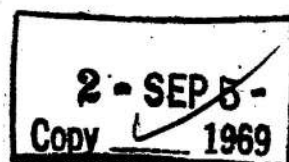

Minerals Act (Cap. 121)

APPLICATION TO CONSTRUCT A LEAT

Notice is hereby given that, under the provisions of the above Act, application [A.I.M. Northern Inspectorate's Memo. It is intended to meet, qualitatively as well as quantitatively, the needs created by economic development and to exemplify a new concept of higher scientific and technological education in the Middle East. The language of instruction used in the University is English.

Unesco has, under the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance, assisted in the development of the University since its start and since 1960 also under funds allocated by the United Nations Special Fund.

The first phase of the assistance programme has been completed, and the Special Fund is providing during a five-year period ending in 1971, extended assistance to five Departments in the University's Faculty of Engineering, the Departments of Electrical, Mechanical, Chemical, Mining, and Metallurgical Engineering.

In the academic year 1967-68 there were approximately 2,300 students enrolled in the Faculty of Engineering. A full course of instruction is available, leading, after four year's study, to a B.Sc. degree in engineering, and to an M.S. after an additional year. The first year of the courses is common to all branches of engineering, with specialization taking place in the second year of the course.

The students for the degree courses are selected by means of an entrance examination from applicants who have completed their secondary school studies. For students who are not adequately prepared in the English language for admission to the degree courses, a preparatory course of one year is provided to give the necessary grounding.
