2. The Canadian World Exhibition for 1967 is being held not only to mark the first Centenary of the Canadian Confederation but also to promote cultural and trade relations between individuals and between the nations of the world. 4. By means of photo-montages, films, models, displays of national products, customs, dress, arts and crafts, illustrative maps, charts, locally produced books and pamphlets, periodicals, Government publications and other visual aids, the Nigerian pavilion will be geared to attracting a very large majority of visitors to the Exhibition.
