Whereas by section 111 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria shall consist of the Chief Justice of Nigeria and any such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 112 (3) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that if the office of Chief Justice of Nigeria is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of the office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the Justices of the Supreme Court as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now Therefore, The Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice George Baptist Ayodola Coker to act as Chief Justice of Nigeria from 19th May, 1969 to 6th July, 1969.

Whereas by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that the High Court of the former Northern Nigeria shall consist of the Chief Justice and such number of Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (5) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that if the office of Chief Justice of Northern States is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, then, until a person has been appointed to and has assumed the functions of that office or until the person holding the office has resumed those functions, as the case may be, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other judges of the High Court as may from time to time be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice Mohammed Bello to act as the Chief Justice of Northern States with effect from 12th May, 1969.
