WHEREAS by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of the Western Group of Provinces as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Western Group of Provinces shall consist of the Chief Justice of Western Group of Provinces and any such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS the number of Judges of the High Court of Western Group of Provinces is now twelve in addition to the Chief Justice of Western Group of Provinces :

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (1) of the Constitution of the Western Group of Provinces as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Western Group of Provinces shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint CARLYLE ASHTON PIPER to act as a Judge of the High Court of Western Group of Provinces with effect from the 18th day of July, 1966.

WHEREAS by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of Northern Group of Provinces as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Northern Group of Provinces shall consist of the Chief Justice of Northern Group of Provinces and any such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS the number of Judges of the High Court of Northern Group of Provinces is now seven in addition to the Chief Justice of Northern Group of Provinces and a Senior Puisne Judge :

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (1) of the Constitution of Northern Group of Provinces as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Northern Group of Provinces shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :
