EXCISE REVENUE CONTROL—MANUFACTURE OF SPIRITS BY DISTILLATION

Commencement : 28th October, 1968

The attention of manufacturers of spirits by distillation is invited to this Notice which contains the Board's requirements and directions for the Excise Revenue Control of distilleries.

PART I—GENERAL

2. *Laws.*—The laws relating to the collection of Excise duties on spirits manufactured by a process of distillation are contained in :—

- (a) Excise (Control of Distillation) Act 1964, No. 22 ;
- (b) Excise (Control of Distillation) (Amendment) Act 1965 No. 27 ;
- (c) The Excise Tariff Act 1965 No. 30—as amended from time to time ;
- (d) The Still Regulations 1965—Legal Notice 67 of 1965 ;
- (e) The Manufacture of Spirits Regulations 1965—Legal Notice 79 of 1965, as amended by Legal Notice No. 80 of 1968.

3. *Permit to Import a Still.*—Any person who intends to import a still is required to make prior written application to the Board for a permit—(Imports Prohibition Order, 1959, Second Schedule, Item (3)—L.N. 81 of 1959). The application is to contain full details of the make, type, pattern, construction and operation of the still or stills intended to be imported and the country from whence consigned.

PART II—CONSTRUCTION AND CONNECTION OF DISTILLERY VESSELS, UTENSILS, ETC.

4. *General.*—All corks, plugs, pumps, pipes and other utensils are to be fixed and kept, at the expense of the distiller to the satisfaction of the proper officer.

5. *Brewing and Related Vessels.*—These may be constructed in any manner provided that they are easily accessible and open at all times for the inspection of the proper officer.

6. *Wash Backs.*—These may be constructed in any manner provided that they are capable of being gauged.

7. *Wash Chargers and Low Wines, Feints and Spirit Vessels, Utensils and Pipes.*—These may be constructed in any manner provided that all vessels and connections used in the distillation process between the wash charger and the spirit receiver are close-covered and connected throughout by close metal pipes capable of being examined throughout the whole length. They are not to have any opening or communication with any other vessels or utensils, etc. not connected with the process unless specially allowed by the Board.

8. *Stills.*—These may be of any pattern, form and construction provided that it is impracticable to introduce wash or other materials, or extract spirit or vapour otherwise than in the approved manner. The spent lees receiver or a syphon pipe in the discharge, and a revenue lock is to be provided so that spent lees may be sampled.

9. *Safes.*—These may be of any form provided that when they are locked, spirits cannot be abstracted therefrom by the introduction of a pipe or syphon to cause an overflow, or by any other method.

10. *Sample Pipes.*—A sample pipe to test all spirits running from the stills may be attached to the safe or to the worm before it enters the safe provided that the end of such pipe is enclosed in a glass case having the same standard of security as the safe. Arrangements are to be made for the samples to flow out of such case directly into a feints receiver.

11. *Pipes.*—(a) The ends of pipes required by the proper officer to be secure are to be fastened by soldering, welding, sweating, brazing or riveting. If screw belts and nuts are used the bolts are to be riveted over the ends. If pipes are jointed by flanges, it is sufficient to rivet two opposite bolts in each flange.

(b) Every pipe, unless need exclusively for the discharge of water or spent wash, is to be placed and fixed so as to be capable of being examined throughout its whole length.

12. *Corks.*—Every type of cork used by a distiller requires the Board's prior approval. There is no objection to the use of any type of valve or cork on water pipes, wash backs, wash chargers or stills provided that when such valve or cork is shut it can be secured by a revenue lock. Ordinary turning corks are to be used on receivers and the pipes connected therewith, and on pipes through which feints or spirits pass. The plug of such ordinary turning cork is not to be riveted in, but is to be so made that it can be removed by the proper officer for examination. The key head is to be legibly marked to show whether the cork is open or shut.

13. *Fastenings.*—(a) A distiller is required to provide and maintain fastenings for securing the main-doors in chargers and receivers, the check-dipping holes in spirit receivers and the corks, plugs, pumps, vessels and utensils required by the Board to be secured. If it is necessary for a distiller's operations that corks on closed pipes are to be opened when no officer is present, working fastenings are to be provided so as to allow the plug to be turned but not withdrawn from its proper position in the cork.

(b) Fastenings are, as far as practicable, to be in one piece. Whenever hinges are necessary, they are to be constructed by welded joints and not by riveted pins. The attachment of any fastening to a vessel or utensil is to be by rivets and not by screws. Fastenings on corks are to be made to fit so closely that it is not possible to partially turn or open the cork or lift or take out the plug once the fastening has been applied.

14. *Dipping Rods.*—(a) A distiller is required to provide dipping rods in low wines, feints and spirit vessels. Such rods are to be certified correct in accordance with the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1965 (L.N. 57 of 1965).

(b) The dipping rod in low wines and feints receivers and chargers is to be fitted so as to slide through a metal plate riveted to the cover through which it cannot be withdrawn.

(c) The dipping rod for spirit receivers is to be fitted so as to slide through a brass guide securely fixed to the cover of the vessel through which it cannot be withdrawn. When not in use the rod is to be drawn right out of the liquor and kept in its position by a screw. Other rods fixed in vessels are to be kept out of the liquid by attaching a cord or chain with counterpoise over a pulley.

(d) Two check dipping holes with dipping rods are to be provided for every spirit receiver.

15. *Alteration of Position of Vessels.*—A distiller is not to alter the position or level or the dipping place of any vessel without first receiving the Board's written permission.

PART III.—APPROVAL AND LICENSING

16. *Provisional Approval.*—(a) The written approval of the Board is required before any person commences to erect a distillery.

