WHEREAS Alhaji Jinadu Alatishe, having been duly convicted of the offence of receiving stolen property and sentenced to a fine of £200 or imprisonment for twelve months :

AND WHEREAS the said Alhaji Jinadu Alatishe having duly paid the fine imposed on him in 1945 :

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Military Council, after reviewing his case, is pleased to grant him a free pardon :

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 101 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Supreme Military Council do hereby grant the aforesaid Alhaji Jinadu Alatishe a free pardon.

WHEREAS Allen Ola Iwatomo, having been duly convicted of murder and sentenced to death :

AND WHEREAS the said Allen Ola Iwatomo's death sentence was commuted to life imprisonment in 1955 :

AND WHEREAS the said Allen Ola Iwatomo having served a portion of the said sentence commuted to life imprisonment :

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Military Council, after reviewing his case, is pleased to remit the sentence :

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 101 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Supreme Military Council do hereby remit the unexpired portion of the sentence as commuted imposed on the aforesaid Allen Ola Iwatomo.
