APPOINTMENT OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS FOR THE 1969-70 COCOA SEASON

It is notified for general information that the Board is prepared to consider applications for appointment as licensed buying agents for the 1969-70 Cocoa Season which will open about September 1969. The exact date will be notified later by publication in the *Western Nigeria Gazette*.

2. Applicants will be required to produce evidence that they are likely to be able to fulfil the minimum conditions set out in the following paragraphs, which are based on:—

- (a) the normal functions which a licensed buying agent is required to perform;
- (b) ability to purchase and handle a minimum of 400 tons for an average season;
- (c) stipulated conditions as regards storage, evacuation, etc.

3. *Functions of licensed buying agents.*—The main functions which licensed buying agents will be required to perform on behalf of the Board are:—

- (a) to purchase cocoa at gazetted buying stations at not less than the minimum prices;
- (b) to bag and arrange for inspection in accordance with the regulations;
- (c) to finance purchases and provide suitable storage until the time of evacuation to port.
- (d) to make returns of purchases and stocks as the Board or its duly authorised executive may require;
- (e) to arrange for conveyance and delivery of cocoa to Board's stores, Ikeja and Apapa and according to instructions which may be issued from time to time by the Board's executive.

4. *Minimum conditions.*—(a) *Purchases.*—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout a season a minimum of 400 tons of cocoa (i.e., Main and Light Crops inclusive). Evidence will be required of previous experience in the produce trade and of the established firms of licensed buying agents to which the applicant had been selling his purchases. In this connection applicants may be required to produce their previous purchases and sales records and/or certificates from licensed buying agents of purchases sold to them in previous seasons.

(b) *Capital.*—The minimum capital requirement necessary to fulfil the obligations of a licensed buying agent as at (a) above has been fixed by the Board as £9,000. Applicants will be required to forward, as evidence of their ability to satisfy this minimum requirement, copies of their bank statements for the six months preceding the date of the application, duly certified by their bankers. Only applications to which such bank statements have been attached will be considered.

(c) *Storage bag and twine.*—Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposed areas of operation proper storage for at least two hundred tons of cocoa. All stores must comply with the requirement of, and be approved by the Western Nigeria Produce Inspection Service. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request, in writing, the Produce Officer of the area concerned to inspect and approve his stores. Applicants will be required to produce evidence of ability to provide sufficient twine to cover at least the minimum purchase requirement.

(d) *General*.—Applicants must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence to show that they are fully conversant with the cocoa trade and likely to be able to fulfil the following conditions :—

(i) *Inspection of cocoa*.—That they will be able to provide an adequate labour force at all stores to handle cocoa at the time of inspection.

(ii) *Returns*.—That they will render promptly and accurately all returns, particularly of purchases and stocks, which may be called for.

(iii) *Evacuation*.—(a) That they will be able to make arrangement to secure the necessary transport to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of cocoa by approved routes.

(b) That they possess the necessary organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the carrying out of all duties involved in the delivery of cocoa to Board's stores.

5. *Method of application*.—Application forms and details as to their completion can be obtained free of charge from the Headquarters of the Western Nigeria Marketing Board, Cocoa House, Bank Road, Ibadan or the Lagos Zonal Headquarters of the Board, Private Mail Bag 1018, Ikeja Industrial Estates, Ikeja.

6. BLENDING AND BOTTLING POTABLE SPIRITS IN WAREHOUSE

Commencement : 3rd March, 1969

The attention of warehouse keepers is invited to this Notice which contains the Board's requirements and directions for the blending and bottling of potable spirits in approved bonded warehouses.

PART I—GENERAL

2. *Law*.—The law relating to warehouse is contained in Part IV of the Customs and Excise Management Act, 1958, No. 55 of 1958.

3. *General*.—The amendment to section 81 (1) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1958 permits the blending and bottling of potable spirits in a warehouse. This Notice contains the special requirements and directions for these operations in addition to the general provisions in :—

Customs and Excise Notice No. 9 (Government Notice No. 698 of 1959)—Approval of General and Private Warehouses ; and Customs and Excise Notice No. 10 (Government Notice No. 699 of 1959)—Goods in Warehouse : Deposit, Operation and Delivery ;

and is to be read and construed in conjunction with these Notices.

4. *Approval*.—(a) Where approval to blend and bottle potable spirits is sought, the warehouse keeper's application for provisional approval (*see* paragraph 7 of Customs and Excise Notice No. 9) is to be supported by detailed plans or drawings (in triplicate) to show the construction of the warehouse and its relative situation to other buildings, rooms or places in the vicinity. The plans or drawings are also to show clearly the course, construction and use of all fixed pipes to be used and every branch thereof and cock thereon and every vessel or utensil with which any such pipe connects within the warehouse.

