## THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION

AS MODIFIED BY THE CONSTITUTION (SUSPENSION AND MODIFICATION) DECREE 1966 AND THE STATES (CREATION AND TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS) DECREE 1967

WHEREAS by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall consist of the Chief Justice of Lagos State and any such number of Judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (3) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the Office of Chief Justice of the State is vacant or if the person holding the Office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his Office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other Judges of the High Court of the State as may be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint SIGISMUND OLANREWAJU LAMBO to act as Chief Justice of the High Court of Lagos State with effect from 7th December, 1967.

## REMOVAL OF UNCLAIMED VEHICLES

#### COMPETITIVE ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE AND SPECIAL DEPARTMENTAL CLASSES OF THE FEDERAL PUBLIC SERVICE

Applications are invited for the 1968 competition for entry into the Administrative and certain Special Departmental Classes of the Federal Public Service.

#### 2. The Competition will comprise :

- a qualifying written examination, conducted by the West African Examinations Council ; and
- an interview before the Federal Public Service Commission.

Candidates who attain the qualifying standard in the written examination may be invited to the interview by the Federal Public Service Commission.

#### 3. The posts that may be filled by this method are as follows :—

- The Administrative Class (both in the Home and External Services)
- Labour Officer
- State/Pupil State Counsel.

4. To qualify for admission to the competition in 1968, a candidate must *either* be already in possession of the qualification prescribed for the post for which he wishes to compete, or be prepared to sit in 1968 for the final examination leading to the qualification but on the understanding that if he fails to secure the appropriate qualification he will automatically drop out of the competition.

5. The qualifications prescribed for the Administrative and Special Departmental Classes are as follows :

- (i) *Administrative Class*.—A Degree, preferably in Arts, Economics or Law, from a recognized University.
- (ii) *Labour Officers*.—A Degree, preferably in Arts, Economics or Law, from a recognized University.
- (iii) *Pupil/State Counsel*.—A Degree in Law from a recognized University and call to the Nigerian Bar.

*Note*.—"Recognized" in the above context means "recognized by the Federal Government of Nigeria."

6. The written examination will not be designed to test candidates on the subjects in which they hold a degree. It will be designed to test ability to think clearly and to understand and write English, and also of knowledge of current affairs. Notes for the guidance of candidates drawn up by the West African Examinations Council will be issued to all candidates in due course. The examination will comprise the following papers :—

(i) **ENGLISH (PRECIS AND CRITICAL APPRECIATION)**—This paper will consist of a precis of a passage supplemented by a question asking candidates to comment critically on the central idea of the passage.

(ii) **CURRENT AFFAIRS**—Candidates will be required to answer four questions out of ten and the range of subjects will cater for all types of candidates competing ; the questions are designed to test the intelligent awareness of current affairs which any educated person may be presumed to possess.

(iii) **GENERAL**—This will consist of two questions. One will test ability to detect dubious thinking, and will contain short passages whose Logical Force is to be discussed critically. The other will test ability to draw Statistical Inferences from a table of numerical data.

7. The written examination will be held on 9th April, 1968 in Lagos, Ibadan, Zaria, Benin City, Enugu, London, Washington, and at such other centres as may be determined later.

8. Minimum transport expenses to and from London and Washington will be refunded to candidates in the British Isles or the United States of America, respectively, who travel to and from those cities for the purpose of taking the written examination. Candidates will be responsible for arranging and meeting the cost of their local accommodation and local fares for taxis, buses and trains.

9. A fee of £5-5s-0d (five guineas) is payable by every candidate who wishes to take the competitive examination.

10. Candidates who have already applied on the Federal Public Service Commission Application Form for appointment to one or more of the classes mentioned in paragraph 3 above should, if in Nigeria, send by registered post to the Secretary, Federal Public Service Commission, Lagos, a Treasury Receipt for the Examination Fee of £5-5s-0d. If outside Nigeria, candidates should send £5-5s-0d by Money Order or crossed Postal Orders by registered post to the authority to whom they addressed their application on the Federal Public Service Commission Application Form, with a covering letter referring to their applications. All applications must be received not later than 20th January, 1968.

11. Candidates resident in Nigeria who have not yet applied but wish to do so, should send their fee by registered post in the manner prescribed above, with their applications on the Federal Public Service Commission Application Form, to the Secretary, Federal Public Service Commission, Lagos, to reach him not later than 13th January, 1968.
