STATEMENT OF CLAIM

The Plaintiff is the person authorised by law to prosecute and defend claims on behalf of the Federal Government of Nigeria.

- 2. The defendant was until the expiration of the life of Parliament in 1964 a member of the House of Senate and a Minister of State in the Ministry of External Affairs.
- 3. During his tenure of office as a Minister of State, the defendant, in 1963 applied to the Government for and was granted an advance of, £2,000 to purchase a motor vehicle. The said payment was made by Cheque No. 86728 on Payment Voucher No. 000043 of 26th September, 1963.
- 4. The terms and conditions governing the said advance are contained in an agreement in writing dated 27th September, 1963, made between the Federal Government on the one hand and the defendant on the other. The plaintiff will rely on this agreement at the trial.
- 5. By Clause 1(a) of the said agreement, the said loan of £2,000 was to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum and was to be repaid by monthly instalments over a period of 60 months commencing from October 1963.
- 6. By Clause 1(h) of the said agreement, if the defendant shall die or shall for any reason leave the service of the Government during the continuance of the said agreement he shall immediately pay to the Government the balance of the capital and the interest due. The defendant left the service of the Government during the continuance of the said agreement but did not pay to the government the balance as agreed or at all.
- 7. The defendant paid only 16 instalments of £33-6s-8d each in respect of the principal from October 1963 to January 1965, leaving a balance of £1,571-2s-0d.
- 8. By reason of the above promise the defendant has become liable to pay to the Federal Government the sum of £1,571-2s-0d being the balance of capital and interest outstanding on the said advance and made up as follows:—

FREE PRIMARY EDUCATION 1968—REGISTRATION OF CHILDREN OF PRIMARY SCHOOL AGE

 - (a) satisfactory evidence of the child's age
 (birth certificates preferred; or statutory declaration of age in lieu thereof).
 - (b) two passport-size photographs of the child;
 - (c) a certificate of recent small-pox vaccination.
- Registration Officers are empowered to reject any child who appears to them to be under or above primary school age.

Engineering and Building Candidates must possess any of the following qualifications: H.N.D., H.N.C., Higher Certificate of City and Guilds, or Higher Diploma of Yaba College of Technology or other acceptable qualification in Civil, Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or Building, together with relevant experience.

Commerce candidates must possess either the H.N.D. or H.N.C. in Business Studies, or the ACCS or ACIS, or equivalent qualification.

Candidates for training as teachers of Stenography must possess the West African School Certificate or equivalent including English, together with Advanced Certificates in Typewriting and Shorthand, or be qualified as Stenographer, Grade I or Secretary-Typist. The duration of the course will be 10 months.

For serving teachers who must be sponsored by their employers the duration will be 5 months,

3. Conditions of training.—(a) Successful candidates will be eligible for free board and tuition. In addition an allowance of £5 a month will be paid to each student. In the case of those students who are not in College hostels they will be eligible for free tuition plus a monthly allowance of £10 for the duration of the course.
