TO MY TRUSTY AND WELL-BELOVED COLONEL CHRISTOPHER OLUWOLE ROTIMI, GREETINGS

I, Major-General YAKUBU GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, Federal Republic of Nigeria, do hereby appoint you the said COLONEL CHRISTOPHER OLUWOLB ROTIMI as the Military Governor of Western State, with effect from the 2nd day of April, 1971.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION

As Modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967

Whereas by section 122 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos State shall consist of the Chief Justice of Lagos State and such number of Judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by law:

AND WHEREAS by section 123 (3) of the Constitution of the Federation as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966 and the States (Creation and Transitional Provisions) Decree 1967 it is provided that if the office of Chief Justice of the State is vacant or if the person holding the office is for any reason unable to perform the functions of his office, those functions shall be performed by such one of the other Judges of the High Court of the State as may be designated in that behalf by the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee:

Now therefore, the Supreme Military Council, acting after consultation with the Advisory Judicial Committee, do hereby appoint Mr Justice Sigismund Olanrewaju Lambo to act as Chief Justice of the High Court of Lagos State with effect from 20th February, 1971.
