WHEREAS by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall consist of the Chief Justice of Lagos State and such number of other Judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee :

One new Higher Teachers' College department has been established in Kandahar in 1968; and another is planned for Mazar-i-Sharif in 1969.
