Whereas by section 4 (1) of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 and as amended in respect of Benue-Plateau State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State and in respect of North-Eastern State by section 3 of the Sharia Court of Appeal Law (Amendment) Edict 1970 of that State it is provided that the Sharia Court of Appeal shall consist of a Grand Kadi and not less than two other Judges learned in the Sharia:

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (1) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that the Grand Kadi and other Judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Abubakar Mahmoud as Deputy Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal of Benue-Plateau State and of the North-Eastern State with effect from 1st April 1970.

AND WHEREAS by section 54 (1) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967, it is provided that the Grand Kadi and other Judges of the Sharia Court of Appeal shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Jubir Daura as Deputy Grand Kadi of the Sharia Court of Appeal of Kwara State and of North-Central State with effect from 15th June 1970.

Whereas by the resignation of Alhaji Yahaya Gusau as a member of the Federal Executive Council and a Federal Commissioner for Economic Development and Reconstruction, and Agriculture and Natural Resources there now exists a vacancy in the membership of that Council:

Whereas by section 7 of the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 the executive authority of the Federation vests in the Head of the Federal Military Government and may be exercised by him directly or through persons or authorities subordinate to him:

Now THEREFORE it is hereby notified for the information of the general public that by virtue of the said Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf the Head of the Federal Military Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces has for the time being assumed such responsibilities as appertain to the office of the said Federal Commissioner, being responsibilities for matters or group of matters specified in column 2 of the First Schedule to Government Notice No. 992 of 1967, with effect from 2nd July 1970, and the functions and duties of the office become exercisable accordingly by him from that date until further notice.
