INVITATION FOR PROPOSALS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PASSENGER CAR ASSEMBLY INDUSTRY IN NICERIA

In Government Notice No. 1042 in the Official Gazette of 9th June, 1966, the Federal Government published an invitation for proposals from motor car manufacturers of established reputation to assemble in Nigeria passenger cars from completely knocked down (CKD) packs to be imported. Well documented proposals were submitted by Six Federal Government expresses its appreciation for the co-operation received from the manufacturers who presented proposals.

2. However, in view of the time that has elapsed since the submission of those proposals and further developments in the Nigeria economy, the Government hereby invites proposals from all interested parties.

Manufacturers who previously submitted proposals may, if they wish, modify their old proposals, or present entirely new ones.

4. The Government considers that a passenger car assembly industry, properly constituted, should be an active stimulus for much related industrial and economic development. The Government desires therefore to have the assembly industry established together as early as possible with other industries for local parts manufacture and for cars distribution, in accordance with the following requirements:

(i) The car assembly industry should be economically viable within the 15 per cent duty concession already provided for in the Customs Tariff and the protection that the Government will give;

(ii) The car assembly industry should justify its establishment and the concessions and protection to be granted by the Government by guaranteeing satisfactory benefits to the economy;

(iii) The overseas manufacturer or manufacturers that will be responsible for the technical and economic performance of the proposed industry should have a sufficient stake in the assembly industry to ensure their continuing concern for its sound economic performance;

(iv) Initially, at least 25 per cent of the equity share holding of each assembly plant should be reserved for indigenous Nigerian participation, and some nominal shares in the enterprise will be required by the Government, in consideration of the concessions, protection and other support to be granted to the industry:

(v) Managerial and Technical personnel in the assembly industry should be predominantly Nigerian and adequate training schemes before and after commencement of operations should be established to ensure this;

- (vi) The car assembly industry should be able to make use of, even at the initial stages, locally manufactured parts up to a reasonable level, and thereafter, more parts of the cars should be incorporated in the assembled cars in accordance with a local contents incorporation programme to be drawn up. Local parts manufacturers shall be assisted to set up and to operate by the overseas manufacturers:
- (vii) The assembly industry should be able to operate uncommitted to any single distribution channel; but the availability of spare parts and adequate servicing facilities should be guaranteed;
- (viii) The prices of the local assembled cars should not be unreasonably higher than the prevailing international market prices for comparable cars, and the qualities should be of the same standard as those of comparable imported cars. As a control measure an agreed proportion of the Nigerian car market will be met by imported built-up cars for as long as the Government considers it necessary.
- 5. In support of the passenger car assembly and of related local parts manufacture industries, the Federal Government will provide the following concessions, protection, and other support as may from time to time be required:
  - (t) a 15 percentage points duty relief on such components of cars to be imported for local assembly from overseas manufacturers, which components are not included in the programme for local manufactures incorporation;
  - (ii) duty reliefs on the raw materials that will need be imported for the local manufacture of parts, where the provision in the Tariff may not be satisfactory;
  - (iii) an import restriction on the imported built-up cars equivalent to, or substitutable for, those being locally assembled; subject to the stipulation in paragraph 4 above and to the extent that will not cause undue scarcity of passenger cars in the country;
  - (iv) the establishment of a Technical Standing Committee with necessary powers to liaise with the assembly industry and initiate and supervise policies and programmes for local manufactures incorporation, concessions, and protection required by the car assembly and local parts manufacture industries, and other relevant matters including pricing of local products.
- 6. Passenger car manufacturers who are interested in establishing an assembly plant in Nigeria for their particular makes of cars and in assisting in the development of a local parts manufacture industry in the manner described above, and who are:
  - (i) experienced in the manufacture of passenger cars including the assembly, the manufacturing and the procuring of parts;
  - (ii) experienced in managerial and technical training of personnel of car assembly and parts manufacture industries, and willing to train Nigerians even for the initial operations of the assembly and allied industries;

- (iii) capable of training personnel for independent car distribution organisations;
- (iv) experienced in the supply of spare parts and servicing facilities,

are hereby invited to present detailed proposals to the Federal Government.

