# THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FORMER NORTHERN NIGERIA

As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967



By His Excellency Major-General Yakubu Gowon, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

MAJOR-GENERAL Y. GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

WHEREAS by section 50 (2) of the Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 and the Constitution (Northern States) (Amendment) Decree 1969 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of each of the States created out of the former Northern Nigeria shall be the Chief Justice and such number of other Judges (not being less than two) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 51 (6) of the said Constitution of the former Northern Nigeria modified as aforesaid it is provided that if the office of any Judge of the High Court other than the Chief Justice is vacant or if the person holding the office is acting as Chief Justice or is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, may appoint a person with such qualifications as may be prescribed by law to act in the office of a Judge of the High Court:

Now THEREFORE, THE SUPREME MILITARY COUNCIL, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint MR JUSTICE ARTHUR WILLIAM EDGE WHEELER to act as a Senior Puisne Judge of the High Court of Kano State and of the High Court of North-Western State with effect from 19th April 1971.

#### THE CONSTITUTION OF MID-WESTERN STATE

As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967

MAJOR-GENERAL Y. GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces

WHEREAS by section 48 (2) of the Constitution of Mid-Western State as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Mid-Western State shall be the Chief Justice of the State and any such number of other Judges (not being less than six) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 49 (1) of the Constitution of Mid-Western State modified as aforesaid it is provided that the Chief Justice and other Judges of the High Court of the State shall be appointed by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Majemite Akporove Aghoghovbia a Judge of the High Court of Mid-Western State with effect from 24th February 1971.

SPECIAL FUND PROJECT "HYDROMETEOROLOGICAL SURVEY OF THE CATCHMENTS OF LAKES VICTORIA, KYOGA AND ALBERT"

The objectives of the project are to assist the governments in the collection and analysis of hydrometeorological data on the catchments of Lakes Victoria, Kyoga and Albert in order to study the water balance of the Upper-Nile, as a basis for planning water conservation and development, and laying the basis for inter-governmental co-operation in the regulation of the Nile. The participating governments are: Kenya, Sudan, Uganda, the United Arab Republic and the United Republic of Tanzania.

The project will undertake the following specific tasks:

(a) the establishment of additional data collecting stations (hydrometeorological, rainfall and hydrological stations to record lake levels) and the upgrading of some of the existing stations, in

order to complete an adequate network from which basic hydrometeorological data can be collected and analysed:

- (b) the establishment of seven small indexcatchments for intensive studies of rainfall-runoff relationships for application to other parts of the catchment area:
- (c) serial and topographical surveys and mapping including a hydrographical survey of Lake Kyoga:
- (d) to devise and propose analytical procedures for the various parameters involved in the water balance of the lakes using the data collected from the new and existing stations, and from the index-catchments; and
- (e) the training of staff of the participating governments in hydrometeorological work.

The Special Fund will contribute to the project, over a period of five years, the services of experts and consultants totalling thirty-nine man-years in hydrometeorology and related fields. Fifteen man-years of fellowships will be awarded to counterpart personnel. In addition, the Special Fund will provide meteorological and hydrological instruments and accessories, laboratory equipment, communication, camping and special office equipment, and vehicles for land and water transport. The surveys and mapping will be conducted under sub-contracts. A Project Manager and some international experts have already joined the project and operations have been started.