(b) Provisional approval is granted when the Board is satisfied that the application may be approved in principle. A distiller is required to submit a written application to the proper Area Chief Collector, accompanied by plans in quadruplicate, distinctly showing the course, construction and use of all fixed pipes to be used and every branch thereof and cork thereon and every place, vessel, or utensil with which any such pipe connects and the following particulars:—

- (i) Name and address in Nigeria of the person or firm making the application;
- (ii) Address of the proposed distillery;
- (iii) Date when the distillery is expected to be ready for production;
- (iv) Type of spirits to be produced;
- (v) Estimated annual production and the proportions for home use and exportation, respectively;
- (vi) Materials to be used;
- (vii) Full description of the plant and process;
- (viii) Brand names and labels;
- (ix) Size of containers;
- (x) Working hours in the distillery;
- (xi) Method of packaging;
- (xii) Method of marking and numbering packages;
- (xiii) Storage arrangements;
- (xiv) Delivery arrangements and types of trader to be supplied.

17. *Premises.*—The Board may refuse to approve any premises on which, from their situation in relation to the premises used by a rectifier, blender, methylator or brewer, it considers it inexpedient to allow the manufacture of spirits.

18. *Situation of Vessels.*—(a) Each vessel or utensil on the premises is to be placed and kept in a convenient situation, easy and safe of access and with sufficient headroom for official examination and account and permanently fixed so as to admit of the contents being accurately gauged.

(b) A distiller is required to provide ladders, lights and such assistance as the officer may require for the proper performance of his duties.

(c) A distiller is to ensure that the premises are adequately ventilated.

19. *Materials Store.*—A distiller is required to provide a Sugar, Mollasses or other Materials Store for the separate and exclusive storage of these materials. All materials are to be deposited in the Sugar, Mollasses or other Materials Store immediately they are received at the distillery.

20. Accommodation for Official Staff—

(a) *Office Accommodation.*—The Board may require a distiller to provide and maintain suitable office, lavatory and sanitary accommodation with furniture, lighting and other amenities for the use of the proper officer.

(b) *Living Accommodation.*—The Board may require a distiller to provide at his own expense, and lease to the Board, suitable living accommodation for the proper officer (and his household) responsible for the control of the licensed premises.

21. *Signboard.*—A distiller is required to erect at the main entrance to the licensed premises a signboard displaying, in letters not less than three inches high, the registered business name of the licensed distillery, together with this statement, in letters not less than two inches high, "Licensed by the Board of Customs and Excise as a Distiller, Excise Factory No.". The Excise factory number is that allocated by the Board after final approval of the premises.

22. *Marking of Pipes.*—A distiller is required to paint and maintain so painted in oil colours every pipe as follows according to the purpose for which it is to be used :—

Wort or wash	red
Low wines or feints	blue
spirits	black
water	white.

23. *Gauging vessels.*—Unless otherwise directed by the Board, a distiller is required to gauge, under official supervision, all tanks, vats or vessels and is to provide the necessary tables and implements so that the quantity of liquid in such tank, vat or vessel may at any time be accurately determined. A certificate to the effect that the gauging (of named vessels, etc.) has been accurately carried out is to be signed by a Director of the distilling company and lodged with the proper Area Chief Collector. A distiller is required to renew the certificate of gauging annually on the 1st day of January.

24. *Small Stills.*—The Board may refuse to grant a distiller's licence or may grant it only subject to such conditions as it sees fit to impose, in respect of any premises to be used for the manufacture of spirits by distillation of a fermented liquor where the still to be used is of less than 400 gallons capacity.

25. *Scales, Weights and other appliances.*—The Board may require a distiller to provide and maintain such appliances and other facilities as are in its opinion necessary to enable the proper officer to take account of wash, worts, feints or spirits, or to examine them, or to perform any other official duties on the licensed premises. Such appliances, etc., need not be for the exclusive use of the officer. All weighing and measuring appliances are to be certified correct in accordance with the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1965 (L.N. 57 of 1965) and to be maintained in such a way that they retain their accuracy.

26. *Signboard.*—A distiller is required to erect a signboard at the main entrance of his licensed premises to display the business name of the licensed distillery. Such name is to be displayed in letters not less than three inches high and followed by the words, in letters not less than two inches high, "Licensed by the Board of Customs and Excise as a Distiller, Excise Factory No."

27. *Bond or deposit to secure Excise Duty.*—Before approving the issue of a distiller's licence the Board requires the distiller to make a cash deposit or enter into a Bond on Form Sale 32—Bond to Secure Excise Duty (see Annex "A"). The amount of the deposit or the penalty of the Bond is ordinarily not less than twice the amount of the estimated monthly excise duty payable and is subject to official review.

28. *Entry of premises.*—(a) A distiller is required to make and deliver to the Board, an entry of his premises showing detailed particulars of all rooms, plant, equipment and places in which any part of his trade is carried on or any spirits are to be kept and of all vessels, utensils, pipes, and fittings therein. The entry is to describe in detail the precise use to which all rooms, plant, equipment, etc., will be put. No storage of materials or products, and no manufacture is permitted in any room, plant, etc., which is not included on the entry.

(b) No room or place is to be entered for more than one purpose unless so permitted by the Board.

(c) Officers of Customs and Excise are legally empowered to have access at any time to the "entered" premises.

(d) After entry has been made and delivered to the Board, a distiller is not to alter the size, shape, position or capacity of any "entered" room, plant, or equipment without first obtaining the approval of the proper Area Chief Collector, who may require a new entry to be made when the alterations have been completed.

(e) *Signatories to entries.*—Every entry is to be signed by the person to whom the relevant distiller's licence is to be issued. If the licence is issued to a body corporate, the entry is to be signed by a director, general manager, secretary or other similar official and, except where authority for that person to sign has been given under the seal of the body corporate, the signing is to be done under the seal of the body corporate.