(b) Any special conditions and requirements stipulated by the Board for the blending and bottling of potable spirits will be contained in the Board's grant of final approval (*see* paragraph 8 of Customs and Excise Notice No. 9).

5. *Construction and connection of vessels, utensils, etc.*—(a) All cocks, plugs, pumps, pipes and other utensils are required to be fixed and kept, at the expense of the warehouse keeper, to the satisfaction of the proper officer.

(b) It is an offence for a warehouse keeper to cause or procure any cover, fastening, cock, plug, pump or pipe to be so made or used that any vessel or utensil may be employed, opened, removed, filled or emptied in any manner not approved.

(c) The ends of pipes required to be secure are to be fastened by soldering, welding, sweating, brazing or riveting. If screw bolts and nuts are used, the bolts are to be riveted over nuts. If pipes are jointed by flanges, it is sufficient to rivet two opposite bolts in each flange.

(d) Every pipe used in the warehouse is required to be placed and fixed so as to be capable of being examined throughout its whole length.

(e) Ordinary turning cocks are required to be used on vats, tanks or vessels and the pipes connected therewith. The plug of such ordinary turning cock is not to be riveted in, but is to be so made that it can be removed by the proper officer for examination. The key head is required to be legibly marked to show whether the cock is open or shut.

(f) A warehouse keeper is required to provide and maintain fastenings for securing the man-holes of vats, tanks or vessels and the cocks, plugs, pumps, and utensils required by the Board to be secured.

6. *Situation of vessels.*—(a) Each vat, tank or vessel in the warehouse is required to be placed and kept in a convenient situation, easy and safe of access and with sufficient head-room for official examination and account and permanently fixed so as to admit of the contents being accurately gauged.

(b) A warehouse keeper is required :—

(1) to provide ladders, lights and such assistance as the proper officer may require for the performance of his duties ;

(2) to ensure that the premises are adequately ventilated.

7. *Alteration of position of vessels.*—A warehouse keeper is not to alter the position or level or the dipping place of any vat, tank or vessel without first receiving the Board's written permission.

8. *Secure store.*—A warehouse keeper is required to provide a Secure Store within the warehouse for the storing of blending agents, flavouring concentrates or neutral blending alcohol imported in drum or cask. The Store is to be of sufficient size to hold the maximum quantity of containers likely to be received for warehousing from importation at any one time. The door of the Store is to have a fitting to take both revenue and warehouse keeper's locks. The Store is to be kept locked at all times except when containers are being received or delivered.

9. *Gauging vessels.*—(a) All vats, tanks or vessels approved for storing and or blending are required to be gauged by the warehouse keeper under official supervision and the necessary tables and implements are to be provided by the warehouse keeper so that the quantity of liquid in such vat, tank or vessel may at any time be accurately determined. The warehouse keeper is required to sign and lodge with the Area Chief Collector, a certificate to the effect that the gauging (of named vats, etc.) has been accurately carried out. The certificate is required to be renewed by the warehouse keeper annually on the 1st of January.

(b) A warehouse keeper is required to provide either—

(1) dipping rods which are to be certified correct in accordance with the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1965 (Legal Notice No. 57 of 1965) ; or

(2) a scale, marked with the gauges, permanently fixed to the sight-glass of each vessel.

10. *Dipping rods.*—A dipping rod, where provided, is to be fitted so as to slide through a brass guide securely fixed to the cover of the vessel through which it cannot be withdrawn. When not in use the rod is to be drawn right out of the liquor and kept in this position by a screw.

11. *Provision of Appliances for Taking Official Accounts.*—Such appliances as scales, weights, measuring containers, etc., as may be required for the official checking or taking of accounts are to be provided by a warehouse keeper and are to be certified accurate in accordance with the Weights and Measures Regulations 1965 and maintained in an accurate condition. Such appliances, etc., need not be for the exclusive use of the officer.

12. *Blending Agents, etc.—Special Procedure at Importation.*—In addition to the requirements of paragraphs 3 to 9 of Customs and Excise Notice No. 10, the following special instructions relate to the importation of spirits for blending :

(a) *Licence and Fee.*—In accordance with the Imports Prohibition Order, 1959 (Legal Notice No. 81 of 1959), Second Schedule, Item 13 (b)—Spirits, in casks or drums—an importer requires a licence from the Board, which, if granted, is subject to the payment of two shillings and four pence per liquid gallon for every one per cent of pure alcohol in excess of 43 per cent or such other fee as the Minister shall from time to time determine.

