Whereas by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Western State shall consist of the Chief Justice of Western State and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (1) of the Constitution of Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that the Chief Justice of the State and other Judges shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now Therefore, The Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint Timothy Akinola Aguda a Judge of the High Court of Western State with effect from 22nd April, 1968.

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint Candide Ademola Johnson a Judge of the High Court of Western State with effect from 22nd April, 1968.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Chapter 122) of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi, and a Deputy Grand Kadi and three other Judges learned in the Sharia:

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the person holding the office of the Grand Kadi is for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other Judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now Therefore, The Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, has appointed Alhaji Abubakar Mahmud, to act as the Grand Kadi of the Shatia Court of Appeal from 17th April to 1st June, 1968.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Chapter 122) of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi, and a Deputy Grand Kadi and three other Judges learned in the Sharia:

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (3) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the Sharia Court other than the Grand Kadi is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Grand Kadi or for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee may appoint a person with such qualification as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a judge of the Sharia Court of Appeal.

Now Therefore, The Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, has appointed Alhaji Jibir Daura, to act as the Deputy Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal from 17th April to 1st June, 1968.

- 4. Contractors who wish to apply for re-classification into a different category should do so in writing to the Secretary to the Board giving full particulars of the works they have undertaken since registration which justify such consideration by the Board.
- 5. Contractors who wish to be registered, or re-classified in higher categories; in the Federal Works Register must be willing to show evidence of their financial capacity and technical competence. The evidence of financial capacity may be either a bank statement/guarantee or a letter from a financier. The evidence of technical competence must include the documents of previous works undertaken, qualification and experience of the contractors and staff available.

The registration of expatriate building and civil engineering contractors is limited to only Categories 'C' and 'D' and of expatriate mechanical and electrical contractors to Categories 'A2' and 'B' except air-conditioning installations. Such contractors are expected to show evidence of substantial financial capacity before the Board can give consideration to their applications for registration or re-classification.
 - 7. Yearly licence fees are payable on certificates issued by the Board as follows:-

Each certificate is valid for a financial year, that is from April to March, and must be renewed annually to afford a holder to enjoy Government patronage for that year.

- 8. The Register of Petty Contractors is abolished. All works hitherto carried out by former petty contractors, except supply of materials, will be carried out only by contractors registered in Category A. Contractors already in Category A who wish to be considered for work less than £2,000 should apply to the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Works and Housing, Lagos for their names to be included on a list to be kept by the Senior Architect, Lagos Works Organization. Contracts less than £500 will be awarded by rotation, but those between £501 and £2,000 will be arranged by Departmental Tenders Board as in the past. Separate lists of suppliers of local materials will be kept in the Works Formations.
- 9. A contractor who fails to complete a contract or whose workmanship or performance during the period of the contract has been the subject of complaint by a Supervising Officer may be required to give a written explanation to the Federal Works Registration Board which will consider each case on its merits and take appropriate disciplinary action which may include the removal of the contractor's name from the Register. Contractors who on their application forms give information subsequently found to be false will be disqualified.
- 10. Appeals against the decision of the Federal Works Registration Board should be addressed to the Commissioner for Works and Housing through the Secretary to the Board.
- (b) Separate registers are to be opened for contractors who engage in building, civil engineering, mechanical engineering and electrical installations works. Those interested in more than one trade may apply for registration in those trades.
- (c) All contractors on the Federal Works Register are required to re-register under the new "Rules". The old Register remains operative until a new one is compiled and published.
- (d) In contracts of large magnitude, it will henceforth be obligatory on the successful tenderers to use reliable indigenous contractors as sub-contractors, provided that this will not involve delay or increase in cost.
- (e) Where competitive tendering is open to only Nigerian contractors, steps will be taken to ensure that the awards are made to truly indigenous contrators.