(f) *Form of entry.*—(i) An entry is to be prepared on Form Sale 41—"Entry of Premises Licensed for the Manufacture of Excisable Goods"—(see Annex "B") and three additional copies marked "copy" which need not be signed are to be submitted.

(ii) Distinguishing marks and numbers on every room, plant, equipment or place are to be shown, together with the use to which each is to be put and their position in relation to each other.

(iii) An entry is a legal document and all matters therein are to be contained in the body of the document, above the signature of the person making the entry. In the case of an entry for large premises consisting of more than one page, all the pages are to be tied together with tape and the knot sealed with sealing wax. Each page is to be serially numbered and reference made at the bottom of each page to the page number and the total number of pages of the entry and the date of the entry to which it relates. Each additional page is to be signed by the signatory to the entry at the bottom in such manner as to ensure that no insertion of any other particulars can be made between the signature and the body of the entry. In no circumstances are unsigned or unrelated "enclosures" acceptable as part of an entry.

(g) A distiller is not to withdraw the entry whilst there remains in any place mentioned therein any still, or in any place, vessel or utensil mentioned therein any materials prepared or fit for distillation, or any spirits liable to duty.

29. *Still Licence.*—(a) A distiller requires a "Still Licence"—Form Ex. 5, to possess and use any still in the entered distillery premises.

(b) Application is to be made to the Board through the proper Area Chief Collector on Form Sale 40—"Application for Still Licence". (See Annex "C").

(c) If the Board approves the application on Form Sale 40, the Area Chief Collector issues the licence.

(d) There is no licence fee but the licence is renewable on the 1st day of January each year. Written application for renewal is to be made to the proper Area Chief Collector.

(e) A distiller is required to inform the Board in writing through the proper Area Chief Collector within fourteen days after a licensed still has been broken up, removed from the premises or otherwise disposed of. Particulars are to be furnished of the manner of disposal and of the name of the person, if any, to whom it has been disposed and the address of the premises to which the still has been removed.

30. *Final Approval.*—When construction or the distillery has been completed and all requirements met, application for final approval and issue of a distiller's licence is to be made by a distiller to the Board through the proper Area Chief Collector on Form Sale 39—"Application for distiller's Licence". (See Annex "D").

31. *Variations to Approval.*—Where a distiller desires subsequently to vary any approved process or to add to, alter, move or use in any way other than in accordance with the manner approved, any vessel, utensil, pipe or fitting, he is to submit all proposals to the proper Area Chief Collector in duplicate with drawings and full descriptions of the variations or alterations. A distiller is to comply with all conditions or directions prescribed by the Board in its grant of such approval.

32. *Distiller's Licence.*—(a) *Issue of Licence.*—A distiller's licence is issued by the proper Area Chief Collector after the Board's grant of approval to the application on Form Sale 39.

(b) *The Validity of Licence.*—A distiller's licence is issued in respect of one set of premises only and expires on the 31st day of December next following the date of issue.

(c) *Licence fee.*—A fee of One hundred pounds (£100) is payable on each occasion when a licence is issued or renewed.

(d) *Renewal of Licence.*—A distiller is required to make written application to the proper Area Chief Collector for renewal of licence.

33. *Licence Business Discontinued.*—(a) Whenever a distiller discontinues business whether voluntarily or by reason of revocation of his licence he is required to:—

(i) pay duty on all spirits on which duty has not been paid;

(ii) permit the proper officer to seal all plant and equipment so that it cannot be used for further distilling purposes; and

(iii) surrender the distiller's licence to the proper Area Chief Collector.

(b) The Board has legal powers to distrain for duty due under sub-paragraph (a) (i) above not paid forthwith.

(c) If any sealed plant or equipment is to be permanently removed from the premises, the owner is to give the Board a written notice of his intention to do so and furnish it with the address to which the plant or equipment is to be removed.

34. *Excise Factory Numbers.*—Every licensed distiller is allocated an excise factory number by the Board.

PART IV—DISTILLER'S RECORDS OF MANUFACTURE

35. *Distilling Book.*—(a) A Distilling Book—Book Ex. 13 is provided by the proper officer for a distiller to enter prior notice of his intended distillery operation and declarations.

(b) The Distilling Book is to be kept by a distiller in some place approved by the proper Area Chief Collector in the entered premises. It is to be available at all times to the proper officer and is not to be removed except when taken up by the proper officer at the end of a month.

(c) Each entry made by a distiller in the Distilling Book is to be made on a separate line and a straight line drawn through the unused portion of that line. At the time of making an entry, a distiller is required to enter the date and hour when such entry is made.

(d) If a distiller requires to cancel any notice given in the Distilling Book, he is to write the word "void" along the line on which the notice is given and add his initials and the date and hour of cancellation.

36. *Stock Account of Materials for Manufacture*—(a) Except with the written consent of the Board, all sugar and other materials received for use in the manufacture of spirits are to be accompanied by full suppliers' invoices, and immediately on receipt, such sugar or other materials are to be deposited in the Sugar or Other Materials Store. (See paragraph 19). A distiller is to deposit in a store only the materials for which such store is entered.

(b) A distiller is required to keep a register in a form approved by the proper Area Chief Collector showing the quantity of sugar or other materials received and supported by the suppliers' invoices and the quantity of sugar or other materials used in manufacture, and the balance in stock of each kind of sugar and other material is to be balanced at the close of each working day.

37. *Distiller's Return for Period*.—At the end of each period (see paragraph 53) a distiller is required to sign and deliver to the proper officer a return in duplicate on Form Sale 84—"Distiller's Return of Materials Used, Etc., and Spirits Produced" (see Annex "E") specifying for the period—

(i) the quantity of each description of material used in making wort or wash;

(ii) the quantity of wort or wash distilled;

(iii) the quantity of spirits computed at the strength of 50 per centum by volume of pure alcohol as ascertained by Tralles' Alcoholometer;

(iv) the quantity of feints remaining at the end of the period.

