 - (v) Delivery.—That he can arrange delivery of Palm Oil to the appropriate Bulk Oil Plant and of Palm Kernels on board ocean-going vessels/Board Stores. In the case of Palm Kernels he must

possess the organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the accurate preparation and prompt submission of shipping documents as required and the carrying out of all duties involved in the delivery of Palm Kernels to f.o.b. point.

4.