- 7. The detailed proposals, which should be based on the requirements as at paragraph 4 (i) to (viii) above should include details of:
  - (i) the makes and models of cars proposed for assembly, the proposed assembly operations, investments involved, plant capacities based on the most economic conditions, production costs, personnel requirements—Expatriate and Nigerian, and such other details that will enable the viability of the project, the expected net foreign exchange savings and other national benefits, to be readily evaluated;
  - (ii) the CKD parts of the cars proposed to be assembled, and the values of the essential individual parts;
  - (iii) programmes of possible expansions, and estimates of additional investments;
  - (iv) the parts of the cars that could be procured, or arranged to be manufactured, locally at the initial stages of assembly operation, and a realistic programme of local manufactures incorporation;
  - (v) the contractural obligations that will exist between the overseas manufacturers or the suppliers of parts or materials, and the Nigerian car assembly plant, such as royalties, technicals fees, and managements fees;
  - (vi) any additional Government concessions or assistance required for the rapid orderly development of the assembly and the allied industries.
- 8. It is appreciated that interested manufacturers will need time to study the various aspects of the project and to work out the required details for their proposals, especially on the question of local parts manufacture which is vital to the acceptance of any of the proposals. Accordingly, the detailed proposals should be submitted in six copies to the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Industries, Lagos, not later than 15th February, 1970. However, the manufacturers desiring to submit detailed proposals in accordance with the requirements and provisions above should, in the first instance, give indications of their intention in a letter, addressed to the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Industries, P.M.B. 12614, Lagos, Nigeria, to reach him not later than 15th November, 1969. The letter should include evidence of the proposer's capacity and status as indicated in paragraph 6 (i) to (iv) above.

#### Provision of Telecommunications Services

#### TELEPHONE EXCHANGE LINES, PRIVATE WIRES AND TELEX EXCHANGE LINES

The following conditions of installations of telephone exchange lines, private wires (both telephone and telegraph) and telex exchange lines, which shall have effect as from 1st January, 1970, are published for general information. This Notice cancels Government Notice No. 1760 of 2nd November, 1967.

These conditions shall apply throughout the Posts and Telecommunications Territories in the Federation, beginning with the Lagos Territory, and without prejudice to the present system of quarterly billing in the other areas where monthly billing will be introduced later progressively.

#### I-DEFINITIONS

In these conditions, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, respectively, that is—

- (a) "rental" includes rental for extension lines, additional apparatus or additional mileages;
- (b) "date of despatch" means the date stamped on the account as the date of its issuance by the Posts and Telecommunications Department;
- (c) "certified" means certified over a signature of an officer of the Department of Posts and Telecommunications and such certificate shall be conclusive evidence of the matters certified without proof of the signature and appointment of such officer;
- (d) "subscriber's premises" means and includes any premises where the telephone exchange line, private wire or telex exchange line is installed;
- (e) "telephone exchange line", "private wire" and "telex exchange line" mean and include the lines, extension lines, and apparatus installed in the subscriber's premises;
- (f) "circuit" means and includes both telephone exchange lines, private wires and telex exchange lines;
- (g) "Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications" means the officer appointed as Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications of Nigeria or appointed to act in that capacity;
- (h) "effective call" means—
  - (i) For Telephones:—A call which places the person in attendance at the originating subscriber's telephone in a position to converse with some person attending at the telephone of the distant subscriber.
  - (ii) For Telex:—A call which places the person in attendance at the originating telex subscriber's teleprinter in a position to communicate with some person attending at the teleprinter of the distant telex subscriber or in a position to record a communication on the teleprinter of the distant telex subscriber if that machine is temporarily unattended.

#### II-CONDITIONS

- 1. The Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications undertakes to instal the circuits and maintain them in good order. Repairs will be effected with all possible despatch, but the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications shall not be held liable in damages or otherwise for any delay in such repair or for any loss or damage, occasioned by the total or partial interruption of the circuits, nor will any abatement be made on the rental unless the circuit in working order shall have been totally interrupted for a continuous period of at least fourteen (14) days unless notification to the contrary made by or on behalf of the subscriber is accepted by the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications.
- 2. The Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications while reserving to himself the right to require any intending subscriber to enter into an agreement to hire a circuit for a period not exceeding five years, will normally be prepared to instal a circuit upon the subscriber paying in advance the first three months' rental, and any other charges that may, from time to time, be decided upon, and in the case of private wires and telex exchange lines only, upon the subscriber entering into an agreement to hire a circuit for a minimum period of three months. The Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications will then continue the service subject to the following conditions:—
  - (a) Rentals: After the lapse of the period for which the initial rental has been paid rentals are payable monthly in advance;
  - monthly in advance;

