FEASIBILITY STUDIES FOR A REALIGNED TRUNK ROUTE A1 FROM IBADAN TO DAURA AND FOR RIVER CROSSINGS AT NUMAN ON TRUNK ROAD A17 AND JIMETA NEAR YOLA ON TRUNK ROAD A4

It is notified for general information that it is proposed to retain the services of suitable Consultants to undertake the following engineering studies:—

(i) a feasibility study, including preliminary engineering, of an improved road connexion between Ibadan and Daura near the border of the Republic of Niger including a crossing of the River Niger. This study will include comparisons of the advantages of a new route in whole

or in part over the advantages of a route following closely the existing Trunk Road A1 between Ibadan and Daura.

(ii) a preliminary study of the improvement of the crossings of the Benue River at Numan on Trunk Road A17 and at Jimeta (near Yola) on Trunk Road A4. This study will include a comparison of the advantages of eliminating the crossing at Numan and constructing a new road link from Numan to Jimeta on the north side of the Benue River.

2. These projects are being sponsored by the World Bank and foreign consultants experienced in this field and already established in Nigeria as well as indigenous consultants are eligible for consideration. Foreign consultants who are not already established in Nigeria are also eligible but all non-indigenous consultants must be from member countries of the World Bank or Switzerland.

3. The proposals submitted by the Consulting Engineers will be examined with a view to engaging the services of a Consulting Engineer to carry out each study separately. The engagements will be made on the basis of the proposals regarded as most satisfactory in respect of the programme, the studies to be carried out, the qualifications and experience of the staff and the estimated fees.

4. It is intended that Agreements should be signed with the successful Consulting Engineers not later than 1st May, 1970, and that the studies should be completed and submitted 18 months later on 31st October, 1971. If this time for the studies is considered inadequate, Consulting Engineers should indicate the time they consider necessary for the satisfactory completion of the studies.

5. Those who wish to submit their proposals on the above projects are requested to do so as early as possible but not later than 28th February, 1970. All correspondence, in this connection, should be addressed to the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Works and Housing, Headquarters, Lagos, and marked for the attention of the Director of Federal Public Works.

DISTRICT OFFICES OF THE FEDERAL BOARD OF INLAND REVENUE

It is notified for general information that an office of the Federal Board of Inland Revenue is being opened in Kaduna with effect from 2nd February, 1970, and will be headed by a Senior Inspector of Taxes, whose address is Federal Inland Revenue Office, Yakubu Gowon Way, Kaduna, North-Central State. The Kaduna office will henceforth be responsible for the tax affairs of companies with registered offices in the North-Central State, North-Western State and Benue-Plateau State. Those companies should render their tax returns, et cetera, to the Kaduna office henceforth and NOT to Kano office as before.

2. The Federal Inland Revenue office at Kano, now under the care of an Investigating Officer, will continue to handle the cases of companies with registered offices in Kano State and North-Eastern State. The address of the Kano office remains "Federal Inland Revenue Office, Private Mail Bag 3050, Bompai Road, Kano, Kano State".

3. With effect also from 2nd February, 1970, the Senior Inspector of Taxes, Federal Inland Revenue Office, Private Mail Bag 5050, Bank Road, Ibadan, Western State, will, in addition to the tax affairs of all limited companies with registered offices in the Western State and the Mid-Western State which he had hitherto been dealing with, take over the taxation of all companies with registered offices in Kwara State. Companies with registered offices in Kwara State should henceforth, like those with registered offices in the other two States, render their returns to the Senior Inspector of Taxes, Ibadan.

4. The district offices of the Board in Lagos Island and Yaba respectively will share the remaining cases as follows:—

(a) The Chief Inspector of Taxes, Federal Inland Revenue Office, P.M.B. 12531, Yakubu Gowon Street, Lagos Island, Lagos.

(b) The Chief Inspector of Taxes, Federal Inland Revenue Office, P.M.B. 2002, 223 Herbert Macaulay Street, YABA, Lagos.

Companies whose registered offices are in Lagos Island, Ikoyi Island, Victoria Island (including Maroko Village) and Apapa (excluding Iganmu and Ijora industrial area)—all in the Lagos Division of the Lagos State

(i) companies with registered offices in Ikeja, Badagry, Ikorodu, and Epe Divisions of the Lagos State and other parts of Lagos Division of the Lagos State not already mentioned elsewhere; and

3. *Background.*—The Government of Kenya is implementing a programme of expansion and improvement of its educational facilities to train the technical manpower required to meet the needs of its economic and social development plan. It has established the University College at Nairobi in which the Faculty of Engineering trains civil, mechanical and electrical engineering graduates and land surveyors. It has also established the Kenya Polytechnic, Nairobi, for the training of sub-professional engineers, technicians and other personnel. It is expanding its facilities for craft and pre-technician courses in the secondary trade and technical schools.
