IN THE MATTER OF SECTION 11 (2) OF THE TRADE DISPUTES (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS) DECREE 1968

AND

IN THE MATTER OF A TRADE DISPUTE BETWEEN THE NATIONAL BANK OF NIGERIA LIMITED AND THE NATIONAL BANK OF NIGERIA STAFF UNION

WHEREAS a trade dispute has arisen and now exists between the National Bank of Nigeria Limited and the National Bank of Nigeria Staff Union:

AND WHEREAS the endeavours to promote a settlement by negotiation have proved unsuccessful:

NOW THEREFORE, THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 11 (2) of the Trade Disputes (Emergency Provisions) Decree No. 21 of 1968, hereby refer the matter in dispute to an arbitration tribunal and hereby appoint Mr James Taggart to act as a Single Arbitrator to examine the claims of the National Bank of Nigeria Staff Union concerning the "Proposed External Examination for Clerks, Grade IV", with the following as the terms of reference of the Tribunal:

"Generally, to look into the trade dispute declared by the National Bank of Nigeria Staff Union on 10th January, 1969 against the National Bank of Nigeria Limited, in accordance with section 4 of the Trade Disputes (Emergency Provisions) Decree No. 21 of 1968 as referred by the Federal Commissioner for Labour, and in particular, to consider the circumstances under which the dispute has arisen and the

extent to which the terms of employment and the physical conditions of work of the employees concerned have been affected, and to make such awards, having regard to the circumstances of the dispute and such other matters pertaining thereto or arising therefrom, as the Arbitration Tribunal may deem necessary."

In accordance with paragraph 5 of Part II of Schedule I to Decree No. 21 of 1968, the Commissioner has also appointed the following assessors to assist the Single Arbitrator:

- (i) Alhaji M. O. Oseni, Barrister and Solicitor (Nominated by the National Bank of Nigeria Limited).
- (ii) Mr C. 'Kunle Oyero, Barrister and Solicitor (Nominated by the National Bank of Nigeria Staff Union).

AND it is further directed that the said Single Arbitrator shall, within 21 days of the date of his appointment or such longer period as the Commissioner may allow make his award, and forthwith send a notification of the award to the Commissioner.

RESEARCH STUDENTSHIP— DEPARTMENT OF PHARMACY

Applications are invited for the following Research Studentships to be awarded in the session 1969-70 for full-time advanced study and research work in the Drug Research Centre of the Department of Pharmacy:—

1. *The Biode Research Studentship*—established with a gift of £1,000 by the Biode Pharmaceutical Industries Limited.

2. *The George Iketubosun Research Studentship*—established in memory of the late Dr George Iketubosun, of the Department of Pharmacy, by Messrs May & Baker (Nigeria) Limited with a gift of £1,000.

Candidates must hold a First or Upper Second Class Honours Degree in Pharmacy.

The value of each Studentship is £500 per annum (all inclusive) plus free tuition.

The award will be tenable for one year in the first instance and may be renewed for a second year. The award may be withdrawn at any time if the student's work and progress is unsatisfactory.

3. *Functions of Licensed Buying Agents.*—The main functions which Licensed Buying Agents will be required to perform on behalf of the Board are :—

- (a) to purchase Cocoa at buying stations at not less than the minimum prices ;
- (b) to bag and arrange for inspection in accordance with the regulations ;
