DEFENDANTS

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

The Plaintiff brings this action as the person authorised by law to prosecute and defend claims on behalf of the Federal Government of Nigeria.

- 2. The 1st defendant is a pharmacist by profession and was for a period employed as a pharmacist by the Federal Government of Nigeria.
 - 3. While so employed as a pharmacist he worked in the Federal Ministry of Health.
 - 4. He resigned his appointment with the Federal Government of Nigeria on 24th February, 1964.
- The 2nd defendant is a registered company carrying on the business of banking in Lagos and in other parts of Nigeria.
- 6. While employed as a pharmacist by the Federal Government of Nigeria the salary of the 1st defendant was at his own request paid every month into an account which he maintained and still maintains with the 2nd defendant at the latter's Marina branch in Lagos.
- 7. On resigning his appointment with the Federal Government of Nigeria on 24th February, 1964, the 1st defendant ceased to be entitled to any salary from the Federal Government with effect from that date.
- 8. However, by a mistake of fact on the part of the accounts division of the Federal Ministry of Health, the salary of the 1st defendant continued to be paid as usual into his account at the Marina branch of the 2nd defendant long after his resignation.

PARTICULARS OF MISTAKE

Through inadvertence the scheduled accounts officer failed to endorse the personal emolument's card of the 1st defendant with the information that he had resigned his appointment with effect from 24th February, 1964.

9. As a result of the mistake aforesaid the 1st defendant during the period 24th February, 1964 to 31st March, 1968 was wrongly paid an aggregate salary of £2,955-0s-11d to which he was not entitled.

10. The 1st defendant knew or ought to know that the various sums aforesaid were paid in error into his account and that he was not and still is not entitled to the same.

PARTICULARS OF KNOWLEDGE

In the normal course of banking business statements of accounts are rendered to customers showing sources of payments-in and the beneficiaries of payments-out and such statements were enough to put the 1st defendant on his inquiry about the payments made into his account in error.

- 11. The 1st defendant has drawn considerably on the sums paid into his account with the 2nd defendant and it is believed that only a small sum now remains in his account.
- 12. Despite repeated demands made first on 21st May, 1968, and on subsequent occasions, the 2nd defendant has refused and still refuses to pay to the Federal Government of Nigeria the sum standing to the credit of the 1st defendant at the Marina branch of the 2nd defendant so as to offset part of the payments made in error to the 1st defendant.
- 13. The plaintiff contends that at all material times the 2nd defendant acted and still acts as the agent of the 1st defendant.
- 14. By reason of the above premise the Federal Government of Nigeria has suffered loss amounting to £2,955-0s-11d.
 - 15. Wherefore the plaintiff claims as follows:-
 - (i) from the 1st defendant as money had and received by him to the use of the Federal Government of Nigeria:
 - (a) the sum of £2,955-0s-11d, or alternatively
 - (b) the sum of £2,955-0s-11d less whatever sum may be paid over to the plaintiff by the 2nd defendant as the amount standing to the credit of the 1st defendant at the Marina branch of the 2nd defendant as at 21st May, 1968;
 - (ii) from the 2nd defendant as money had and received by it to the use of the Federal Government of Nigeria the exact sum that stood to the credit of the 1st defendant at the Marina branch of the 2nd defendant as at 21st May, 1968;
 - (iii) Costs from both the 1st and the 2nd defendants.

THE TEXTILE PRINTING INDUSTRY

Over the last ten years the Textile Industry has expanded tremendously in the volume and diversity of its production. Helped by the generous incentives granted by the Government the industry has now developed in many sectors far beyond its pioneer stages. Large and efficient units have been established to produce varieties of baft, drills, poplins, shirtings, blankets, towels, printed fabrics, etc., in sufficient quantities for the local market.

Difficulties are arising in the printing sector in particular where existing installed capacity is more than sufficient to meet the country's requirements. The Government does not intend to encourage further wasteful investment in installing additional printing equipment.
