5. *Qualifying Examination.*—The next Qualifying Examination will be held on Wednesday, 3rd and Thursday, 4th July, 1963 at the following Centres:—LAGOS, KADUNA, ENUGU and IBADAN. Candidates will be examined in General Knowledge, English and Mathematics.