38. *Distiller's Stock Book and Monthly Return*—(a) A distiller is required to provide a Stock Book in a pattern approved by the proper Area Chief Collector. Each day the distiller is required to enter in his stock book the quantity of spirits manufactured and so received into stock and the quantity of spirits sent out and the aggregate balance of spirits remaining at the close of business each day. In all cases quantities are to be computed at the strength of 50 per centum by volume of pure alcohol.

(b) The stock book is to be kept in such part of the entered premises as approved by the proper Area Chief Collector and is to be available at all times for inspection by the proper officer who is to be permitted to make extracts therefrom.

(c) On or before the 7th day of each month, a distiller is required to submit to the proper officer a transcript in duplicate of the stock book showing all transactions entered therein during the previous month.

PART V—DISTILLING OPERATIONS

39. *Materials*.—Except with the consent of the Board and subject to such conditions as it may prescribe, a distiller is not to use in the brewing or making of wort or wash any material of such nature that the gravity of the wort or wash produced therein cannot be ascertained by the approved saccharometer, nor is he to have in his possession any wort, wash, low wines, feints, or spirits or fermented liquor not brewed, made or distilled in his distillery.

40. *Removal of Materials for Manufacture*.—(a) A distiller is not, without the consent of the Board, to remove any sugar, mollasses or other material for fermentation from the place entered as a Sugar, Mollasses or Other Materials Store, except for use in the manufacture of spirits.

(b) Before removing any sugar, mollasses or other materials for this purpose, a distiller is required to give written notice in the Distilling Book specifying the time of the intended removal and the quantity and kind to be so removed.

(c) At the time specified, a distiller is to convey the specified sugar, mollasses or other materials immediately from their place of storage to the mash-turn, sugar cane crusher or other entered vessel or utensil for immediate use therein.

(d) Any sugar, mollasses or other material so removed but not used immediately is to be returned forthwith to the Store and the distiller is immediately required to give written notice in the Distilling Book of the quantities so re-deposited.

41. *Notice to Commence or Re-commence Brewing*.—At least six days before first commencing to brew wort, or, if he has discontinued brewing wort for more than one month, before re-commencing to brew wort, a distiller is required to give written notice in the Distilling Book, specifying the day and time at which he intends to begin brewing or re-commence brewing.

42. *Notice to Brew*.—Before a distiller mashes any materials, or brews for making wort, he is required to give at least 24 hours prior written notice in the Distilling Book, specifying the day and the hour when the mashing or brewing is to be commenced.

43. *Declaration of Worts Collected.*—Immediately the collection of wort in any fermenting vessel is completed, a distiller is required to enter a written declaration in the Distilling Book, specifying the number of the vessel in which the wort is contained, the true original gravity of the wort therein and the quantity thereof as measured by the number of dry inches and tenths of one inch which is the number of inches and tenths of an inch between the dipping plate of the vessel and the surface of the wort contained therein.

44. *Addition of Yeast.*—Unless the Board has given consent and subject to such conditions as it may prescribe, a distiller is not to add yeast or other matter capable of causing fermentation, to wort or wash in any vessel except an entered fermenting vessel.

45. *Preparation of Bub, etc.*—Before commencing to make bub or any other composition which promotes fermentation of wort or wash, a distiller is required to give at least 24 hours prior written notice in the Distilling Book, specifying the day and hour when, the vessel in which the bub or composition is to be made, the fermenting vessel into which it is to be put, and the quantity to be put into such vessel.

46. *Removal of Wash.*—(a) Immediately prior to the removal of wash from a fermenting vessel, a distiller is required to give a declaration in the Distilling Book, specifying the date and hour of commencing removal, the vessels from and to which the wash is to be removed, and the gravity of the wash immediately prior to removal.

(b) Wash is normally to be removed direct to a still or to a wash charger to charge a still, for immediate distillation. If a considerable time elapses between the removal of any wash and the commencement of distillation of that wash during which time further attenuation may have taken place, then immediately before removing such wash for distillation, a distiller is required to give a further declaration in the Distilling Book specifying the particulars required in subparagraph (a).

47. *Mixing Wort.*—(a) There is no objection to wash removed from successive fermenting vessels mixing in a wash charger provided the proper notices to remove wash have been given and the wash in the wash charger is being used for continuous distillation.

(b) If wort or wash is to be mixed otherwise than for immediate distillation, the mixing is only to take place in a fermenting vessel or wash charger. Prior written notice of the intention to mix is required to be given by a distiller in the Distilling Book, specifying the vessels to be affected. Immediately on completion of the mixing, the distiller is required to make a declaration in the Distilling Book, specifying, in respect of each vessel affected, the dry dip and original gravity immediately before the operation and the dry dip and actual gravity immediately after the operation.

48. *Removal of Yeast.*—(a) A distiller is not to dispose of wash removed from a fermenting vessel for the recovery of yeast except in such a manner as the Board has approved. Before removing wash for the recovery of yeast, a distiller is required to give notice in the Distilling Book, specifying the quantity and original gravity of the wash so removed and the vessels from which it has been removed.

(b) A distiller is to make written application through the proper Area Chief Collector to the Board for such allowance as the Board considers reasonable, from any charge for duty arising from wort or wash made. Satisfactory proof is to be shown that such duty charge arises wholly or in part on account of the removal of wort or wash for the separation of yeast.

