

BOARDING OF SHIPS, AIRCRAFT AND VEHICLES AND INWARD REPORT Commencement: 14th April, 1969

PART I-GENERAL

Law.—The attention of Shipping and Airline companies, vehicle owners and all others concerned is invited to the Customs and Excise Management Act, No. 55 of 1958, in particular to sections 12, 14, 16, 19, 24 and 129 thereof, and to the Importation and Exportation by Air Regulations 1959—Legal Notice No. 71 of 1959:

Importation and Exportation by Land and Inland Waters Regulations 1967—Legal Notice 20 of 1967; Customs Ports Order 1959-Legal Notice 82 of 1959;

Merchant Shipping Act, 1962 No. 30;

Notaries Public Act, Cap. 141;

Ports Act, Cap. 155;

Quarantine Act, Cap. 172.

2. Obligation to report.—(a) Except as permitted under paragraph 22, ships, aircraft and vehicles arriving from a place outside Nigeria are required to report as appropriate at a Customs port, Customs airport, or Customs station respectively. These are-

3. Goods which need not be reported.—The following goods need not be reported but must be produced to the proper officer for clearance-

Crew effects

Items listed on the Parcels List

Bona fide passengers' accompanied baggage.

- 4. Form and Manner of Report.-All reports shall be in the English language, legible and either typewritten or hand written in ink. If the report consists of several pages the master or his authorised agent shall initial each page below the last item, endorse on page one the total number of pages and number each page as a fraction of the total, e.g., page one of a five-page report would be endorsed "Five Pages" and each page numbered 1/5, 2/5, 3/5, 4/5 and 5/5.
- 5. Description of Goods in the Report.—(a) The report is to be made out according to the particulars given on the bills of lading, the names and addresses of consignees as well as the quantities and descriptions of goods being specified on the report.

(b) Goods to be Specifically Reported.—The precise descriptions and quantities of the following goods are to be specifically reported unless remaining on board for exportation:—

Animals
Cigarettes
Cigares
Drugs
Explosives (including gun-powder)
Firearms and Ammunition
Fireworks

Grain cargo
Inflammable goods
Petroleum products in bulk
Plants and seeds
Spirits
Tobacco
Wine.

- 6. Cubic measurement or Weight.—Every ship's report shall show the weight or cubic measurement of the cargo according to each bill of lading and is to contain a declaration that such weight or measurement is that on which freight has been charged. If no freight has been charged the weight or measurement normally chargeable for the amount and quantity of goods is to be stated.
- 7. Alteration to Reports.—At the time of making report the master or his authorised agent is to initial and date any alterations.
- 8. Amendments to Reports.—After a report has been accepted by the proper officer, applications to amend it may be submitted in duplicate on Form Sale 104,—"Application for Permission to Amend by Adding/Deducting," stating in full the reasons for the required amendment together with complete documentary evidence in support.
- 9. Sealing of Documents.—All the pages of the report including manifest sheets (where used) shall be sealed with a seal capable of positive identification as the master's or authorised agent's seal and be so affixed that pages cannot be withdrawn or added.
- 10. Advance Manifests.—To facilitate speedy release of goods at certain ports, advance manifests may be submitted for striking, prior to report of the ship. Full details of the scheme and the conditions attached thereto may be obtained on application to the officer in charge of the port.
- 11. Boarding.—(a) Ships, aircraft and vehicles from foreign, whether arriving in ballast or carrying goods subject to Customs control will on arrival at a Customs port/airport/station be boarded by the proper officers of Customs and Excise as soon as practicable.
- (b) The proper officer who has boarded a ship, aircraft or vehicle may remain on board for any period necessary for the completion of his duty and such ship, aircraft or vehicle shall not depart from the port, airport or station with the officer on board against his wish and without his consent in writing.
- (c) The master or captain of the ship, aircraft or person in charge of the vehicle, or other responsible person appointed by any of them will deliver, to the Boarding Officer, documents as required and will answer all questions relating to the ship, aircraft or vehicle, the voyage, flight or journey, the crews, passengers and other persons on board, stores, crews' effects and private stores and animals or other goods beside cargo.
- (d) Production of Documents.—For ships in all cases, and for aircraft and vehicles as applicable (see (f) below), the proper officer may direct the following documents to be delivered:—
 - (i) Clearance from the last place or port of call;
 - (ii) If from foreign via another Nigerian port, transire in the Form Sale 43—Specific Transire for Carriage of Goods coastwise;
 - (iii) Stores Lists;
 - (iv) Rummage Certificate, from the last Nigerian Port, airport, or station;
 - (v) Passenger List;
 - (vi) Crew Declaration;
 - (vii) Parcels List (i.e., goods carried for which a Bill of Lading is not issued);
 - (viii) 'Application to Break Bulk', if necessary;
 - (ix) Ports of call:
 - (x) Maritime Declaration of Health (required only at places where an officer of Customs and Excise is an authorised officer under the Quarantine Act, Cap. 172);
 - (xi) Evidence of payment of Light and Buoyage Dues for the voyage, (required only at ports where the Nigerian Ports Authority has no representative).
- (e) An additional copy of every document listed in sub-paragraph (d) above is to be produced for every class of goods which is required to be pre-entered.
- (f) Appropriate Documents.—The documents required vary according to ship, aircraft or vehicle. Enquiries should be made from the proper officer in charge of the port/airport/station.
- 12. Breaking Bulk.—When a ship or aircraft or vehicle carrying goods from any foreign country enters Nigeria, bulk shall not be broken before permission to break bulk has been granted by the proper officer. In the case of a ship, the request and the permission shall be in writing on the prescribed form—Form Sale 119—Application to Break Bulk before Report and to Unload Goods.

