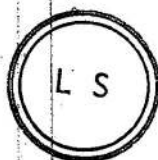

WHEREAS by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Republic as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos shall consist of the Chief Justice of Lagos and any such number of other Judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS the number of Judges of the High Court of Lagos is now eight in addition to the Chief Justice of Lagos:

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (1) of the Constitution of the Republic as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Lagos shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

NOW THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint OLADIPO ROTIMI IBIKUNLE GEORGE to act as a Judge of the High Court of Lagos with effect from 24th day of June, 1966.

GIVEN under my hand and the Public Seal of the Republic of Nigeria at State House, Lagos, this 16th day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six.
