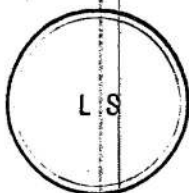

THE CONSTITUTION OF NORTHERN NIGERIA

AS MODIFIED BY THE CONSTITUTION (SUSPENSION AND MODIFICATION) DECREE 1966

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Chapter 122) of Northern Nigeria, it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi, a Deputy Grand Kadi and three other Judges learned in the Sharia:

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (1) of the Constitution of Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Grand Kadi and the other Judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee.

NOW THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint ALHAJI ABUBAKAR MAHMUD to act as Deputy Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal from 28th November, 1966 to 15th January, 1967 both dates inclusive.

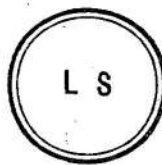

2. Visitors wishing to see the Yankari Game Reserve should apply for permission to enter the Reserve, preferably at least one month in advance of the date of their intended visit. Application should be made to the Regional Game Warden, Ministry of Animal and Forest Resources, P.M.B. 12 Bauchi (Telegraphic Address GAME BAUCHI).

3. A rest camp with furnished huts and full catering facilities exists at the Wikki Warm Spring Camp and visitors are advised to reserve accommodation through the Manageress, Bauchi/Yankari Catering Rest House, Bauchi; (telegraphic address "Restotel Bauchi") at the time they notify the Regional Game Warden of their intention to visit the Game Reserve.

4. Visitors to the Game Reserve are required to comply with any rules and instructions for visitors issued by the Regional Game Warden.

5. The Yankari Game Reserve is situated in the Fali and Duguri Districts of Bauchi Emirate to the south-east of Bauchi, and covers an area of approximately 720 square miles. From Bauchi, access to the Reserve is by the Bauchi-Gombe all season tarred road for a distance of 25 miles to Dindima on the east bank of the Gongola River; thence by the Dindima-Gar-Mainamaji all season road for a distance of 18 miles to the Mainamaji Base Camp at the north-western corner of the Reserve; thence through the Reserve by an all season motor track for a distance of 27 miles to the visitors' camp at Wikki Spring.

6. Visitors are expected to use their own transport to and from Wikki Spring on entering and leaving the Game Reserve though a limited number of requests for transport from Bauchi to and from Wikki can be met. For excursions from Wikki within the Reserve, Landrovers are provided, though visitors having four-wheel drive vehicles may use their own vehicles if they wish, provided they are accompanied by a member of the Game Unit Staff.

7. Excursions to view the wildlife are undertaken each morning and evening. Game Scouts accompany each excursion as guides. To have a reasonable certainty of seeing a representative selection of the wildlife, it is recommended that at least one night be spent in the Reserve.

8. There is an unfurnished Game Unit rest house at the Mainamaji Base Camp available for persons wishing to break their journey to and from the Reserve for a brief rest.

9. Excellent swimming facilities exist at the Wikki Warm Spring, situated in a gorge immediately below the Wikki camp. Cemented steps lead down from the camp to the spring, and there is a cemented landing and a changing hut at the edge of the spring.

10. At the office of the Regional Game Warden in Bauchi is a small wildlife museum which is open to visitors. There is also a small wildlife museum at the visitors' camp, Wikki.

11. The following diurnal animals inhabit the Game Reserve, and visitors can normally expect to see a fair selection:—

Rules Governing Visitors to the Yankari Game Reserve

1. No visitor may take firearms to the Game Reserve. Any visitor having firearms in his possession on arrival at the Reserve is required to hand them over to a member of the Game Unit staff at Mainamaji Base Camp for custody during the time that visitor is within the Reserve.

2. Except in the immediate environs of Wikki Camp, visitors are not permitted to move about in the Reserve except under the guidance and in company of the Regional Game Warden or a member of his uniformed staff.

3. While on excursions from Wikki Camp, dismounting from vehicles (except with the permission of the member of the Game Unit staff in charge of the party) is forbidden.

4. Visitors are forbidden to drive harass or deliberately startle game.

5. No fires may be lit, except at the Wikki Camp, and the throwing of burning cigarette ends into the bush should be avoided.

6. In the interests of safety, children below the age of 10 years are not permitted to join excursions. They must remain at Wikki Camp in the care of an adult visitor or a trustworthy servant.

7. A maximum speed limit of 30 miles per hour must be observed on the access road between Mainamaji and Wikki.

8. Dogs are not allowed in the Reserve.

9. The following charges are payable:—

(a) Ten shillings entrance fee per adult and five shillings entrance fee per child under the age of fifteen. This fee is payable in respect of all persons entering the reserve including servants.

(b) Ten shillings per person in respect of transport for each excursion to view the game.

(c) Ten shillings per trip per vehicle for the services of the Game Unit staff when a visitor uses his own four-wheel drive vehicle to view the game.

(d) Sixty shillings per person in respect of transport for the round trip Bauchi-Wikki-Bauchi payable at the office of the Regional Game Warden, Bauchi.

10. Visitors are reminded that although the game may appear tame and placid, they are wild and that some species (e.g., bushcow) are potentially dangerous to human life. Visitors entering the Game Reserve do so entirely at their own risk, and the Government of Northern Nigeria cannot be held responsible for any damage, injury or loss, either to visitors themselves or to their property.
