Whereas by section 111 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall consist of the Chief Justice of Nigeria and any such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 112 (3) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that if the office of the Chief Justice of Nigeria is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the Justices of the Supreme Court as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice George Baptist Ayodola Coker to act as Chief Justice of Nigeria from 24th February to 8th April, 1969.

Whereas by section 111 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall consist of the Chief Justice of Nigeria and any such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 112 (4) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that if the office of any Justice of the Supreme Court is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person qualified to hold the office of a Justice of the Supreme Court to act in the office of a Justice of the Supreme Court:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice Atanda Fatayi-Williams to act as a Justice of the Supreme Court with effect from 15th February, 1969.

Other conditions of service.—The posts are pensionable except where contract terms are offered, and in the case of new entrants to the Western State Public Service, appointment will be on probation for three years, Government quarters will be provided where available on a rental currently not above 8½ per cent of the officer's salary. Other conditions of service will be as prescribed for the officers of equivalent grade in the Western State Public Service. Expatriates will be appointed on contract terms only.
- 6.