- 13. Alteration in Stowage.—The stowage of any goods carried from any place outside Nigeria in a ship, aircraft or vehicle entering Nigeria shall not be altered so as to facilitate their unloading except with the knowledge and consent of the proper officer at the Customs port/airport/station.
- 14. Staving and Destruction of Goods.—No goods carried from any place outside Nigeria in a ship, aircraft, vehicle, or any other means of transportation entering Nigeria shall be staved, destroyed or thrown overboard nor shall any container be opened except with the knowledge and consent in writing of the proper officer in charge at port, airport or station of discharge.
- 15. Sealing of Stores.—(a) The Boarding Officer may in certain cases, on request, issue for the use of the ship, aircraft and the crew, such stores as are deemed necessary and will place the remaining stores under a Customs seal. No person other than the proper officer of Customs and Excise shall break or cause a Customs seal to be broken whilst the ship or aircraft is in port or is travelling between ports or places in Nigeria.
- (b) Request to issue Stores Subsequent to Boarding.—After the issue of stores as stated in sub-paragraph (a) above, any request to issue stores at any other time subsequent to completion of boarding, shall be by a written application to the proper Collector/Assistant Preventive Superintendent, at the port, airport or station. Overtime fees where payable will be charged at the prescribed rate for attendance outside the appropriate official hours of attendance.
- 16. Examination and Rummaging.—The proper officer of Customs and Excise may at any time rummage a ship, aircraft or vehicle and may examine or take such other steps he deems fit to secure any goods carried thereon, and the master, commander, owner, a responsible person in charge or the agent shall provide every safe means to facilitate the rummaging or examination as required by the proper officer.

PART II-SHIPS ARRIVING BY SEA

- 17. Pratique Signals.—Ships arriving by sea within twelve miles of a port shall, unless granted a radio pratique, display pratique signals in the International Code to signify the state of health of the ship as required by the Quarantine (Ships) Regulations, 1960, as follows:—
 - (a) Flags.—Between sunrise and sunset, the Q, QQ, QL flags as appropriate, shall be flown at the mast-head or where they can be seen. The flags are to be lowered only on the direction of the Health Officer or the authorised officer of the local Health Authorities.
- (b) Lights.—Between sunset and sunrise, within the precincts of the port, a red light over a white light shall be displayed. Where the lights are not shown it will be assumed that pratique has been granted. For detailed information, reference should be made to the Quarantine Act, Cap. 172.
- 18. Place and Time of Report.—Report of every ship arriving by sea at a Customs port, being a ship of which report is required, shall be made by the master within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the ship to the proper Collector or other proper officer of Customs and Excise at the Custom House at that Customs port.
- 19. Report other than at a Customs Port.—Where a ship has been permitted by the Board under section 12 (4) of the Customs and Excise Management Act, 1958, to call on arrival by sea in Nigeria at a place other than a Customs port, report of such ship shall be made by the master within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the ship at that place to the proper officer at that place.
- 20. Ships in Distress, etc.—If a ship is compelled by accident, stress of weather or other unavoidable cause to call at a place other than a Customs port, the master of such ship—
 - (a) shall immediately report the circumstances which caused the ship to call at such place to the nearest officer of Customs and Excise or police officer and on demand produce to him the documents relating to the ship, her cargo and passengers;
 - (b) shall not, without the consent of an officer of Customs and Excise or police officer, permit any goods to be unloaded, or any of the crew or passengers to land from the ship and shall comply with any directions given by an officer of Customs and Excise or police officer with respect to any such goods, unless such landing or unloading of passengers, crew or goods from a ship is necessary to avoid loss of or to preserve life, the ship or goods.
- 21. Ships Exempted from Report.—All ships arriving from foreign ports whether in ballast or not, other than Warships of any nationality except ships of the Nigerian Navy are required to report.
- 22. Documents of report, etc.—(a) Documents.—The documents prescribed for the report of a ship which shall be delivered to the proper officer are:—

