Applications are invited from suitably qualified Nigerians for appointment as Executive Officers (External Affairs) in the Ministry of External Affairs.

*Salary scale.*—C(E) 2, 3, 4—£648-1,116.

*Qualifications.*—The normal minimum educational requirement is a third class honours degree, or a pass degree but applications will also be considered from candidates who do not hold either of these qualifications but have had considerable experience either in the public service or any professional or commercial life. Knowledge of foreign languages particularly French or Arabic will be an asset. Candidates must be not less than 21 nor more than 40 years of age.
