Whereas by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall consist of the Chief Justice of Lagos State and such number of other judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that the Chief Justice and other judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now Therefore, The Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee hereby appoints Samuel Durojaiye Adebiyi a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State with effect from the 30th day of September, 1968.

Whereas by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall consist of the Chief Justice of Lagos State and such number of other judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (4) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that if the office of any judge of the High Court of Lagos State other than the Chief Justice is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Chief Justice or is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a judge of the High Court and any person so appointed shall continue to act for the period of the appointment or if no period is specified until his appointment is revoked by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee.

Now Therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, hereby appoints Michael Nun Quesi Sagoe to act as a Judge of the High Court of Lagos State for a period of not more than six months with effect from the 30th day of September, 1968.

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the person holding the office of the Grand Kadi is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now Therefore, The Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial-Committee, do hereby appoint Alhaji Haliru Binji, to act as the Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal from 3rd October to 24th October, 1968.