(i) Ship's Inward Report;

(ii) Manifest of Cargo (where the Inward Report does not contain all the items of the goods carried, in which case the column of the Report must be endorsed "As per Manifest attached, sheets," the number of sheets being inserted in words);

(iii) Ships Transire, if any;

- (iv) Notice relating to Grain Cargo, in the case of a ship carrying a cargo of grain.
- (b) Listing and/or Itemising of Goods.—The following categories of goods must be listed and/or itemised separately on the report or on the cargo manifest:—

(i) goods to be cleared locally, listed to landing quays;

(ii) goods for other Nigerian ports or places, shown according to port or place;

- (iii) goods for transhipment, grouped according to the port or place of destination;
- (iv) goods in transit; (v) goods remaining on board for exportation (which need not be itemised except for ships of less than 250 tons register in which case the goods must be reported in detail); (vi) over-carried goods.
- 23. Ships Carrying Grain Cargo.—On the arrival at a port in Nigeria of any ship carrying a cargo of grain, the master of the ship or his agent shall deliver to the proper Collector a notice stating-
 - (a) the draught of water and freeboard of the ship after the loading of her cargo was completed at the final port of loading;
 - (b) the following particulars of the grain carried
 - the kind of grain and the quantity thereof, stated in cubic feet, quarters, bushels or tons weight;
 - the mode in which the grain is stowed; and (iii) the precaution taken to prevent the grain from shifting.
- 24. Ships in Ballast.—Reports for ships arriving without cargo other than stores or passengers' accompanied baggage and crew's effects are to be endorsed "In Ballast" or "NIL" in the space used for reporting cargo.

PART III-PARTICULAR SHIPS

- 25. Nigerian Naval Ships.—Ships of the Nigerian Navy arriving at a Customs port from outside Nigeria will be boarded by officers of Customs and Excise, and the following documents will be required from the Captain:
 - a complete list of the ship's company on board, showing ranks;
 - (ii) a written declaration by every officer and rating of any private dutiable goods purchased outside Nigeria since that officer or rating last left Nigeria;
 - (iii) a list of all passengers;
 - (iv) a written declaration by every passeger of any dutiable goods in his possession or in his baggage; (v) a complete list, showing quantities of all stocks of goods enumerated hereunder held by the
 - various messes and in the canteen, signed by the President of each mess or the Canteen Manager, as the case may require :-
 - (1) alcoholic liquors of all kinds, e.g., spirits, beers and wines;
 - (2) perfumes, perfumery and similar goods:
 - (3) tobacco goods of all kinds, e.g., cigarettes, cigars, other manufactured and unmanufactured tobacco; (4) other dutiable articles.
 - (vi) an account of all goods taken on board outside Nigeria, i.e.:
 - - (1) Cargo
 - (2) parcels (3) purchases.
 - (b) Nil Declaration, etc.—'NIL' lists, declarations and accounts are required, as applicable.
- (c) Cargo and Parcels.—Account of cargo and all parcels on board will be treated in accordance with relevant paragraphs in Part II.
- 26. Other Government and Quasi-Government Ships .- Except as exempted, see paragraph 22, the following provisions apply:-
 - (a) Ships operated by Nigerian Ports Authority—
 - (i) A Government ship operated by Nigerian Ports Authority need not report, provided—
 - (1) such a ship is on a scheduled run between ports or places in Nigeria only, e.g., carrying dutypaid and free and local goods and passengers, and/or engaged in buoyage, dredging, lighthouse work, etc.;
 - (2) the master of such a ship holds a General Transire for the ship;
 - (3) such a ship does not carry goods subject to Customs control, e.g., imported goods not cleared of all Customs formalities or goods entered for exportation;
 - (4) such a ship does not touch or call at a foreign port or place.
 - (ii) Where any of the conditions at (a) (i) is not fulfilled, the ship will be boarded by officers of Customs and Excise and be reported by the master, owner or agent in accordance with Part II.
 - (iii) In the case where such a ship is proceeding to a foreign place, the General Transires must be deposited with the proper Collector of Customs and Excise, and if not deposited, will be deemed to be
- without any effect. (b) Ships operated by Government Departments in Inland Waterways .- Government ships operated in inland waterways are not to be used in carrying goods subject to Customs and Excise control and therefore
- may not be boarded unless in cases of suspicion. They need not be reported either. Where however goods and/or passengers subject to Customs or Excise control are carried, the procedure for non-Government ships shall apply.

