## Export of Nigerian Produce Act 1958 (No. 36 of 1958)

#### NORTHERN STATES PRODUCE ORDER 1969

#### Commencement: 13th May 1969

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 (b) of the Export of Nigerian Produce Act 1958, the Commissioner for Trade and Industries, after consultation with the Governments of the Northern States, hereby removes ginger from the order published in the Federation of Nigeria Official Gazette, No. 59, Vol. 50 of the 8th August, 1963, by which the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited was empowered exclusively to export ginger from the North to all countries.
