You are hereby commanded to attend this Court at Lagos High Court on Monday the 4th day of November, 1968 at 9 o'clock in the forenoon to answer a suit by the Attorney-General of the Federation of c/o Mrs L. I. Isikalu (Solicitor), Federal Ministry of Justice, Lagos against you.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

The Plaintiff is the person authorised by law to prosecute and defend claims on behalf of the Government of the Federation of Nigeria.

2. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd-named defendants were at all material times employed by the Government of the Federation as, respectively, Commander, Lieutenant-Commander and Lieutenant in the Nigerian Navy.

3. During the period of their Commission in the Armed Forces of Nigeria, the defendants were assigned to various duties, and in particular, between the months of May and June 1964 the 1st and 3rd defendants were performing the duties of FLEET SUPPLY OFFICER and STORES PURCHASING OFFICER respectively while the second defendant between October 1963 and July 1964 was performing the duties of FLEET SUPPLY OFFICER.

4. The 1st and 2nd defendants impliedly warranted that they were possessed of reasonable skill to perform the duties of Fleet Supply Officer and the 3rd defendant that of Stores Purchasing Officer.

5. Further and alternatively it was the Defendants' duty as servants of the Government of the Federation to exercise reasonable care in and about the service of the said Government of the Federation.

6. In breach of the implied term aforesaid and/or alternatively in breach of the duty aforesaid the Defendants have been guilty of incompetence and negligence in the said service whereby the Government of the Federation has suffered loss and been put to expense.

7. The three defendants were Court-martialled under (i) s.64 of the Navy Act, (ii) s.40 of the Navy Act, and (iii) s.48 of the Navy Act and they were all found guilty as charged and dismissed from the Nigerian Navy.

8. The three defendants appealed to the Supreme Court and the Supreme Court allowed their appeal on the Counts founded in s.64 of the Navy Act but dismissed their appeals on the counts founded on s.40 and s.48.

9. The Plaintiff will rely on the Proceedings in the Court-Martial, the proceedings at the Supreme Court and the judgment of the Supreme Court dated 10th June, 1966 in respect of this same matter.

PARTICULARS OF INCOMPETENCE AND NEGLIGENCE
