THE CONSTITUTION OF MID-WESTERN NIGERIA

As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966



By His Excellency Major-General YAKUBU Gowon, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

MAJOR-GENERAL Y. GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

Whereas by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of Mid-Western State of Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of the State shall be the Chief Justice of the High Court of the State and such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 1 (a) of the Judicial Office (Special Provisions) Decree 1969 the previous holder of the office of Chief Justice of the High Court of the State is declared to have vacated his office with effect from 12th October 1967:

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (1) of the Constitution of Mid-Western Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of the State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee do hereby appoint Mason Amatotsero Begho the Chief Justice of the High Court of Mid-Western Nigeria with effect from 12th October 1967.

- (b) Each application must be signed by the applicant himself or by his duly authorised representative. A duly authorised representative must be in possession of a valid power of attorney, a copy of which should be deposited with the Chief Petroleum Engineer.
- (c) In addition to the requirements of the regulations, each applicant must forward—
 - (i) evidence of his nationality, or of the nationality of the company and of the control thereof, and usual place of residence;

- (ii) a statement of the financial interest of each director in the company;
- (iii) a statement that he accepts the minimum terms and conditions in paragraph 5 below;
- (iv) a statement of the further financial and other incentives (see paragraph 6 below) which he is prepared to offer to Government over and above the requirements of the Petroleum Decree and Regulations, the Petroleum Profits Tax Act and the minimum terms enumerated at paragraph 5.
- 5. Minimum terms and conditions.—Licences will be granted subject to the provisions of the Petroleum Decree, the Petroleum (Drilling and Production) Regulations, and the following special conditions:
 - (a) Premium.—A premium of £N500,000 is payable within 30 days of notification of grant on each block, except for blocks 72, 92 and 96 on which the premium is £N300,000 per block, and block 89 on which the premium is £N50,000.
 - (b) Duration of licence.—Five years.
 - (c) Government participation.—The Federal Government, by itself or through any of its designated agencies, will have an option to participate up to an agreed percentage in each licence and the lease(s) derived therefrom. Applicants should state on their applications the type and degree of participation they are willing to offer to the Government.
 - (d) Crude Purchase.—Government reserves the right to purchase up to 12½ per cent of crude oil production, or its total requirements for internal consumption, whichever is higher, at well head value, less agreed discounts.
 - (e) Natural Gas.—Government reserves the right to obtain free of charge all natural gas produced with crude oil, if such gas is not used or sold by the producer. 'Unassociated' gas may not be produced without the permission in writing of the Commissioner.
 - (f) Support for Educational Programmes.—The applicant must be willing to give direct financial and other support for courses in petroleum technology and related studies at the University of Ibadan. Details of the support offered should be stated.
- 6. Additional benefits.—Applicants may offer to the Commissioner additional advantageous benefits, including but not limited to the following:—

 - (ii) increased voluntary relinquishments
 - (iii) increased financial benefits
