

Whereas by section 111 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall consist of the Chief Justice of Nigeria and any such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS the number of Justices of the Supreme Court is now nine in addition to the Chief Justice Nigeria:

AND WHEREAS by section 112 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Chief Justice of Nigeria and the Justices of the Supreme Court shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council:

Now therefore, The Sufreme Military Council, do hereby appoint Charles Olusoji Madarikan to be a Justice of the Supreme Court with effect from the 1st day of June, 1967.

WESTERN NIGERIA MARKETING BOARD APPOINTMENT OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS FOR THE 1967-68 COCOA SEASON

It is notified for general information that the Board is prepared to consider applications for appointment as licensed buying agents for the 1967-68. Cocoa Season which will open about September 1967 the exact date will be notified later by publication in the Western Nigeria Gazette.

- 2. Applicants will be required to produce evidence that they are likely to be able to fulfil the minimum conditions set out in the following paragraphs, which are based on:—
 - (a) the normal functions which a licensed buying agent is required to perform;
 - (b) ability to purchase and handle a minimum of 400 tons for an average season;
 - (c) stipulated conditions as regards storage, evacuation, etc.
- 3. Functions of Licensed Buying Agents,—The main functions which licensed buying agents will be required to perform on behalf of the Board are:—
 - (a) to purchase cocoa at buying stations at not less than the minimum prices;
 - (b) to bag and arrange for inspection in accordance with the regulations;
 - (c) to finance purchases and provide suitable storage until the time of shipment;
 - (d) to make returns of purchases and stocks as the Board or its duly authorised executive may require;

- (e) to arrange for approved conveyance to port and for shipment in accordance with shipping instructions given by the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited;
- (f) to arrange for checkweighing and inspection at port in accordance with the regulations;
- (g) to arrange for delivery of cocoa to the Board's Stores, Ikeja and Apapa, and to hand without delay shipping documents as required to the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited.
- 4. Minimum conditions—(a) Purchases.—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout a season a minimum of 400 tons of cocoa (i.e., Main and Light Crops inclusive). Evidence will be required of previous experience in the produce trade and of the established firms of licensed buying agents to which the applicant had been selling his purchases. In this, connection applicants may be required to produce their previous purchases and sales records and/or certificates from licensed buying agents of purchases sold to them in previous seasons.
- (b) Bags and Twine.—"B" Twill bags will be supplied to Licensed Buying Agents by the Board. Applicants must, however, produce evidence of ability to provide sufficient twine to cover at least the minimum purchase requirement;
- (c) Capital.—Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement necessary to fulfil the obligations of a licensed buying agent. The minimum capital requirement is £9,000. Applicants will be required to forward, as evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement, copies of their bank statements for the six months preceding the date of the application, duly certified by their bankers. Only applications to which such bank statements have been attached will be considered.
- (d) Storage.—Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposed areas of operation proper storage to cover at least two hundred tons of cocoa, and adequate port storage where appropriate.

All stores must comply with the requirement of, and be approved by the Western Region Produce Inspection Service. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request, in writing, the Produce Officer of the area concerned to inspect and approve his stores.

- (e) General.—Applicants must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence to show that they are fully conversant with the cocoa trade and likely to be able to fulfil the following conditions:—
 - (i) Inspection of Cocoa.—That they will be able to provide an adequate isbour force at all afores to handle cocoa at the time of inspection.
 - (ii) Returns.—That they will render promptly and accurately all returns, particularly of purchases and stocks, which may be called for.
 - (iii) Evacuation.—That they will be able to make arrangement to secure the necessary transport by road, rail and water to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of cocoa by approved routes.

- (iv) Shipping documents.—That they possess the necessary organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the accurate preparation and prompt submission of shipping documents as required by the Board, and the carrying out of all duties involved in the delivery of cocoa to f.o.b. point.
- 5. Method of application.—Application forms and details as to their completion can be obtained free of harge from the Headquarters of the Western Nigeria Marketing Board, Cocoa House, Bank Road, Iladan or the Lagos Zonal Headquarters of the Board, Private Mail Bag 1018, Ikeja Industrial Estates, Ikeja.

Assistance to Nigerian Exporters, Timber Dealers . and Furniture Manufacturers

It is notified for general information that the Federal Ministry of Trade in collaboration with the Ministries of Agriculture and Natural Resources, Industries, and External Affairs is sponsoring a collective display of all species of Nigerian timber, assorted furniture, and decorative handicrafts for exhibition at the International Suppliers' Fair for Furniture. Upholatery and Wood Processing Industries (INTERZUM) to be held in Cologne, Federal Republic of Germany, from the 22nd to 25th June, 1967.

2. At the Government of Nigeria's Stand at the Cologne Fair strenuous efforts will be made by the official display team to promote a greater utilization through the exportation of the lesser known species of Nigerian timber. Towards that end a wide range of timber samples have been built at the Federal Forest Research Laboratory to demonstrate the resilience and utility of some local woods which, at present, have not entered into the world export market. In order, therefore, to direct prospective German and European buyers along the right channels arrangements have been made to assign a Federal Government timber utilization officer to the Nigerian national pavilion at the Cologne Fair.

3. Apart from the promotion of timber exports, the Nigerian display team will also solicit patronage of Nigerian furniture, furniture parts and accessories, decorative handicrafts and foreign capital investment towards mass production of furniture for export. In that connection a number of European suppliers of wood working machinery and plant who may be participating in the Cologne Fair will be invited to visit the Nigerian Stand with a view to their submitting offers and/or proposals for the consideration of interested Nigerian timber dealers.

4.
