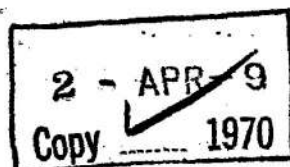

His Excellency the Military Governor of Western State intends to make a number of awards for:

- (iv) £190 for all Agricultural Students in second and subsequent years;
- (v) £190 for all Veterinary Medical students in their second year;
- (vi) £210 for all Veterinary Medical students in their subsequent years;
- (vii) £250 for all Clinical Medical students;
- (viii) £120 for all Technical students in Ibadan and Yaba Technical Colleges.

Costs of all courses overseas remain unchanged but all courses are normally tenable in Nigeria except for those subjects for which facilities are not available locally.

4. (a) *Scholarship examination.*—Candidates for the Post-Secondary awards including special awards for graduate teachers, sub-degree and professional courses will be required to sit to an objective examination. Undergraduates and those already pursuing sub-degree and professional courses in Universities and Higher Institutions, excluding those on Preliminary or Pre-session courses, will not be required to sit to an examination, but will be eligible for consideration of awards on the basis of their performances in their respective Universities.

(b) *Form of examination.*—The examination will consist of two papers each of three hours.

Paper I—English Language—to test the candidates' power of communication and comprehension.

Paper II—General Paper based on questions in the particular subject which the candidate proposes to study.

(c) *Examination centres.*—The examination will take place at the following centres; Ibadan, Lagos, Ife, Zaria, Akure, London and Bonn at a date to be announced later. Candidates who intend to sit to the examination should indicate the centres they like on their application forms.

5. There will be a non-refundable examination fee of ten shillings (10s) each, payable to any Western State Government Sub-Treasury. Candidates should obtain Treasury Receipts which should be forwarded along with the completed scholarship application forms. Those candidates not near a Treasury office should send 10s Postal Orders addressed to the Accountant-General, Western State. Further necessary details of the examination will be communicated to all candidates who have applied to sit to the examination.

(b) (i) *Method of applying for scholarship forms.*—Candidates who want application forms to be sent to them by post from the Ministry of Education, Ibadan should attach stamped, self-addressed envelopes marked 'SCHOLARSHIP GWN 1969' in the left hand corner. Prospective candidates are required to fill only one copy of the application form.

(b) (ii) Application forms which must be accompanied by the Treasury Receipts or Postal Orders for 10s in the case of candidates sitting to the scholarship examination must be returned direct to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education, (Students' Section), Ibadan, Western State through Heads of Departments in the case of Government employees, and in other cases through the Principals or Registrars of their Institutions, or through employers as appropriate, and should reach this Ministry not later than 25th August, 1969.

6. (a) (i) *Academic qualification.*—Applicants for degree courses must possess the General Certificate of Education (Advanced Level) in at least two subjects passed preferably at one sitting and relevant to the course of study proposed by the candidate or two passes at the Principal Level in the Higher School Certificate in related subjects. In addition to the above, applicants must also have credit in English at the West African School Certificate or a pass in English in the General Certificate of Education.

(a) (ii) Applicants for non-graduate and technical courses must possess at least the West African School Certificate, Grade I or Grade II or its equivalent (with credits in English and Science subjects for Technical courses) or the relevant professional qualifications for entry into the proposed courses of study.

(b) In addition to submitting scholarship application forms, candidates are expected to apply for admission direct to Institutions of their choice. This applies in particular to candidates wishing to study subjects available in Nigeria and West African Institutions of higher learning. Applicants for courses tenable overseas are also advised, in their own interest to apply for provisional admission to institutions of their choice. Where they fail, successful candidates will be assisted by the Ministry in securing admission. Candidates should generally acquaint themselves with the conditions of admission to their courses of study. In the case of successful candidates who produce evidence of admission to overseas institutions, the Scholarship Board would confirm such admission through the Nigeria High Commission, London or the appropriate Embassy in the country concerned.

(c) Similarly, in cases of other courses of study which are not available in Nigeria or West Africa, arrangements will be made, at Government discretion, to place successful candidates in overseas institutions.

It is necessary to draw the special attention of candidates who wish to apply from outside West Africa to the fact that they will not be awarded scholarships tenable abroad, if the study or training in their chosen fields can be pursued in Nigerian or West African Institutions. Such candidates are therefore advised to apply promptly for admission to Nigerian or West African Institutions of higher learning.

7. *Post-Graduate*.—Applicants for post-graduate degrees must have obtained first or second class honours in their first degrees, except in such courses where examination results are not graded, e.g., Medicine.