    (b) Fees and Charges: The renter of a telephone or telex exchange line will be required to pay on demand all fees and charges on account of calls passed over the circuit, and the subscriber is not relieved of
  - (c) Payment: All rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred shall be paid within fourteen (14) days of the date of despatch of the subscriber's account;

the responsibility for payment of any unauthorised calls originated on his circuit;

- (d) Delay in Payment:
  - (i) If the rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred be paid between fifteen (15) and twenty-one (21) days from the date of despatch of the account, together with a penalty of one pound (£1) on an account up to five pounds (£5) and two pounds (£2) on an account of over

five pounds (£5), the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications may not disconnect the circuit and such other circuits as may have been provided;

- (ii) If the rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred be paid between twenty-two (22) and thirty-five (35) days from the date of despatch of the account, together with a penalty of one pound (£1) on an account up to five pounds (£5) and two pounds (£2) on an account of over five pounds (£5), the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications may reconnect the circuit and such other circuits as may have been provided, and a reconnection fee prescribed will be raised in the subscriber's subsequent account:
- (iii) If the rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred be not paid at the close of business on the 35th day from the date of despatch of the account, the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications may remove from the subscriber's premises without further notice the circuit and such other circuits as may have been provided. The subscriber will not be liable for rental after this removal has taken place, and any agreement thereof entered into with the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications will be deemed to have been terminated:
- (iv) The reconnection fee prescribed may not be accepted by the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications after thirty-five (35) days from the date of despatch of the account. If the subscriber pays all outstanding rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred, and requires service to be provided again, three months' rental in advance shall be payable plus installation charges. In the case of private wires and telex exchange lines a fresh agreement with the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications shall be concluded on the application of the subscriber for fresh installation.
- 3. Provision of Service by Capital Contribution :
  - (a) The Department of Posts and Telecommunications reserves the right to call on any applicant for telecommunications service to make capital contribution towards the provision of any service considered to be uneconomic. In such case the prospective subscriber shall be required to contribute the total capital cost of providing service from the nearest serviceable point;
  - (b) Where a subscriber has contributed towards the provision of any telecommunications service under the Department's Capital Contribution Scheme, the Department of Posts and Telecommunications shall waive the installation charges on the circuit;
  - (c) Notwithstanding any capital contribution made by a subscriber for the provision of telecommunications service, the whole of the circuit shall remain the property of the Department of Posts and Telecommunications.
- 4. Certified Accounts.—Any notice of certified accounts which may be given or rendered by the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications shall be deemed duly given or rendered if left at the subscriber's premises or placed in his private letter box, or sent by registered post to his usual or last known place of address.
- 5. Cessation of Hiring.—A subscriber is required to give at least three months' notice in writing of his intention to discontinue the hiring of the circuit, or to pay three months' rental in lieu of notice. In no circumstances will any part of the first three months' rental be refunded. If a subscriber required temporary disconnection of the circuit, the procedure will be as for cessation and new installation, three months' rental in advance being required for the latter.
- 6. Alterations and Removals.—A subscriber may, upon giving adequate notice, have his circuit altered or removed to other premises where possible upon payment on demand of the certified expenses of such alterations or removal, and upon the undertaking that, should such alteration or removal increase the rental in accordance with the scales prescribed in the rental schedules, the subscriber shall be liable for the payment of such increased rentals as from the date the alteration or removal is effected.
- 7. Responsibility for Damage.—The subscriber shall pay on demand the certified amount of the damage to any part of the circuit on the subscriber's premises which may be destroyed or damaged by fire, water, burglary, accidents, riot or civil commotion or by reason of any lack of proper care on the part of the subscriber. The Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications may disconnect the circuit and remove it from the subscriber's premises if he allows the circuit to be wilfully damaged or destroyed or put to any illegal or improper use.
- 8. Care of the Circuit.—The subscriber shall take proper care of the circuit, and shall not make any alteration to it without the authority of the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications, who may disconnect the circuit and remove it from the subscriber's premises if the connections of the circuit have been tampered with or altered without authority.
- 9. Access to Premises.—The subscriber shall grant to the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications and officers of the Department of Posts and Telecommunications every facility in his power for the construction, maintenance and examination of the circuit, and shall permit the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications and his officials at all reasonable times to have free access to the subscriber's premises for these purposes.
- 10. Vacation of Premises.—If the subscriber vacates the premises in which the circuit is fitted, the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications shall be at liberty to recover and hold the same for safe custody or remove the circuit or rent the same to another person without in any way affecting the subscriber's liabilities incurred up to the time of such removal or custody.

