Whereas Ted Kayode Adams, having been duly convicted of the offence of stabbing with intent to kill and sentenced to detention in the Yaba Mental Asylum:

AND WHEREAS the said Ted Kayode Adams, having been so detained at the Yaba Mental Asylum since July, 1965:

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Military Council after reviewing his case, is pleased to remit the sentence:

Now THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 101 (1) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Supreme Military Council do hereby remit the unexpired portion of the sentence imposed on the aforesaid Ted Kayode Adams.



Whereas Joseph Akinola, having been duly convicted of the offence of stealing and sentenced to imprisonment for eighteen months:

AND WHEREAS the said Joseph Akinola, having served the full sentence originally imposed on him in September, 1959:

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Military Council after reviewing his case, is pleased to grant him a free pardon:

Now Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 101 (1) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Supreme Military Council do hereby grant the aforesaid Joseph Akinola a free pardon.

Now THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 101 (1) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Supreme Military Council do hereby grant the aforesaid Shittu Faji Fajobi a free pardon.
