

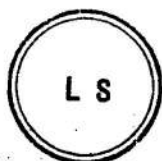

WHEREAS by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the High Court of the former Eastern Nigeria shall consist of the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (1) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Chief Justice and the other Judges of the High Court shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint MR JUSTICE DARNLEY ARTHUR RAYMOND ALEXANDER as Chief Justice of the South-Eastern State with effect from 1st June, 1969.

WHEREAS by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the High Court of the South-Eastern State shall consist of the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (1) of the Constitution of the former Eastern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Chief Justice and the Judges of the High Court shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

NOW THEREFORE THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint SUNDAY JAMES ETE a Judge of the High Court of South-Eastern State with effect from 29th May, 1969.

LOCAL PRODUCTION OF GREY CLOTH FOR THE
PRINTING INDUSTRY

The Federal Military Government has reaffirmed its policy on further development of the textile printing industry. The Government has decided to end the importation of grey cloth at concessionary duty rates by local printers by 1st April, 1971.

2. The Government will review the concessionary duty rate as necessary so as to encourage the existing printers to accelerate their plans for spinning and weaving their cloth requirements locally. In furtherance of this goal, the Government will permit the importation of longer staple cotton for a limited period to supplement the local supply of cotton. At the same time, it will actively encourage the increased cultivation of suitable quality cotton in the country. These decisions are in line with the policy announced to the industry in 1966. Periodic consultations have been held with representatives of the textile industry to ensure that their planning and investment decisions are in accordance with this policy.

3. The Federal Military Government is also much concerned at the inflated prices now demanded by retailers of cotton prints and other textile materials. It has granted additional quotas of grey cloth to established printers in order to increase the supply of prints. Meanwhile, the Government appeals to the retailers of textile materials not to abuse the situation by charging highly inflated prices much in excess of factory prices. Further measures for controlling prices are being considered.
