Whereas by section 123 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Large State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

AND WHEREAS the Advisory Judicial Committee has in accordance with section 112 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 recommended the appointment of JAMES OLAJIDE KASSIM to act as a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State:

Now therefore, The Supreme Military Council, acting on the advice of the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint James Olayide Kassim to act as a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State with effect from the 28th day of June, 1967.

purchase requirements.

(b) Capital.—Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to provide the necessary capital to finance their purchases. Buying Agents will be required to buy a not less than minimum prices at gazetted buying stations and to arrange for the produce to be evacuated to port (in the case of palm kernels) or Bulk Oil Plant (in the case of Palm Oil), at which point payment is made against delivery of the produce in the approved manner.

Applicant will be required to forward, as evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement, copies of their bank statements for the six months preceding the date of the application, duly certified by their bankers. Only applications to which such bank statements have been attached will be considered.

(c) Storage.—Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposed areas of operation proper storage to cover at least two hundred tons of Palm Kernels, and adequate port storage where appropriate.

All stores must comply with the requirements of, and be approved by the Produce Inspection Service of the Western State. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request in writing the Produce Officer of the area concerned to inspect and approve his store.

- (d) General.—An applicant must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence that he is fully conversant with the produce trade in question and that in particular he will be able to fulfil the following conditions:—
 - (i) Equipment.—That he possesses the required equipment for the grading of produce for export.
 - (ii) Inspection of produce.—That he will be able to provide grading equipment and an adequate labour force at all stores.
 - (iii) Returns.—That he will render promptly and accurately all returns particularly as to purchases and stocks, which may be called for by the Board's executive.

- (iv) Evacuation.—That he will be able to make arrangements to secure the necessary transport by road, rail or water to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of produce by approved routes.
- (v) Delivery.—That he can arrange delivery of Palm Oil to the appropriate Bulk Oil Plant and of Palm Kernels to Board Store at ports of shipment to f.o.b. on board ocean vessel and also in accordance with instructions issued from time to time by the Board's executive. In the case of Palm Kernels delivered to f.o.b., he must possess the organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the accurate preparation and prompt submission of shipping documents as required and the carrying out of all duties involved in the delivery of Palm Kernels to f.o.b. point.

COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION

INFORMATION CIRCULAR No. 4

The English Council of Legal Education has announced its intention to change the Form and Syllabus of the Part I of the Bar Examination to ensure that the course for Part I of the Bar Examination is a course of not less than 2 years duration for non-graduates. The effect of this is that as a general rule no non-graduate student will be able to obtain the Bar Finals in less than 3 years.

- The proposed changes will come into operation at the beginning of the academic year commencing in October 1967 and will apply compulsorily to all students who join an Inn of Court after 1st September, 1967.
- 3. These changes have substantially met the objections of the Nigerian Council of Legal Education which led the Nigerian Council to refuse to recognise the passing of the English Bar Final Examination alone as sufficient qualification for admission to the Nigerian Law School (Government Notice No. 1056).
- 4. Accordingly, in view of the proposed changes, notice is hereby given that the passing of the Bar Finals will now be recognised by the Nigerian Council of Legal Education as complying with sections 3 and 4 (as amended by the Legal Education (Amendment) Decree, 1966) of the Legal Education Act, 1962 and thereby qualifying for admission to the Nigerian Law School: Provided such a student was not admitted as a member of an Inn of Court between 1st June, 1965 and 31st August, 1967 inclusive.
- 5. Students admitted as members of an Inn of Court between 1st June, 1965 and 31st August, 1967 inclusive will still be required to have obtained a degree (not necessarily in Law) IN ADDITION to the Bar Finals before they could be admitted to the Nigerian Law School.
- 6. The above notice (which now reverts to sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 2 of Government Notice No. 955 and sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 12 of Government Notice No. 2284) should be read in the light of earlier Information Circulars (Government Notices No. 955 and No. 2284 respectively) issued by the Council.
 - 7. In all other respects, the Council's policy and practice as stated in those Circulars remain unchanged.