(b) *Exemption from Import Duty.*—Item 3 (3) of Schedule 2 to the Customs Tariff Act 1965, provides for exemption of Customs duties on importations of "blending agents, flavouring concentrates and neutral blending alcohol" by a manufacturer approved by the Ministry of Finance provided these goods are used exclusively for the production of potable alcoholic liquor, still wine and aperitifs.

(c) *Entry.*—Where a manufacturer has been approved by the Ministry in accordance with sub-paragraph (b), the entry for warehousing for each consignment of imported alcohol, etc., is to bear a declaration by the approved manufacturer concerned, stating the purpose for which the alcohol is imported and quoting the authority from the Ministry. Specifications are to be attached to each entry showing cask or drum identifying marks and numbers and for each container the gross, tare, nett weight and the content in gallons.

13. *Receipts into Warehouse.*—(a) Spirits for blending may be received into warehouse—

(i) on importation ex-ship entered on Form Sale 92—Entry for Warehousing (Ex-ship).

(ii) from the distillery of manufacture entered on Form Sale 54—Entry for Goods Ex-factory for Warehousing ;

- (iii) on removal from a distiller's warehouse entered on Form Sale 88—Entry Ex-warehouse for removal of Excisable goods for re-warehousing ;
- (iv) on removal from another bonded warehouse entered on Form Sale 88—Entry Ex-warehouse for removal of Excisable goods for re-warehousing ;
- (b) Spirits may only be received into a warehouse during the approved warehouse hours (see paragraph 12 of Customs and Excise Notice No. 9) and under official supervision.
- (c) The account of spirits received into a warehouse is determined by the proper officer.

PART II—BLENDING AND BOTTLING OPERATIONS

14. *Warehouse Spirits Blending Book.*—(a) A Warehouse Spirits Blending Book—Book C 31 (see Annex for precedent) is provided by the proper officer for a warehouse keeper to enter prior notice of his intended blending and bottling operations and declarations.

(b) The Warehouse Spirits Blending Book is to be kept by a warehouse keeper in a place approved by the proper Collector within the warehouse. It is at all times to be available to the proper officer and is not to be removed except when taken up by the proper officer on completion.

(c) Each entry made by a warehouse keeper in the Warehouse Spirits Blending Book is to be made on a separate line and a straight line drawn through all the unused columns of that line.

(d) If a warehouse keeper requires to cancel any notice given in the Warehouse Spirits Blending Book, he is to write the word "void" along the line on which the notice is given and add his initials and the date and hour of cancellation.

15. *Warehouse Keeper's Notice and Declaration of Blending and Bottling Operations.*—(a) A warehouse keeper is required to give prior notice of his intention to blend by completing columns 1 to 6 in the Warehouse Spirits Blending Book stating the day and the hour of the blend, the marks and numbers of the casks or drums to be drawn from the Secure Store, the number of the vat from which bulk spirits are to be drawn and the number of the Blending Vat in which the blend is to be made.

(b) Each blending is to be given a Blend Number by the warehouse keeper.

(c) Immediately on the completion of a blending operation, the warehouse keeper is required to enter his declaration of the "Account of Spirits made" in columns 7 to 12 of the Warehouse Spirits Blending Book.

(d) At the close of business on any day when bottling has been in progress, the warehouse keeper is required to make his declaration of the total quantity of spirits bottled and packed by completing columns 13 to 19 of the Warehouse Spirits Blending Book.

(e) If at the end of a bottling operation there are insufficient bottles to complete a container, the "remnant" is to be declared as a proportion of a full container.

16. *Marking of Packed Containers.*—(a) A warehouse keeper is required to clearly mark all containers packed bottled spirits to show brand, number of bottles, liquid gallon content and serial number.

(b) A continuous series of numbers is to be used to mark containers irrespective of brand.

(c) It is an offence for any container of blended spirits to be removed from the bottling area without the serial number being marked thereon.

17. *Security of Imported Casks or Drums.*—No cask or drum is to be removed from the Secure Store except on 'Notice' (paragraph 15) and in the presence of the proper officer who is to attend at the time stated on the Notice and unlock the Store. Every drum or cask is to be produced for official inspection.

18. *Security of Vessels.*—(a) Except during the movement of spirits, all vats, tanks or vessels containing spirits are required to be officially sealed or locked to prevent abstraction.

(b) No operation or blend is to take place except on 'Notice' (paragraph 15) and under the supervision of the proper officer who is first to inspect seals and locks and be satisfied that there has been no illegal tampering with the contents of vats, tanks or vessels.

(c) On completion of a movement of spirits, the charging and discharging cocks and manholes of the vats, tanks or vessels involved are to be re-sealed or locked by the proper officer as necessary.

PART III—DELIVERIES

19. *Rate of Duty.*—The rates of duty chargeable on each brand of spirits blended in warehouse are those in force at the date of the removal of the spirits from warehouse as prescribed in Schedule 1 of the Excise Tariff Act 1965.

