Candidates will be required to spend long periods in rural areas and to maintain accurate records of equipment, plant, labour and materials involved in construction projects.

5. **Other conditions of service.**—(a) The post is pensionable and appointment will be on probation for three years in case of new entrants into Government Service.

(b) Rent is payable at 8½ per cent of basic salary subject to a minimum of £120 per annum when an officer is occupying Government Quarters.
