

THE CONSULTTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF NIGERIA

As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966



By His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel Yakubu Gowon, Head of the National Military Government, Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces of the Republic of Nigeria.

Lt.-Col. Yakubu Gowon, Head of the National Military Government, Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces

Whereas Uzodinma Iroegbu Nwaobiala, having been duly convicted of the offences of treasonable felony and conspiracy to commit a felony, and sentenced to imprisonment for five and three years respectively on all

AND WHEREAS the said Uzodinma Iroegbu Nwaobiala, having served a portion of the sentence originally imposed on him in September 1963:

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Military Council after reviewing his case, is pleased to remit the sentence and to grant a full pardon.

Now THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 101 (1) of the Constitution of the Republic and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Supreme Military Council do hereby remit the unexpired portion of the sentence imposed on the aforesaid Uzodinma Iroegbu Nwaobiala and grant him a full pardon.
