Constitution of the Federation
(1963, No. 20)

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION (DELEGATION OF POWERS) NOTICE 1967

In exercise of the powers conferred upon it by subsection (1) of section 147 of the Constitution of the Federation and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Federal Public Service Commission, with the approval of the Head of the Federal Military Government, hereby delegates the powers specified in the Schedule hereto to Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Extra-Ministerial Departments in the Public Service of the Federation (hereinafter referred to as "Heads of Departments") in respect of posts in the Federal Public Service of the Federation, whether established or unestablished, the initial basic salary of which is less than £648 per annum subject to the condition that in exercising these Powers in respect of posts within the training grades in salary Scale (C) and posts the initial basic salary of which is £364 per annum or more (but less than £648 per annum), Heads of Departments shall seek the prior approval of the Federal Public Service Commission.

2. Prior approval from the Commission is also required before taking disciplinary action (except reprimands) against any officer of the permanent and pensionable establishment whose appointment has been confirmed.

3. Nothing in this delegation shall prevent the exercise by the Federal Public Service Commission of any of the powers so delegated.

4. Government Notice No. 114 of 1966 is hereby cancelled, and this Notice therefore reinvalidates G.N. 2220 of 1964.

SCHEDULE

1. The power to appoint, including appointment on promotion, transfer or secondment.
2. The power to confirm or terminate a probationary appointment.
3. The power to dismiss and exercise all other disciplinary control except surcharge.

productivity of education in the context of balanced educational development with a view to ensuring the harmonious co-ordination between educational principles and practice on the one hand and social and economic development on the other.