49. *Removal of Low Wines and Feints.*—Not less than four hours before the removal of any low wines or feints from a receiver, a distiller is required to give written notice in the Distilling Book, specifying the day and hour of intended removal and the vessels affected, and immediately after the proper officer has taken account of the contents of the receiver, such low wines and feints are to be removed forthwith into the proper charger. If, however, a distiller has secured his low wines and feints pumps to the satisfaction of the Board, he may at any time without notice, remove low wines and feints from a receiver to a charger and re-distill them.

50. *Removal of Spirits to Distiller's Warehouse.*—At least four hours before a distiller intends to warehouse any spirits, he is required to give written notice in the Distilling Book for the proper officer to take account of such spirits, specifying the day and hour of the intended warehousing and the vessels which contain the spirits.

51. *Collection of Spirits.*—(a) Where a distiller does not provide a distiller's warehouse in association with his distillery (See Part VIII), he is required to collect spirits in one receiver at a time and he is not to begin to collect in another receiver until the collection in the first is complete.

(b) If at any time a distiller requires to take delivery of spirits being collected, he may declare the collection in that receiver as complete and give notice to take account of spirits.

52. *Notice to take Account of Spirits.*—(a) Where a distiller does not provide a distiller's warehouse in association with his distillery, the official account of spirits collected in a spirit receiver is to be taken as soon as the collection is completed.

(b) At least two hours before the collection in a spirit receiver is completed and a distiller intends to collect spirits in a different receiver, he is required to give written notice in the Distilling Book to take account of the spirits collected, specifying the day and hour that the account is to be taken and the vessel or vessels affected.

53. *Distillation Periods.*—(a) A distiller is required to conduct his manufacturing operations in distillation periods which are to be of a duration not exceeding one month from the date of commencement of brewing or from the date of termination of the last preceding period whichever is the later.

(b) Periods are to be serially numbered by a distiller in an annual series commencing at 1 for the first period in January or for the first period when distilling commences in the case of a new distiller or recommences in the case of a distillery which has been silent (*see* paragraph 56) since the end of the previous year.

54. *Notice to Terminate Period.*—(a) A distiller is required to give written notice to the proper officer on form Sale 83—"Distiller's Notice and Declaration to Terminate Period" (*see* Annex "F") of his intention to terminate a period, specifying the wort or wash to be included therein and such wort or wash is to be distilled immediately and the stills worked off. A distiller is also required to give notice in the Distilling Book to take account of the feints and spirits produced therefrom.

(b) A period is deemed to terminate when all wort or wash specified in the distiller's declaration on Form Sale 83 has been distilled and all the resulting feints and spirits produced therefrom have been conveyed into the respective receivers.

(c) A distiller is required to keep all the produce of any one period unmixed with any other matter and separate from all other produce except "depending feints" until an account has been taken by the proper officer.

55. *Depending Feints.*—Any feints which were produced by and remain from a previous distillation are referred to as "depending feints" and such feints may be mixed with low wines or feints produced by a subsequent distillation and such feints may be re-distilled as many times as a distiller thinks fit.

56. *Silent Distilleries.*—If the furnace doors or steam valves of ALL stills have been locked off and a full account of all spirits and feints on the premises has been taken by the proper officer and all wort brewed has been distilled and no wort has been brewed for a period of at least one month, a distillery is regarded as "silent".

57. *Vessels open for Cleaning, Repair, etc.*—Whenever a distiller requires vessels or utensils, etc., to be left open for cleaning, repair, etc., he is to give written notice in the Distilling Book.

PART VI.—CHARGE AND PAYMENT OF EXCISE DUTY

58. *Basis of Charge.*—(a) The excise duty on spirits produced by distillation is chargeable at the rates prescribed in the Excise Tariff Act on the actual quantity of spirits produced or the quantity of spirits deemed to have been produced from the attenuation charge, whichever is the higher;

(b) *Attenuation Charge.*—This charge is to be calculated on the quantity of spirits, at the strength of fifty per centum by volume of pure alcohol, capable of being produced from any wort or wash made at the distillery. It is assumed that from every one hundred gallons of wort and wash, one gallon and fourteen hundredths of a gallon of spirits at the strength of fifty per centum by volume of pure alcohol will be produced for every five degrees of difference between the highest gravity of the wort and the lowest gravity of the wash before distillation, and so in proportion for any less number of gallons of wort and wash or any less number of degrees of attenuation. No allowance is made for waste, bub, dregs, yeast or other matter and the gravity is taken as that declared by the distiller provided that if either gravity is found by the proper officer before distillation to be, in the case of wort, higher or, in the case of wash, lower than that declared by the distiller, the gravity to be taken is that found by the proper officer.

(c) *Production Charge.*—The quantity of spirits and feints computed at a strength of fifty per centum by volume of pure alcohol, produced at the distillery, is to be ascertained for each distillation period. Due allowance is to be made for any feints remaining at the end of the last preceding distillation period and accounted for in the last account of spirits and feints produced.

(d) If the quantity calculated according to the attenuation charge exceeds that actually produced, the excise duty on the excess becomes due at once and must be paid forthwith.

59. *Duty Point.*—Duty becomes due at the time that the spirits are collected in the official receiving vessels unless the spirits are:—

(a) transferred immediately to an approved bonded warehouse; or

(b) removed for an approved use or purpose in accordance with the provisions of the customs and excise laws, without payment of duty; or

(c) subjected to a process of denaturing approved by the Board.

60. *Ascertainment of Gravity.*—(a) The gravity of wort or wash is to be ascertained by the approved saccharometer.

(b) When fermentation has commenced in any wort or wash so that the original gravity of the words from which the wort or wash is made cannot be ascertained by the approved saccharometer, such gravity is to be determined by such means as the Board may approve.

