 Background.—The Government of Sudan has requested assistance from the United Nations Development Programme for the establishment of a work oriented five year adult literacy project linked to Economic Development.

Sudan has a population estimated at about 13 million, with a high percentage of illiteracy.

Conscious of the fact that development and progress are incompatible with the existence of an illiterate population, the Sudanese authorities are taking all appropriate measures and have launched a literacy campaign all over the country. This campaign is administered by the Ministry of Education in collaboration with the local authorities. A Publications Bureau in Khartoum prepares and provides books and pamphlets and other literature for use in the literacy classes. An audio-visual aids unit is attached to this Bureau.

But the Government realises that, in the present stage of development, consumption expenditure cannot be allowed to increase at the expenses of investment. The additional resources which it will devote to the literacy campaign should be used in such a way that they are not in the nature of consumption expenditure or even of long-term investment, but that they should have an immediate impact on national output. With this view, and without losing sight of its ultimate objective of the eradication of illiteracy, it proposes to launch a functional literacy project which will both combat illiteracy and contribute to economic development.

The project.—The main objectives of the project are:

- (a) To give literacy training in Arabic to 80,000 illiterates, that is, to 40,000 in Khasm-el-Girba and 40,000 in the industrial area of Khartoum North;
- (b) To link the literacy training to agricultural and industrial training for men, and to home economics for women, as well as to education in citizenship; and to provide the necessary follow-up educational opportunities to enable the students to improve themselves as workers, farmers or housewives, and as citizens, and thus to contribute to the economic and social development of the country;

(c) To improve the teaching methods by the use of radio, T.V., audio-visual aids and other techniques;

(d) To establish an administrative structure in each of the areas which can deal with any illiteracy caused by migration after the end of the Special Fund project;

(e) To provide experience on which to plan similar impact projects in other development

areas;

- (f) To stimulate activity in areas not covered by impact projects by provision of broadcasting and other services and by strengthening the overall administrative structure for adult education in the Sudan;
- (g) To acquire experience of Arabic literacy teaching to special groups.

The project aims at giving functional literacy to 80,000 illiterates in two limited pilot locations:

- (i) The agricultural irrigation area of Khasmel-Girba, where the Government is initiating settlement schemes and providing the required supporting services including health and education personnel, as well as agricultural specialists. It is expected that the Government, in collaboration with the UNDP (Special Fund) will provide the required agricultural inputs for the farmers, i.e. chemicals, hand tools and basic equipment. This area is situated in the Kassala province east of Khartoum. Literacy training will be centred on the settlement scheme covering not more than thirty villages; and
- (ii) The industrial city of North Khartoum, where adult literacy training will be given in collaboration with the local enterprises concerned. The teaching of literacy will be closely linked with yocational training, improvement in basic manual skills and industrial safety and hygiene. The technical training will be associated with existing vocational training centres operated by the Ministry of Labour, in particular with the UNDP (Special Fund) assisted National Vocational Training Scheme for which—ILO has been designated as Participating and Executing Agency.
- 4. Functions.—Under the direction of the Chief Technical Adviser, the functions of the expert will be:

to be responsible, together with other competent members of the literacy team—particularly the functional literacy and written materials Adviser for the printing of reading materials;

to advise on and assist, from the technical point of view, in the planning and execution of book production programmes for the project;

to advise on and assist in the running of the publishing unit and the maintenance of the printing equipment;

to train counterparts in printing techniques;

to advise on and assist in the selection of candidates for fellowships who will carry on after the end of his mission;

New buildings will be constructed by the Government on a site of approximately 70 acres which has been acquired at Ipoh. Buildings will include administrative, teaching, laboratory and workshop blocks for the accommodation of 1,500 students, and hostel accommodation for approximately 1,000 students. Ipoh which has a population of about 300,000 is situated some 130 miles north of Kuala Lumpur, and is not only the centre of the tin industry, but is also rapidly becoming the centre for industrial development in Northern Malaysia. Tasek industrial estate is situated some 3 miles outside Ipoh, and there are other industrial estates at Taiping, Butterworth and Penang.
