CERTIFICATE OF ORIGIN

(To be used by producing Members)

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Every export of coffee from any Member in whose territory that coffee has been grown shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Origin, except;

(a) coffee for consumption on ships, aeroplanes and other international carriers; and

(b) samples and parcels up to the limit of 60 kilogrammes net of green coffee or the equivalent thereof (see Special Instructions).

2. On each Certificate issued the Certifying Agency shall in the spaces provided, fill in the name of the country and the Reference Number. The Reference Number shall include the code number of the country of origin (two digits to be supplied by the Organization) and the code number of the port of export or any inland point of embarkation (two digits to be supplied by the country in question) in that country followed by the serial number of the actual shipment. Thus a four-digit prefix will precede the serial number of the shipment in question. At each port or inland point of embarkation numbering of each shipment shall proceed consecutively from the number one. At the beginning of each coffee year, on 1st October, the numbering of shipments at each port or inland point of embarkation shall again begin with the number one and proceed consecutively.

3. In the spaces provided enter the following;

(a) the name of the ship on which the coffee is exported, the shipping company or both. If the export is to go by rail or other means of transport than ship, enter the name of the carrier (company); and

(b) the name of the port or other point of embarkation, the name of the port or country of destination and the date of approximate date of shipment.

4. On the line headed "via" enter the name of any port or point in transit where the coffee exported will be disembarked before proceeding to the destination stated in the certificate. Where the export is going direct to destination, without being disembarked in transit, enter the word "Direct" (see Special Instructions).

5. Below the entry of date of shipment show the form of the coffee exported by marking an "X" in the appropriate space. If coffee other than green, roasted or soluble is being exported the form of the coffee shall also be specified in words, e.g., by the entry of "liquid coffee", "parchment coffee" or description of coffee in other form [see definitions in Article 2 (1) of the International Coffee Agreement, 1962], after the word "Other". Where an export of coffee include more than one form of coffee, separate certificates shall be completed for each form of coffee included in the shipment.

6. Each export of coffee, in whatever form, shall be described by shipping marks or other identification in the space provided.

7. Specify unit of weight in kilogrammes or pounds (one pound equals 0.4536 kilogramme; all conversions will be made by the Organization) and enter gross and net weights of the shipment.

8. The lines headed "Observations" may be used for further identification of the coffee being exported or for relevant comments pertaining to the information already contained in the certificate.

9. The certificate is completed with the entry of the name of the Certifying Agency, the signature of the Certifying Officer; entry of the date of signature and the affixing of the official Customs' stamp, together with the date of stamping at the bottom of the Certificate.

10. There shall be one original Certificate of Origin and as many copies as each producing issuing Member may determine; the original shall be clearly printed or stamped "Original" and each copy printed or stamped "Copy". In determining the number of copies the producing Members may take into consideration the legal and other requirements of the Member country of destination. The original Certificate of Origin completed for each export of coffee shall accompany the shipping documents. As soon as the certificate is issued a copy shall be sent by airmail or other rapid means to the Organization.
