- (b) assist in the training of owners, managers and foremen of commercial poultry enterprises;
- (c) investigate the means of reducing the effects of heat stress on poultry.

Duties.—Under the broad supervision of the Project Manager, the incumbent will:

- (a) participate in the education and training programme in the field of poultry breeding, random sample tests incubation and harchery management;
- (b) co-operate with the other experts on the question of reducing heat stress through appropriate management of the breeding stock;