- 27. Fishing Boats.—(a) A fishing boat based in Nigeria and registered as a fishing boat as required by the Merchant Shipping Act 1962, No. 30 must report, notwithstanding that such a boat may be engaged exclusively in fishing or does not intend to touch or call at a foreign port or place, or does not carry goods subject to Customs control.
 - (b) Such a fishing boat must be boarded by officers of Customs and Excise and be reported accordingly.
- (c) Where a fishing boat clears for the "Deep Sea" but calls at a foreign port during a voyage, the Captain must submit a written report stating the circumstances which made the call necessary, supported by the relevant entry in his log book.
- 28. Specialised Ships, etc.—(a) The provisions of Parts II and III of this Notice shall apply to specialised ships, such as drilling barges, dredgers, floating power-houses or workshops, boat houses or any ship or floating structure equipped and specialised for working within or outside the territorial waters of Nigeria. Where it is not possible to bring the ship to a Customs port, the master or owner of such a ship must make a special arrangement in good time with the nearest Collector of Customs and Excise in charge of the area of operation, for the usual Customs formalities to be effected.
- (b) The ship and other goods, such as equipment and stores carried therein and any subsequent supplies received must be reported, entered, and/or cleared from Customs control as appropriate before use in Nigeria.

PART IV—SHIPS ARRIVING IN NIGERIA BY INLAND WATERWAYS

- 29. Approved Routes and Customs Stations, etc.—(a) See Legal Notice No. 20 of 1967—Importation and Exportation by Land and Inland Waters Regulation 1967 for conditions governing the arrival of ships in Nigeria by inland waterways and approved routes and Customs stations.
- (b) Revenue Safeguard.—The master of such a ship shall facilitate the execution of any means which the proper officer deems it fit to employ in safeguarding revenue, e.g., checking, rummaging, sealing, locking, etc.
- (c) Special Permission to Land and Load Goods.—The master of such a ship may not, whilst in transit in Nigeria, land or load any goods for exportation, except on the written permission of the proper Collector; any goods landed or loaded are to be precisely reported and cleared to the satisfaction of the proper Collector.
- (d) Display of Special Flags and Lights.—A ship proceeding in transit shall during the day fly the flags "Y.A.C." in the International Code of Signals, and at night display two red lights in a conspicuous position, one light above the other with sufficient space between.

PART V-AIRCRAFT

- 30. Place and Time of Report.—(a) The commander or responsible person authorised for the purpose by the owner of any aircraft required to report, shall immediately after the arrival of the aircraft forthwith personally deliver a report in duplicate in such form as the Board may direct, to the proper officer of Customs and Excise at the Custom House at the airport of arrival.
- (b) Where an aircraft has been permitted by the Board to call on arrival in Nigeria at a place other than a Customs airport, report of such aircraft shall be made by the Commander or authorised person forthwith after the arrival of the aircraft at that airport, to the proper officer at that airport.
- 31. Form of Report.—Report of an aircraft and cargo shall be made in the Form Sale 120—General Declaration and be supported by the following documents—
 - (a) If not endorsed on the General Declaration—Form Sale 120—the documents constituting the Clearance Outwards of the aircraft from the airport which it last left;
 - (b). Cargo manifest in the Form Sale 120B in duplicate;
 - (c) Passenger manifest, in duplicate, in the Form Sale 120A, containing the names of all passengers carried in the aircfaft and their places of embarkation and disembarkation;
 - (d) Stores List, in duplicate;
 - (e) If required by the proper officer, the aircraft's Journey Log Book or other document in lieu thereof.
- 32. Aircraft in Distress, etc.—If an aircraft flying to Nigeria is required under or bylyirtue of any enactment relating to air navigation, or is compelled by accident, stress of weather or other unavoidable cause, to land at a place in Nigeria other than a Customs airport, the commander of any such aircraft—
 - (a) shall immediately report the landing to the nearest officer of Customs and Excise or police officer, and on demand produce to him the journey log book or document in lieu thereof belonging to the aircraft;
 - (b) shall not, without the consent of an officer of Customs and Excise or police officer, permit any goods to be unloaded from, or any of the crew or passengers to depart from the vicinity of the aircraft unless unloading or departure is necessary to preserve or to avoid loss of life, aircraft or goods;
 - (c) shall comply with any directions given by an officer of Customs and Excise or police officer in respect of the aircraft or goods.
- 33. Record of Aircraft.—The person controlling an aerodrome shall keep a record of all aircraft arriving at or departing from such aerodrome and shall make such record and any other document relating to the movement of aircraft available to the proper officer for him to make copies or to take extract thereof.

