duplicate copies will be submitted to the Customs officials who shall confirm the tonnage and the value of the goods covered by the forms. The original and duplicate will be retained by the Customs officials who will later forward them to the Central Bank, who will submit the duplicate to the commercial bank named on the form.

(b) As from 1st July, 1971, shipping companies will no longer deliver bills of lading relative to commercial exports to shippers but will forward them direct to the commercial banks through which the proceeds are to be collected. Shipping companies will also be required to forward to the Central Bank a copy of each bill of lading which must be marked with the particulars of each N.C.D. 3 form with respect to the tonnage and value of each shipment covered by an N.C.D. 3 form and the number of the relative form.

All commercial banks shall then negotiate all such documents and receive payment for the goods. The commercial banks will be required to forward to the Central Bank the duplicate of Form N.C.D. 3 after certifying the amount received in respect of that shipment.

Export proceeds must be repatriated within three months from the date of export and foreign exchange realised must be surrendered by the commercial banks to the Central Bank as usual.

#### **EXPANSION AND IMPROVEMENT OF THE NATIONAL METEOROLOGICAL SERVICE IN PARAGUAY**

The purpose of the project is to assist the Government in the improvement and expansion of its meteorological observing network, the establishment of an adequate central service to process and disseminate meteorological information thus obtained, and in the modernization and improvement of the meteorological facilities at the Main Meteorological Office and the National Meteorological Centre at Asunción.

The project activities during its duration of three years will cover a programme for the expansion of the meteorological services, under which the following will be accomplished:

(a) Improve and expand the meteorological observing network by re-equipping 17 existing synoptic stations, establish five new synoptic, 18 agrometeorological and 18 hydrometeorological stations.

(b) Establish a calibration laboratory and workshop for meteorological instruments.

(c) Establish facilities and install data processing equipment for improved processing and publication of data and train counterpart personnel in the new procedures.