61. *Ascertainment of Strength of Spirits.*—The excise duty of spirits distilled or manufactured by any process whatsoever in Nigeria is charged in relation to the quantity in gallons and the percentage by volume of pure alcohol contained therein determined at a temperature of 15.56°C or 60°F. For the purpose of ascertaining the percentage by volume of pure alcohol in a spirituous liquor, Tralles' Alcoholometer and its associated tables are used.

62. *Notice to pay excise duty on manufactured Spirits.*—Where a distiller's warehouse is not provided in association with a distillery, the proper officer prepares and delivers to the distiller Form Ex. 11—"Notice to Pay Excise Duty on Manufactured Spirits" (See Annex "G") at the end of each month.

63. *Payment of duty.*—(a) The excise duty on manufactured spirits delivered for home use without prior deposit in a distiller's warehouse is payable immediately the duty point (see paragraph 59) is reached, but the Board is prepared to consider written applications from distillers for payment to be deferred and for payment to cover the aggregate of duty for a month provided such payment is made not later than the 21st day of the month following that in which the duty became due.

(b) The Board has powers to distrain generally for any excise duty which remains unpaid after the time within which such duty is payable.

PART VII.—DELIVERIES OF SPIRIT FROM A DISTILLERY

64. *Conditions of delivery.*—(a) Spirits which have been manufactured in a distillery may be delivered only—

- (i) on payment of duty for home use in accordance with the provisions of the Excise Tariff Act 1965 ; or
- (ii) for exportation or loading as aircrafts'/ships' stores ; or
- (iii) for removal under bond for re-warehousing in an approved bonded warehouse ; or
- (iv) for removal for use in accordance with the provisions of the Customs and Excise laws without payment of duty.

(b) Once spirits have been delivered in accordance with this paragraph, they are not to be returned to the distillery in which they were manufactured or to any other distillery unless in special circumstances, prior written permission is sought and received from the Board.

65. *Request to remove Spirits.*—Before commencing to deliver any spirits manufactured in his distillery, a distiller is required to give the proper officer prior written request on Form Sale 85—"Request to Remove Spirits" (See Annex "H").

66. *Permit to remove Spirits.*—Except as permitted by the Board, all spirits sent out from a distillery are to be accompanied by Form Sale 86—"Excise Permit to Remove Spirits" signed by the proper officer. (See Annex "I").

67. *Method of delivery.*—(a) Spirits may be delivered from the distillery of manufacture in casks, drums containers, or in bottles of a uniform size packed in cases. The Board's prior approval is to be obtained if delivery is sought by any other means such as by pipe-line, tank wagon or tank craft.

(b) Deliveries under bond are to be secured as directed by the proper officer

68. *Hours of delivery.*—The hours during which spirits manufactured in a distillery may be delivered therefrom are prescribed by the Board (in the conditions of approval) and may be varied at the discretion of the Board.

69. *Removal of Spirits to another Distillery.*—A distiller is not to remove any spirits distilled by him from his distillery to any other distillery unless, in special circumstances, it is shown to the satisfaction of the Board to be necessary and written application is first made and the Board's permission is given in writing.

70. *Duty-Paid Spirits to be removed forthwith.*—As soon as the excise duty has been paid or secured on any spirits which are intended for home use, such spirits are to be removed forthwith from the entered distillery premises or distiller's warehouse.

71. *Duty-Free deliveries.*—(a) *Scope*—Where a distiller does not provide a distiller's warehouse in association with his distillery, spirits manufactured in that distillery may be delivered therefrom without payment of duty for—

- (i) exportation ;
- (ii) loading as stores on ships or aircraft ;
- (iii) deposit in bonded warehouse ;
- (iv) use in Nigeria by Persons and Organisations as defined in the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act, 1962, No. 42 and approved by the Board ;
- (v) denaturing by a process approved by the Board ; or
- (vi) for other purposes approved by enactment or authority.

(b) *Distiller's Notice of Intention to deliver.*—In all cases the distiller is required to give notice of his intention to deliver spirits duty-free by presenting the prescribed form of entry to the proper officer and producing packed spirits for examination before delivery from the distillery.

(c) *Entry Forms.*—(i) The following entry forms in quintuplicate are to be used—

Form Sale 54—for deposits in bonded warehouse ; (See Annex "J").

Form Sale 56—for exportation or use as aircrafts'/ships' stores ; (See Annex "K").

Form Sale 57—for delivery to Privileged Persons or Organisations or for other approved purposes or for denaturing. (See Annex "L").

- (ii) Except where spirits are exported by Government Departments, Marketing Boards, Statutory Corporations or Diplomatic or other Privileged Persons or Organisations, an additional copy of every entry for exports, conspicuously marked "FOR INLAND REVENUE", is required.
- (iii) An additional copy—for the distiller's use—may also be submitted, provided that it is conspicuously marked "MANUFACTURER'S COPY—FOR REFERENCE PURPOSES ONLY". After machine stamping it will be returned to the distiller.
- (iv) The entry (Form Sale 57) in respect of deliveries to Diplomatic and other Privileged Persons or Organisations is to bear the following receipt certified by the Privileged Persons or the authorised signatory on behalf of Privileged Organisations :—
"Received into my/our own premises the spirits entered overleaf for use only for the duty-free purpose allowed by law."
- (d) *Security.*—(i) Before delivery each package is required to be secured as directed by the proper officer and marked indelibly by the distiller with the content in gallons and the words "Delivered duty-free for..... (e.g. exportation)".
- (ii) Deliveries in bulk are required to be secured as directed by the proper officer (See paragraph 67).
- (e) *Pre-entry.*—When delivery has been permitted by the proper officer a distiller is required :—
- (i) in the case of exports and stores, to submit the entry to the cashier in the Long Room at the port or place of exportation or loading as stores and produce the spirits to the proper officer for examination and shipment ;
- (ii) in the case of deposits in warehouse, to submit the entry to the cashier in the Long Room at the port or place where the warehouse of deposit is situated, and to forward the spirits to the warehouse keeper ;
- (iii) in the case of delivery for use by Privileged Persons and Organisations, to despatch the spirits together with the entry direct to such Persons or Organisations for certificate of receipt and then submit the entry to the cashier in the Long Room at the nearest Custom House.
- (f) *Accounting Procedure.*—Credit for duty in respect of duty-free deliveries is effected by deduction on Form Ex. 11 (see paragraph 62) for the month during which an entry with certificates of shipment, etc., has been received by the proper distillery officer.
- (g) It is to be noted that relief from excise duty is only allowed on spirits removed DIRECT from a distillery for duty-free purposes.