34. Quarantine Restriction.—Where at sanitary airports pratique has not been granted, instructions from the airport Health Authority must be awaited and no further action shall be taken except as directed by the proper Health Officer.

PART VI-VEHICLES

- 35. Place and Time of Entering and Manner of Report.—The approved Customs Stations for vehicles entering Nigeria by land are listed in sub-paragraph 2(a) (iii). The owner of any such vehicle shall forthwith—
 - (a) bring the vehicle from the border to the Customs Station,
 - (b) Stop at the Customs Station and there make report of the vehicle in the Form Sale 89—Vehicle and Small Crafts Inward/Outward Report, to the proper officer of Customs and Excise at that station.

PART VII-IMPORTATION BY LAND (OTHER THAN BY VEHICLE)

- 36. Place and Manner of Report.—Any person entering and/or importing goods by land otherwise than in a vehicle, shall bring them by the most direct route from the border to the Customs station nearest to the point on the border at which the goods were imported, and report the goods orally to the proper officer of Customs and Excise at that Customs Station.
- 37. Additional Requirements.—Such persons shall on request by an officer at the Customs station or any other place, furnish such officer with such information and produce such documents in his possession relating to his journey or to the goods being conveyed by him as that officer may require.

PART VIII—WRECK

- 38. Ships.—(a) The owner or agent of a ship or aircraft or of goods from abroad or goods bound for foreign, being wreck within the territorial waters or borders of Nigeria shall make report of the event to the Receiver of Wreck and to the nearest officer of Customs and Excise or police officer.
- (b) Any person concerned with, or having knowledge of goods brought or coming into Nigeria by sea, air or land not being carried in such ship, aircraft or vehicle as cargo, stores or baggage, shall report such goods to the nearest officer of Customs and Excise or police officer.

PART IX-MISCELLANEOUS

- 39. Ship's Protest.—At customs ports at which a notary public appointed by the Chief Justice of the Federation of Nigeria is not available, Collectors of Customs and Excise are notaries public ex-officio and perform the duties of minuting, noting and extending a ship's protest. Fees are chargeable for the service at rates prescribed under the Notaries Public Act, Cap. 141. Where the attendance is given outside Customs "Indoor" business hours, overtime fees will also be charged at the rates prescribed in Customs and Excise Notice No. 1—Government Notice No. 506 of 1967—"Hours of Attendance by Officers of Customs and Excise and the Fees Payable for Extra Attendance." Masters of ships requiring noting, etc. of a ship's protest should notify the proper Collector at that port in writing well in advance of the intended time for attendance.
- 40. Merchant Shipping Duties.—(a) Duties in connection with Merchants Shipping may be performed by the proper Collector of Customs and Excise at Customs ports where there is no Superintendent of Merchant Shipping under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1962 No. 30, the Custom House at any such port being regarded for those purposes as a Mercantile Marine Sub-Office. Duties in respect of the following may be performed:—
 - (i) matters relating to seamen, e.g. the engagement and/or discharge of a seaman, the depositing of the wages of a seaman or of his goods;
 - (ii) the depositing and the endorsement of the "Agreement between the master and the crew of a Commonwealth Ship".
- (b) Fees.—Shipping fees are chargeable at rates prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1962 No. 30. Where attendance by proper officers of Customs and Excise on these services is given outside Customs "Indoor" business hours, overtime fees will also be charged at the rates prescribed in Customs and Excise Notice No. 1, Government Notice No. 506 of 1967.
- 41. Warning.—Failure to comply with any provision of this notice constitutes an offence punishable under the appropriate section of the Customs and Excise Management Act, No. 55 of 1958.
- 42. Cancellation.—Customs and Excise Notice No. 5 published as Government Notice No. 1659 of 1959 in the Official Gazette No. 50 of 13th August, 1959 is hereby cancelled.