20. *Ex-Warehouse Entry.*—(a) A warehouse keeper is required to give prior notice of his intention to deliver blended and packed spirits by presenting the prescribed form of entry to the proper officer.

(b) The following entry forms are to be used—

Form Sale 55—for home use (in quadruplicate) ;

Form Sale 58—for exportation or use as aircraft ship stores (in quadruplicate) ;

Form Sale 88—for removal for re-warehousing (in quintuplicate).

(c) Except where spirits are exported by Government Departments, Marketing Boards, Statutory Corporations or Diplomatic or other Privileged Persons or Organisations, an additional copy of every entry for exports, conspicuously marked "FOR INLAND REVENUE", is required.

(d) An additional copy—for the warehouse keeper's use may also be submitted, provided that it is conspicuously marked "MANUFACTURER'S COPY—FOR REFERENCE PURPOSES ONLY". After machine stamping it will be returned to the warehouse keeper.

21. *Deliveries to Diplomatic and Other Privileged Persons and Organisations.*—(a) The entry (Form Sale 55) in respect of deliveries to Diplomatic and Other Privileged Persons or Organisations is to bear the following receipt certified by the Privileged Person or the authorised signatory on behalf of a Privileged Organisation:—

"Received into my/our own premises the spirits entered overleaf for use only for the duty-free purpose allowed by law".

22. *Specimen Signatures of Privileged Persons and Authorised Signatories on behalf of Privileged Organisations.*—(a) The names of persons and organisations entitled to receive duty-free goods under the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act 1962 are published monthly by the Ministry of External Affairs in a booklet entitled "Diplomatic and Consular List".

(b) Privileged Persons and Organisations approved by the Board who intend to avail themselves of duty-free deliveries are to forward to the appropriate Area Chief Collector specimen signatures on Form Sale 79—Specimen Signatures of Privileged Persons and Authorised Signatories on behalf of Organisations Entitled to Receive Excisable Goods Duty-Free.

(c) Heads of approved Missions and organisations are required to appoint signatories in respect of deliveries for official use and to forward to the Proper Area Chief Collector letters of appointment for, and specimen signatures of, authorised signatories.

23. *Duty-Free Deliveries.*—(a) See paragraphs 18 to 23 of Customs and Excise Notice No. 10.

(b) Before delivery each package is to be secured as directed by the proper officer and marked indelibly by the warehouse keeper with the content in gallons and, except in the case of deliveries to Privileged Persons etc., the words "Delivered duty-free for.....(e.g. exportation)".

(c) When delivery has been permitted by the proper officer a warehouse keeper is:—

(i) in the case of exports and stores, to submit the entry to the cashier in the Long Room at the port or place of exportation or loading as stores and produce the spirits to the proper officer for examination and shipment;

(ii) in the case of deposits in warehouse, to submit the entry to the cashier in the Long Room at the port or place where the warehouse of deposit is situated, and to forward the spirits to the warehouse keeper;

(iii) in the case of delivery for use by Privileged Persons and Organisations, to despatch the spirits together with the entry direct to such Persons or Organisations for certificate of receipt and then submit the entry to the cashier in the Long Room at the nearest Custom House.

24. *Gross Payment Account.*—(a) Spirits which have been blended and bottled in warehouse may not be delivered for home use from a warehouse without prior payment of duty. As an expedient a warehouse keeper may pay duty by means of a Gross Payment Account, i.e., by pre-payment of duty in a bulk sum to the proper officer who may accept individual entries against such payment so long as a balance remains.

(b) A warehouse keeper who wishes to set up and maintain a Gross Payment Account is required to make written application to the Area Chief Collector for approval together with a Banker's Guarantee covering the maximum amount of duty to be deposited at any one time.

(c) Where a warehouse keeper pays duty by means of a Gross Payment Account each entry for home use (Form Sale 55) is to be endorsed "Duty paid previously to Gross Payment Account".

(d) A warehouse keeper is required to maintain a credit balance in the Gross Payment Account by making periodical payments to the proper officer of sufficient amounts to cover anticipated dutiable removals.

25. *Monthly Stock-Taking of Packed Potable Spirits.*—On the last working day of each month the warehouse keeper is required to prepare in duplicate and deliver to the proper officer a Monthly Stock Sheet enumerating by brand, the number and gallonage of all packages of packed spirits in bond.

26. In addition to the special provisions of this Notice, warehouse keepers are invited to note the information contained in—

Customs and Excise Notice No. 45 (Government Notice No. 234 of 1969)—Excise Revenue Control—Manufacture of Spirits by Distillation.