- 11. Extent of Use.—The subscriber shall be deemed to consent to the following restrictions in the use of the circuit:—
  - (a) If the number of ineffective calls to any telephone exchange line or telex exchange line amounts to twenty-five per cent of the total number of calls to that line, the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications may require the subscriber to rent an additional telephone exchange line or telex exchange line as the case may be and may terminate, after due notice, the agreement of any telephone or telex subscriber who refuses to comply with such requirements;
  - (b) The subscriber shall not, except with the prior written consent of the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications, transfer, assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any circuit, or part of a circuit, hired to him by the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications or any right or interest in connection therewith, and upon any breach of this condition the Director-General of Posts and Telecommunications may enter the premises, disconnect the circuit and may remove it and such other circuits as may have been provided, and the subscriber shall be liable for the expenses incurred in so doing.
- 12. Change in Rates and Conditions.—Three calendar months' notice will be given in the Federation of Nigeria Official Gazette of any change in these conditions.

# PRIVATE STUDENTS GOING ABROAD FOR FURTHER STUDIES

This is to inform the general public particularly persons wishing to proceed overseas for further studies as private students that various Students' Advisory Committees exist in the country for the purpose of advising them. The duties of the Federal Students' Advisory Committee is to ensure that a private student wishing to go abroad for further studies is fully equipped educationally and financially to undertake such a venture. He will be required to satisfy the Committee on the following:—

- (a) that he has the basic educational qualifications to undertake the proposed course he wishes to study;
- (b) that he possesses or can produce guarantors whose financial resources will be able to see him through his studies and pay for his return passage to Nigeria;
- (c) that his personal character and records are satisfactory;
- (d) that he is able to deposit (refundable at the completion of his course) £150 against possible repatriation.

When the Advisory Committee is satisfied that the person has satisfied the above requirements he will be given a letter of recommendation according him the status of a sponsored student.

- 2. A private student who is recommended to study abroad by any of the Students' Advisory Committees has many advantages:
  - (a) He is recommended to the Passport Office to be issued with a passport or a travelling certificate.
  - (b) He is given a letter to the accredited representative in Nigeria of the country in which he proposes to study to issue him with a visa or entry permit.

- (c) He is issued with a students' rebate certificate to the Nigerian Airways which will grant him a reduced passage fare.
- (d) He is given a letter to the Central Bank so that money can be transferred for the purpose of maintaining him while he is on a full time study.
- (e) If he has not yet secured admission to a school, the Students' Advisory Committee (in the case of the Federal) will assist him to obtain a reputable institution.
- (f) Our Mission in the country, if he is already there, in which he is studying will assist him in any way it can if he approaches it for advice.
- (g) An overseas institution may refuse to admit a person who has not been sponsored by the Students' Advisory Committee.
- 3. A person who is not accorded the status of a recommended student may be faced with considerable embarrassment. Experience has shown that many students manage to obtain their passports and then go straight to the Embassy of the country in which they intend to do their studies only to be told at the last minute that they must go to the Students' Advisory Committee of the Ministry of Education for a letter of recommendation. This has always led to frustration and disappointment.
- 4. All prospective private students wishing to go abroad for further studies are advised in their own interest to apply to the Students' Advisory Committee nearest to their places of residence for sponsorship as private students. Students are assured that the purpose of the Advisory Committee is to help them with arrangements both locally and abroad and to minimise their difficulties and NOT, as some seem to think, to put obstacles in their way.
