By virtue of sections 4 and 9 of the Customs and Excise Management Act (No. 55 of 1958) it is hereby notified that the hours during which the public offices of the Department of Customs and Excise shall be open, or during which officers of Customs and Excise shall be available, for the performance of particular duties are as set forth herein.

2. Definitions

In this Notice—

“Extra attendance” means—

- (a) Attendance given by an officer outside the prescribed hours and on Sundays and public holidays;
- (b) attendance given on request outside an officer's normal place of business.

“Indoor and Outdoor Attendance”—Any attendance which is not specified as “Outdoor” is “Indoor”.
“Outdoor” attendance consists of the following:—

- (a) Attendance at the licensed premises of an Excise trader subject to the conditions stipulated in Annex “A”;
- (b) attendance outside a normal place of business, on special arrangement;
- (c) boarding of ships and aircraft;
- (d) clearing of passengers and passengers' baggage;
- (e) landing and shipping operations, including the release of goods.

“Normal Place of Business” means normal areas of operation by officers of Customs and Excise within:—

- (a) a Custom House;
 - (b) a Customs Airport;
 - (c) a Customs Area;
 - (d) a Customs Station;
 - (e) a Government Warehouse;
 - (f) a Parcels Post Depot;
- and—subject to such conditions as the Board may impose—within:—
- (g) a Licensed Customs or Excise Warehouse;
 - (h) a Licensed Excise factory;
 - (i) an Approved Wharf.

“Prescribed Hours of Attendance” are as indicated in Annex “A”.

3. Places at which Attendance will not be provided:

Except by special arrangement, attendance will not be provided for services outside a normal place of business.

4. Application for Extra Attendance

(a) Any person requiring the extra attendance of an officer is required to submit an application to the proper supervising officer on Form Sale 10—Application for Extra Attendance—specimen at Annex “B”. If the request is granted, the applicant will be required to pay, in advance, any charges estimated, including charges for any disciplinary (supervisory) visits that may be made by proper officers during such attendance.

(b) Applications are to be submitted in good time to allow of suitable arrangement being made for the required attendance.

(c) The granting of an application is at the discretion of the proper officer who may refuse the request if he is not satisfied that a good reason exists for granting it.

(d) Attendance on Sundays and public holidays, and between the hours of 10.30 p.m. and 6 a.m., will be approved only in exceptional cases. Extra attendance before the prescribed morning opening hours, and during afternoon breaks, will be approved only by special arrangement and at least four working hours prior notification is required for the former.

(e) Requests from applicants who have defaulted in the payment of charges on previous applications will not be granted until all outstanding bills have been settled.

5. Waiver of Pre-payment

(a) Waiver of pre-payment of charges may be granted in certain circumstances. Application for this concession is to be made on Form Sale 11—Waiver of Pre-payment of Charges for Extra Attendance (specimen at Annex “C”)—in triplicate, and addressed to the proper Collector.

(b) Prompt Payment of Charges

(1) The attention of applicants is particularly invited to the undertaking on Form Sale 11 that all charges will be paid within seven days of the notification of the charges.

(2) Where such charges are not paid within the stipulated period, the concession will be withdrawn immediately.

6. Charges for Extra Attendance

Where attendance is given by the proper officer to an applicant but the applicant fails to act on his request, a disappointment charge shall be raised for such attendance as follows :—

(a) On a working day	one hour.
(b) On a Sunday or public holiday	two hours.

8. Transport

Where the attendance of an officer is required outside his normal place of business, the applicant is required to provide transport, where necessary, or to defray the cost thereof.

(iv) Have completed an articulated apprenticeship in their trade followed by a minimum of 10 year's experience and, in addition, have had experience in erection or maintenance of plant or vehicles, and overhauls and/or servicing and Testing Equipment and/or practical welding. They must have a good general knowledge of Diesel Engine running and maintenance, and be capable of reading drawings. Preference will be given to holders of City and Guilds Certificates. Candidates without the articles apprenticeship may be considered only if they have had extensive practical experience in a responsible position carrying out duties identical to those laid down for the post.