72. Specimen Signatures of Privileged Persons and Authorised Signatories on Behalf of Organisations.—

- (a) The names of persons and organisations entitled to receive duty-free goods under the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act, 1962, are published periodically by the Ministry of External Affairs in a booklet entitled "Diplomatic and Consular List".
- (b) Privileged Persons and Organisations referred to in sub-paragraph (a) who intend to avail themselves of duty-free deliveries are required to forward to the proper Area Chief Collector specimen signatures on form Sale 79—"Specimen Signatures of Privileged Persons and Authorised Signatories on behalf of Organisations entitled to Receive Excisable Goods Duty-Free. (See Annex "M").
- (c) Heads of approved Missions and Organisations are required to appoint signatories in respect of deliveries for official use and to forward to the proper Area Chief Collector letters of appointment for, and specimen signatures of authorised signatories.

73. *Certificate of Landing.*—(a) Where spirits are exported overland or by inland waters a distiller is required to produce a certificate of landing to the proper officer within three months from the date of delivery of the spirits from the distillery.

(b) If a distiller fails to produce the certificate of landing within the prescribed period and is unable to give a satisfactory explanation for such failure, the spirits in question will be deemed to have been put to dutiable home use and credit for duty (see paragraph 71 (f)) will not be allowed.

PART VIII—DISTILLER'S WAREHOUSE

74. *General.*—A distiller may provide in association with his licensed distillery a place of security for the deposit without payment of duty of spirits manufactured at that distillery. Such place of security is referred to as a "Distiller's Warehouse", and may be situated within of outside the distillery premises.

75. *Construction and Security.*—(a) Any building for which application is made for approval and licensing as a distiller's warehouse is to be substantially built, all windows are to be barred and the outer door provided with fastenings for both revenue and distiller's locks.

(b) The discharge corks of all vats in the warehouse are to be so constructed as to preclude their being locked in the open position and are to be fitted with fastenings for revenue locks and locked shut when not in use. The end of every pipe line for conveying water into the warehouse is to be secured by revenue lock, and if such pipe is attached to a vat it is to be fitted flush with the inner side of the cover so as to preclude the abstraction of spirit by sucking out of the vats.

(c) The provisions of paragraphs 18 to 23 and 25 are to apply to any licensed distiller's warehouse.

76. Approval, Bond and Licence.—Before depositing any spirits in a distiller's warehouse, a distiller is required to make written application to the Board for approval and licensing of the proposed warehouse and make entry thereof. The application for provisional approval is to be made in accordance with paragraph 7 of Customs and Excise Notice No. 9 and the accompanying plans or drawings are to show the construction of the warehouse and its relative situation to the Still House and other buildings, rooms or places in the vicinity and the course, construction and use of all fixed pipes to be used and every branch thereof and cork thereon and every vessel or utensil with which any such pipe connects within the warehouse. Bond, Final Approval and Licensing are to be dealt with according to paragraphs 2 and 8 of Customs and Excise Notice No. 9.

77. Situation.—If a distiller's warehouse is outside the entered distillery premises, the Board may attach to its approval such conditions as it sees fit, and if at any time a distiller fails to comply with any of these conditions, the Board's approval shall be deemed to be revoked.

78. Entry of Premises.—The warehouse is to be included in the entry of premises required under paragraph 28. Warehouse Vats may also be entered as Spirit Receivers subject to the Board's approval of a distiller's written request.

79. Alterations.—Once a distiller's warehouse has been approved and licensed by the Board, a distiller is not to make any alteration or addition thereto without first making written application to the Board through the proper Area Chief Collector and receiving the Board's written approval.

80. Hours of Opening.—(a) The hours during which a distiller's Warehouse may be open are prescribed in the Board's approval (see paragraph 76 and Customs and Excise Notice No. 9, paragraph 12). The warehouse is to be open only when necessary for the distiller's legitimate purposes and at all other times is to be locked under revenue and distiller's locks.

(b) Where warehouse vats in a distiller's warehouse are also entered and approved as spirit receivers, a distiller is allowed access to such receivers at any time for the sole purpose of changing the charge corks to divert the collection of spirits into a different receiver, provided prior notice of this intention is given in the Distilling Book.

81. Notice to Warehouse Spirits.—(a) At least four hours before he intends to warehouse spirits in a distiller's warehouse, the distiller is required to give written notice in the Distilling Book to take account of spirits specifying the day and hour of the intended warehousing and the vessels which contain the spirit.

(b) If the spirits specified are contained in a spirit receiver which is not also entered as a warehouse vat, the distiller is required to remove such spirits to the distiller's warehouse immediately the account has been taken by the proper officer and under the proper officer's supervision.

(c) If the spirits specified in sub-paragraph (a) above are contained in a spirit receiver which is also entered as a warehouse vat, such spirits are deemed to be warehoused immediately the account has been taken by the proper officer.

82. Quantity deemed Warehoused.—The account of spirits taken in the spirit receiver is in all cases deemed to be the quantity warehoused.

