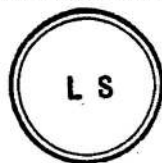

Revised Constitution

CHARGES FOR POSTAL AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

I am directed to address you on the subject of administrative and accounting arrangements for services rendered by the Posts and Telegraphs Department after the introduction of the revised Constitution. These arrangements are based on the proposals made in the Financial Secretary's letter F.54569/S.4 of the 23rd of February, 1954, which have now been accepted by the Regional Governments. They are as follows:—

(1) *Services to Native Authorities, Local Government Bodies and Town Councils.*—From the date of the introduction of the revised Constitution, all benefits which such authorities have enjoyed by way of free franking facilities for mails will be withdrawn. All Local Government Bodies, Native Authorities and Town Councils will be treated in every way as private individuals as regards payment for both postal and telecommunication services to 1, 2, 3, 4 and 7 only. (I shall be grateful if you will take the necessary administrative action to inform these bodies).

(2) *Services to the Federal and Regional Governments and Southern Cameroons.*—The following arrangements will come into force on the date of the introduction of the Revised Constitution :—

(a) *Postal Articles.*—No postal articles will be accepted at Post Offices unless, in addition to the existing requirements that all such articles shall be marked O.H.M.S. and franked with the office stamp and signature of a responsible officer of the department, one of the following stamps is affixed, denoting the Government of origin :—

F.G.—Federal Government of Nigeria

W.—Western Region Government of Nigeria

N.—Northern Region Government of Nigeria

E.—Eastern Region Government of Nigeria

SC.—Southern Cameroons Administration

It is suggested that Government Departments purchase locally made rubber stamps for this purpose. At a later date, Regional Governments may wish to make arrangements with Government Printing Departments in the Regions for supplies of appropriately marked envelopes. The appropriate letter or letters should appear on the bottom left hand corner of each postal article and must not be covered by the Departmental office stamp or signature of the responsible officer.

(b) *Telegrams.*—From the date of the introduction of the revised Constitution, official telegrams will not be accepted at Post Offices or Postal Agencies unless at the right hand top corner of the official telegraph form the appropriate code letter as in paragraph 2 (a) above is inserted. This will enable the Posts and Telegraphs Department to obtain the exact figures of official telegrams sent in the service of each Government. For the time being, debits to Regional Government will be based on the actual number of telegrams sent by each Region, multiplied by the average number of words per telegram. It is hoped that it will be possible to render accurate accounts of the actual cost of official telegrams at a later date. Original telegrams will be kept, in case of query, for a period of six months only after the quarter in which they were despatched.

(c) *Telephones.*—From the date of the introduction of the revised Constitution, the Posts and Telegraphs Department will raise against Regional Governments and the Federal Government, debits for the cost of telephone calls and rentals at tariff rates. These are contained in *Nigeria Gazette* No. 70 dated the 27th of December, 1951. In order to implement this, it will be necessary to ensure that an accurate list is obtained of all telephone numbers and telephone extensions in Government offices and houses, showing the Government on whose service the telephone is to be used after the date of the introduction of the new Constitution. After the introduction of the Revised Constitution, the installation of new telephones will only be undertaken if the Government on whose service the telephone will be used is specified.

2. Circulars are being sent direct to Heads of Federal Departments informing them of these changes and requesting them to supply the necessary information in connection with telephones. A copy of this circular is attached which should with slight amendment, be suitable for issue to Heads of Departments of Regional Government by Civil Secretaries. I am to request you to arrange for the necessary circulars to be issued to all Departments of Regional Governments for very early action.

3. The Posts and Telegraphs Department will raise debits against Regional Governments quarterly in arrears in respect of these charges. Further circulars will be issued dealing with concessions to Members of Legislatures, official abbreviated telegraphic addresses, the use of revenue stamps as distinct from postal stamps and franking facilities for quasi-government organisations and the use of franking machines by Local Government bodies.

4. I am directed by the Minister to stress the importance of ensuring that all Government Departments are informed of these instructions and, in particular, that the work of compiling the lists of telephone numbers is undertaken without delay, and the lists sent to the appropriate offices of the Posts and Telegraphs Department as shown in the attached circular.

POSTAL AND TELEGRAPH SERVICES TO OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

1. *Services to Native Authorities, Local Government Bodies and Town Councils.*—With the introduction of the Revised Constitution on 1st October, it has been decided that the privilege now enjoyed for free franking facilities for mails will be withdrawn. All Local Government Bodies, Native Authorities and Town Councils will be treated as private individuals, and must pay for all postal and telecommunication services.

2. *Federal, Regional Governments and Southern Cameroons.*—Postal articles, parcels (inland) and telegrams tendered by the Federal and Regional Government and the Southern Cameroons Administration will continue to be posted without prepayment but such articles must, in addition to the existing requirements that all official letters be marked 'O.H.M.S.' and franked with the office stamp and signature of a responsible officer of the Department, bear a rubber stamp indicating the Government of origin as follows:—

- F.G.—Federal Government of Nigeria.
- W.—Western Government of Nigeria.
- N.—Northern Government of Nigeria.
- E.—Eastern Government of Nigeria.
- S.C.—Southern Cameroons Administration.

3. In order that this Department may be in a position to assess the cost payable by each Government for postal articles passing through the post a week's return of mails posted by each Government mentioned in paragraph 2 above, will be taken from Sunday, 10th October to Saturday, 16th October. Articles posted at an Agency will be counted at the Controlling Post Office and included in the return as if originating from that Head office.

4. Two copies of the appropriate Statistics Form to be used are enclosed.

5. *Telegrams.*—From the same date official telegrams will not be accepted for transmission unless the appropriate letter code as in paragraph 2 above is shown in the right hand top-corner of the telegraph form. This is in addition to present requirements for franking telegrams.

6. All 'A' forms, before they are despatched to the Clearing House must be sorted and labelled into Regions.
