Background information.—The UN Development Programme in co-operation with the Government of Lebanon established a project in 1962 to develop a modern laboratory at Beirut, for diagnosis and control of poultry diseases, especially those prevalent in large commercial flocks. Sections were established for work on virology, parasitology, bacteriology, pathology and histopathology, nutritional chemistry and immunochemistry, diagnosis and vaccine production. This laboratory is a part of the complex known as the Near East Animal Health Institute (NEAHI) which has other centers in Iran, Iraq, Cyprus, Jordan and the United Arab Republic.

The project has now entered its second Phase with the purpose of completing the establishment of the poultry diseases laboratory and the development of its activities; including continuation and intensification of the work on viral, bacterial, parasitic and nutritional diseases of birds. Particular emphasis is being placed on immunological studies of salmonellosis, coccidiosis, mycoplasma infections, Newcastle disease and leucosis.

Duties.—Under the general supervision of the Project Manager the Senior Laboratory Technician will be required:

THE PHARMACISTS ACT 1964

STANDING ORDERS OF THE PHARMACISTS BOARD
OF NIGERIA

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the First Schedule of the Pharmacists Act 1964, the Pharmacists Board of Nigeria hereby makes the following standing orders :—

- Short title.** 1. These standing orders may be cited as the Pharmacists Board of Nigeria Standing Order, 19.....
- Interpretation.** 2. In these standing orders, unless the context otherwise requires—
 “the Act” means the Pharmacists Act 1964 ;
 “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Pharmacists Board ;
 “Committee” means a Committee appointed under section 8 (1) of the First Schedule of the Act ;
 “Members” means members of the Pharmacists Board of Nigeria ;
 “Meeting” means the ordinary or special meeting of the Pharmacists Board ;
 “Registrar” means the Registrar of the Pharmacists Board of Nigeria ;
 “Pharmaceutical Society” means the Pharmaceutical Society of Nigeria with its headquarters in Lagos.
- Ordinary Meeting.** 3. (a) The Board shall meet in January, April, July, October in each year, the actual date being determined by the Chairman.
 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of the foregoing sub-paragraph, the Chairman may, if there is business requiring an urgent attention of the Board, convene a meeting of the Board at any other time, or in accordance with the requirements of paragraph 7 (1) of the First Schedule of the Act.
- Special Meeting.** 4. A meeting convened at the request of at least 5 members under the provision of subsection (1) of section 7 of the First Schedule of the Act shall be known as a Special Meeting.
- Place of Meeting.** 5. Meetings of the Board shall be held at such place as shall be determined by the Chairman.
- Notice of Meeting.** 6. (a) A notice in writing of every meeting specifying the date, place and time of the meeting, shall be delivered or sent by post to each member in reasonable time and not less than one calendar month before date of the meeting in the case of the General Meeting of Board, to enable the members to attend.
 It shall be the duty of the Registrar when sending out notice of a meeting to give notice and where necessary to attach relevant documents on the matters to be discussed.
 (b) The notice of a meeting shall announce the agenda or business to be transacted thereat and no other business shall be transacted unless the meeting resolves to transact it.
- Absence of Registrar.** 7. In the absence of the Registrar at any meeting of the Board, the Chairman may appoint a suitable person who must be a pharmacist to act as Secretary for that particular meeting.
- Admission to Meeting.** 8. Except upon the invitation of the Chairman, no person other than a member of the Board or of a Committee or of the Board staff in attendance on duty shall be present at any meeting of the Board or such Committee.
- Business proposed by member.** 9. (a) Any member desiring an item of business to be considered at a meeting shall send to the Registrar, in time to allow him to comply with paragraph 6 (a) above, a written notice stating the nature of that business.
 (b) It shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in his absence the Acting Chairman, to decide whether an item of business submitted for consideration under the last foregoing sub-paragraph is within the power and competence of the Board as prescribed by the Act to consider and decide upon before the same shall be placed among the business for a meeting.
- Absence of Quorum.** 10. If no quorum is formed within an hour after the time appointed for a meeting, the meeting, if an ordinary meeting, shall be adjourned by the members present to a later time or *sine die*, or if a special meeting, shall stand adjourned *sine die*.
- Attendance Book.** 11. The Registrar shall keep an Attendance Book which shall be signed by the members attending the meeting.
- Order of Business.** 12.—(1) Unless the meeting resolves otherwise, the order of business at any meeting shall be as follows :—
 (a) election, when necessary, of a member present to sit as Chairman for the purpose of the meeting ;

(b) confirmation and signing by the Chairman of the minutes of the meeting last proceeding ;

(c) business arising out of the minutes of the last meeting unless such business has been separately included in the business announced ;

(d) business announced with the notice of the meeting in the order shown in the notice unless that order is changed with the approval of the Chairman, and

(e) other business not announced if the meeting agrees to discuss such business.

(2) The order of business referred to in sub-paragraph 1 (d) of this paragraph shall be determined by the Registrar with the approval of the Chairman.

13.—(a) Members shall address the Chairman and if more than one member wish to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide who shall have priority. Any member shall have the right at any time to take the Chairman's decision on a point of order and the Chairman's decision on a point of order shall be final.

Order of
Address.

(b) No member shall dispute the Chairman's authority or ruling.

14.—(a) All motions shall be proposed and seconded.

Motion and
amendments.

(b) The Chairman may require any motion or amendment there to be in writing.

15. Voting shall be by show of hands, or secret ballot as the Chairman may direct. If the voting be equal and the Chairman does not exercise his casting vote, he shall declare the motion not carried.

Voting.

16. Minutes of the meetings shall be kept in a Record Book in safe custody by the Registrar and shall be open to the inspection of any member of the Board.

Minutes.

17. Committee appointed under section 8 (1) of the First Schedule of the Act may be either appointed for a limited and specific purpose with instructions to report to the Board on completion of their work or they may be Standing Committee with a continuing responsibility under the Board on certain defined subjects and functions.

Committee.

The following Committees among others shall be formed by the Board :—

(1) Drug Safety and Efficacy Committee

(2) Education Committee

(3) Examination Committee

(4) Legal and Finance Committee

(5) Disciplinary Committee

(6) Ethical Committee.

18.—(a) In appointing Committee, the Board shall, except for good reason, name the Chairman and the Secretary of the Committees and shall give precise directions as to the powers and duties of the particular Committee appointed.

Direction to
Committee.

(b) The standing orders relating to the Board shall be applicable to these Committees except that :—

(i) the notice for such meetings shall be given by the Secretary to reach each member in reasonable time before the date of the meeting ;

(ii) the quorum shall be decided by the Board at the time of the appointment of Committee ;

(iii) the minutes of each meeting of a standing committee shall be approved at the subsequent meeting of the committee and submitted by the Registrar to the next meeting of the Board : and

(iv) the membership of all Standing Committees shall be subject to review by the Board every two years.

19.—(a) The common seal of the Council shall be kept in some safe place and secured by two different locks, the keys to which shall be respectively in the keeping of the Registrar/Secretary or a pharmacist appointed for the time being in an acting capacity.

Common Seal.

(b) The common seal of the Board shall be affixed to documents when necessary by the Registrar. The Chairman, President of the Pharmaceutical Society and another member of the Board authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall affix their signatures as evidence thereof.

20. Any contract or instrument (including a bill of exchange, cheque, etc.), which, if entered into or executed by a person not being a body corporate, would not by law be under seal, may in like manner be entered into or executed on behalf of the Board by the Chairman, the Registrar or any member authorised in that behalf by the Board.
