### THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION

AS MODIFIED BY THE CONSTITUTION (SUSPENSION AND MODIFICATION) DECREE 1966

By His Excellency Major-General YAKUBU GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

WHEREAS by section 111 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall consist of the Chief Justice of Nigeria and any such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 112 (3) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that if the office of the Chief Justice of Nigeria is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the Justices of the Supreme Court as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee.

NOW THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, has appointed SIR LIONEL BRETT to act as the Chief Justice of Nigeria from 13th April to 13th May, 1968.

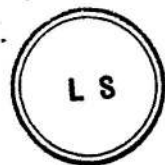

**RE-ENROLMENTS**

Students who successfully complete the 1967-68 session may be re-enrolled on receipt of application and fees. Applications should be received by 31st July and fees not later than 30th September.

**NEW ENROLMENTS**

In the case of employed Part-time students they or their employers will be expected to make arrangements for their release from duty at appropriate times in order that they may attend classes. Day release courses normally attend on one day (from 7.45 a.m. to 2.15 p.m.) and two or more evenings per weeks (from 6 to 8 p.m.).

In the case of sponsored students the sponsor will be expected to give a guarantee that:

- The student is a BONAFIDE employee.
- He will be responsible for all fees and charges payable by the student.

The following courses are offered on a day release basis:

**ENGINEERING TECHNICIAN COURSES**

Two separate two-year courses leading to the Mechanical Technician Part I Certificate, and the Electrical Technician Part I Certificate, of C.G.L.I., courses 293 and 57 respectively. Qualifications for entry are:

- a West African School Certificate including Mathematics, a suitable Science subject and one other subject, or
- four G.C.E. passes at Ordinary Level including English, Mathematics and a suitable Science subject, or

**ADVANCED LABORATORY TECHNICIAN COURSE:**

Possession of the Ordinary (previously intermediate) certificate of C.G.L.I. together with at least two years practical experience. Alternatively, G.C.E. A level in two suitable Science subjects plus three year subsequent laboratory experience. Subjects offered; Techniques of Chemistry, Microbiology, Physics and General Laboratory Techniques. Other subjects might be available if candidates can make arrangements for tuition in special techniques or if there is sufficient demand.

**COMPOSITOR'S WORK**

This three-year course is open only to students employed as Compositors in the printing industry.

**Tuition Fee and Method of Application**

Tuition fee is £9 per session; in addition to this a deposit of £5 is payable by all students. Students are expected to join the Students' Union at a special reduced fee of 2s-6d per year. External examination fees are not included in the tuition fee, therefore sponsors or students will be responsible for these which are usually payable during the first term.

Students who complete the 1967-8 session may re-enrol on payment of fees between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m., or between 5.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. from 2nd to 15th September, 1968. **GENERAL TECHNICAL (G.T.).**—A one-year course preparatory to entry to the Technician Courses in Engineering and Construction. The minimum qualification for entry is a completed Government Secondary School Course or its equivalent.

**TECHNICIAN COURSES.**—Two separate three-year courses leading respectively to the Electrical and Mechanical Technicians Part I certificate and a two-year course leading to the Construction Technicians Part I certificate of C.G.L.I. Qualifications for entry are:

(a) a West African School Certificate including English, Mathematics, a suitable science subject, and one other subject, or

(b) four G.C.E. passes at Ordinary level including English, Mathematics, and a suitable science subject, or

(c) satisfactory completion of G.T. Course.

**DRAFTSMANSHIP.**—A four-year course intended to provide the student with the fundamentals of draughtsmanship and drawing office practice.

Emphasis is laid on the methods of preparing drawings used in connection with the lay-out, design, and construction of Civil Engineering works.

Minimum qualification for entry to the course is Government Class Four, but no previous technical drawing experience is required.

**COMMERCIAL (RSA).**—A three-year course leading to the RSA single subject examinations at corresponding stages. Qualification for entry is completed secondary school course.

This is a group course and promotion within the course is obtained only by passing (or being exempted from) all the subjects at each stage. Subject exemptions will be given for success in internal or RSA examinations.

**SECRETARIAL STUDIES.**—This is a three-year course in English, Office Practice, Secretarial Duties, Shorthand and Typewriting, up to stage three of the Royal Society of Arts Examinations. Applicants must have the West African School Certificate or its equivalent. Preference will be given to applicants with Credit in English. Possessors of the elementary or intermediate RSA Certificate in Shorthand and Typewriting may be considered for the appropriate higher stages, provided vacancies exist.

There is also a one-year High Speed Course for students with speeds 100/50 w.p.m. leading to speeds of 140/70 w.p.m. in Shorthand and Typewriting respectively.

**ACCOUNTANCY.**—A five-year course leading to the examinations of the A.C.C.A.

Qualifications for entry are a pass in the Preliminary examination (or exemption) and registration as a student of the Association of Certified and Corporate Accountants. Students will not proceed to the third year (Section III class) until they have passed Sections I and II.

**ACCOUNTANCY (COST AND WORKS).**—A five-year course leading to examinations of the Institute of Cost and Works Accountants.

Progress from one class to another will depend on passing examinations of the Institute of Cost and Works Accountants at the next lower state or part.

Qualifications for entry are a pass in the Preliminary examination (or exemption) and/or registration as a student of the Institute.

**SECRETARYSHIP (CCS AND CIS).**—A five-year course preparing students for the examinations of the Chartered Institute of Secretaries and the Corporation of Secretaries. The first two years are in preparation for the Intermediate examinations.

Qualifications for entry are a pass of the Preliminary examination and/or registration as a student of the appropriate body.

Students will not be allowed to proceed to the third year (Part I Final) class until they have passed the Intermediate examination of the Chartered Institute of Secretaries or of the Corporation of Secretaries.

**BANKING.**—A two-year course leading to the examinations of the Institute of Bankers.

The course is open to Bank employees.

**COMPOSITORS WORK.**—A three-year vocational course open only to those employed as Compositors in the Printing Industry.

**MONOTYPE KEYBOARD.**—A three-year course in Monotype Keyboard operation, open only to those employed as Compositors having served their apprenticeship, or as keyboard operators.

**MONOTYPE CASTER.**—A three-year course in Monotype Caster operation, open only to those employed as Compositors in the Printing Industry with a completed period of apprenticeship, or as Caster Operators.

**LINOTYPE.**—A two-year course in Linotype operation open only to candidates employed as Compositors with a completed period of apprenticeship, or as Linotype operators.

**BOOKBINDING AND WAREHOUSE PRACTICE.**—A three-year course leading to the C.G.L.I. Craft Certificate examination in Bookbinding and Printing Warehouse Practice. This course is open only to those employed as Bookbinders in the Printing Industry.

**ART COURSES.**—Four-year vocational courses in Drawing, Painting, Design, Illustration, Lettering, Portraiture, Sculpture, Textile Design, Silk-screen Printing and Pottery. Admission is by interview, and is open to teachers and others in relevant professions. A number of places is offered to others wishing to study these subjects either for interest of in preparation for examinations.

**PRODUCTION SUPERVISION AND MANAGEMENT.**—This is a three-year course for factory and technical workers who possess the School Certificate or equivalent with credits in three subjects including English Language and Mathematics.