83. Time limit for warehousing spirits.—All the spirits produced in a distillation period are to be warehoused by the distiller within 10 days of the termination of that period. (See paragraph 54).

84. Spirits which may be warehoused.—(a) Only spirits which have been manufactured in the distillery to which the warehouse is attached are to be deposited therein.

(b) In special circumstances, if a distiller requires to warehouse any spirits manufactured elsewhere, he is to make written application to the Board through the proper Area Chief Collector explaining the circumstances and is to receive the Board's written permission and comply with all the conditions the Board may see fit to impose.

85. Notice to rack spirits from Vat.—A distiller is required to give prior notice on Form Sale 87—Notice to Rack Spirits from Warehouse Vat—(see Annex "N") to the officer in charge of the warehouse before the first racking of spirits from a vat.

86. Reduction of Spirits with Water.—Except with the prior approval of the Board, a distiller is not to reduce spirits with water unless such reduction takes place prior to or at the time of:—

- (a) their removal from the warehouse vat for immediate delivery; or
- (b) their first racking into a cask.

87. Minimum content of containers warehoused.—A distiller is not to warehouse casks or drums whether full or on ullage which contain less than 9 gallons. A vat remnant, however, of any quantity not exceeding 150 gallons may be temporarily warehoused in one ullage cask for inclusion in a subsequent racking.

88. Marking, numbering and stowage of casks in warehouse.—(a) A distiller is required to cause to be legibly cut, branded or painted with oil paint on the outside of every cask or drum, his name, the name of the distillery or place, the mark and number of the cask or drum, the year in which it is warehoused and the number of gallons the cask is capable of containing, and if that number is less than 80, the quarters of a gallon of capacity above the number of entire gallons.

(b) No cask, drum or other package filled in a distiller's warehouse is to bear the same mark, number and year as any other cask, drum or package filled in the warehouse.

(c) All casks or drums warehoused in any one year are to be consecutively numbered beginning with number one in each year.

(d) A distiller is required to arrange all casks or drums in warehouse so that the marks thereon are at all times easily visible.

89. *Bottling absolute alcohol in warehouse.*—(a) Provided the Board has given prior consent in writing, a distiller may bottle absolute alcohol in an approved compartment of his warehouse and pack the bottles in cases and warehouse the bottles so packed. The minimum quantity of absolute alcohol which may be so warehoused at any time must not be less than 9 bulk gallons.

(b) Absolute alcohol may also be warehoused :—

(i) in approved vessels each containing not less than four and one half bulk gallons ; or

(ii) in bottles of a uniform size of a capacity not less than one reputed quart, packed in cases each containing not less than one point seven eight nor more than two liquid gallons.

(c) The cases and vessels are, if so required by the Board, to be secured and marked by the distiller in such manner as the Board may direct.

PART IX.—DELIVERIES FROM DISTILLER'S WAREHOUSE

90. *Conditions of delivery.*—See paragraphs 64 to 70.

91. *Ex-warehouse entry.*—(a) A distiller is required to give prior notice of his intention to deliver spirits by presenting the prescribed form of entry to the proper officer.

(b) The following entry forms are to be used—

Form Sale 55— for home use (in quadruplicate) ; (See Annex "O").

Form Sale 58— for exportation or use as aircrafts/ships' stores (in quadruplicate) ; (See Annex "P").

Form Sale 88— for removal for re-warehousing (in quintuplicate).—(See Annex "Q").

(c) See also paragraph 71 (c) (ii) and (iii).

92. *Deliveries to Diplomatic and other Privileged Persons and Organisations.*—The entry (Form Sale 55) in respect of deliveries to Diplomatic and Other Privileged Persons or Organisations is to bear the following receipt certified by the Privileged Person or the authorised signatory on behalf of Privileged Organisations :—

"Received into my/our own premises the spirits entered overleaf for use only for the duty-free purposes allowed by law."

(See also paragraph 72).

93. *Duty-Free Deliveries.*—See paragraph 71 (d) and (e).

94. *Account of Spirits Delivered.*—(a) The account of spirits delivered by pipe line is to be determined by the proper officer by reference to the account of spirits in the vat from which the delivery is made before and after the delivery.

(b) The account of spirits delivered to cask or drum is to be determined by weight by the proper officer.

95. *Gross Payment Account.*—(a) Manufactured spirits may not be delivered for home use from a distiller's warehouse without prior payment of duty. As an expedient a distiller may pay duty by means of a Gross Payment Account, i.e., by pre-payment of duty in a bulk sum to the proper officer who may accept individual entries against such payment so long as a balance remains.

(b) A distiller who wishes to set up and maintain a Gross Payment Account is required to make written application to the proper Area Chief Collector for approval, together with a Banker's Guarantee covering the maximum amount of duty to be deposited at any one time.

(c) Where a distiller pays duty by means of a Gross Payment Account each entry for home use (Form Sale 55) is to be endorsed "Duty paid previously to Gross Payment Account".

(d) A distiller is required to maintain a credit balance in the Gross Payment Account by making periodical payments to the proper officer of sufficient amounts to cover anticipated dutiable removals.

96. In addition to the special provisions of this Notice, the attention of distillers is invited to the information contained in—

Customs and Excise Notice No. 9 (Government Notice No. 698 of 1959)—Approval of General and Private Warehouse ; Customs and Excise Notice No. 10 (Government Notice No. 699 of 1959)—Goods in Warehouse : Deposit, Operation and Delivery ; and

Customs and Excise Notice No. 15 (Government Notice No. 703 of 1959)—The Entry and Loading of Goods for Exportation or Shipment as Stores.

97. Forms mentioned in this Notice may be printed privately provided they conform in all respects to the approved forms, specimens of which can be seen at any Custom House.
