without any increase in Government concessions;

(c) an estimate of the additional investment, capacity, employment, value of production and value of imports involved in the programme described in (a) and (b) above.

5. It is realised that additional incentives may be required if proposers are to make commitments to establish a large assembly plant in Nigeria. Proposals should therefore indicate whether proposers would be willing to increase the size of the planned projects and seek the procurement, manufacture, or assembly locally of additional components if the Government were willing to guarantee all or a portion of the market to the local assembler. If, with such a guarantee, but without any increase in import duty on assembled passenger vehicles and without any increase in percentage points between CKD and assembled passenger vehicles, proposers would substantially increase the size and scope of their projects, the proposal should describe such revised project in complete detail including:—

- (a) the programme of market guarantees that would be requested from Government and the preferred form that such market guarantees should take;
- (b) the size of initial investment, capacity, production, employment and value of imported components;
- (c) the planned programme on an annual basis of expansion of investment, capacity, production (indicating proportion allocable to each make, model and body style proposed) and employment;
- (d) the planned levels of imported components; describing specifically the types of components that would be imported;
- (e) plans to procure, manufacture or assemble locally components not at this time available locally, indicating the amount and probable value of such components.
- (f) sufficient cost and financial detail to enable the Government to make a calculation of benefits and costs to the economy of the revised project called for under this paragraph.
