Furnished quarters, if available, are provided at a rental charge of 8½ per cent of basic salary subject to a maximum of £150 per annum or as may be determined by Government regulation. For contract officers, leave is granted at the rate of one week for each month of residential service after each tour, the length of which may vary from 12 to 24 months, depending on the age of the officer. A pensionable officer will be eligible for 42 days leave annually. Candidates appointed on contract will be eligible for a gratuity of £37-10s for each completed 3 months residential service on satisfactory completion of a tour.

▶ 6. Method of application.—Applications should be addressed to the Secretary, Federal Public Service Commission, P.M. Bag No. 12586, Lagos, so as to reach him not later than 19th July, 1967.

- 7. Applications from candidates in Government Service should be submitted through the applicants' Heads of Departments, the Secretary of the appropriate Public Service Commission, and be accompanied by the last three Confidential Reports on the appropriate Form.
- 8. Applications from candidates not in the Government should be submitted on the prescribed Forms which may be obtained from (1) The Secretary, Federal Public Service Commission, Lagos; (2) Recruitment Attache, Nigeria High Commission, Adelphi House, John Adams Street, London W.C.2, England; and (3) Recruitment Attache, Embassy of Nigeria, Washington D.C., U.S.A.
