Duties :

1. *Secretary*.—The Secretary will be responsible to the General Manager of the Rivers State Newspaper Corporation and will assist in effecting other decisions of the Board. The Secretary will be the Chief Administrative Officer concerned with the day-to-day running of the Corporation's affairs. He will also be required to undertake the following duties :

2. *Senior Accountant*.—The Senior Accountant will be responsible through the General Manager to the Corporation for the efficient financial administration of the Corporation's affairs. He will supervise and control the Accounts Department to ensure that its functions are carried out efficiently and in accordance with the Corporation's policy.

3. *Editor*.—To implement the editorial policy laid down by the Corporation and in so doing to ensure that details in the news, views and comments appearing in every newspaper or periodical printed and published by the Corporation reasonably and adequately reflect that policy. To be responsible to the General Manager in all matters except the editorial policy of the newspapers and periodicals. To be legally responsible for the editorial content of the newspapers and periodicals. To liaise with such members of the general public or Government as is necessary to implement the Board's editorial policy. To control and supervise all editorial staff of the newspapers and periodicals.

4. *Commercial Manager*.—The Commercial Manager will be responsible to the General Manager in the performance of his duties which involve :

- (a) Circulation of Newspapers and periodicals.
- (b) Advertisements, and Sales promotion of newspapers and periodicals.

He is also to implement sales promotion campaigns after due consultation with the General Manager.

5. *Production Manager*.—He will be responsible to the General Manager for :

- (a) direct supervision of all printing and other technical staff of the Newspaper and the Commercial Printing Division ;
- (b) prompt production of the newspapers and periodicals.

Government Notice No. 1334

National Library Decree 1970 (1970 No. 29)

LEGAL DEPOSIT OF PUBLICATIONS NOTICE

In May 1970, the Federal Military Government issued the National Library Decree 1970. The Decree specifically charged the National Library of Nigeria with the responsibility, among others, for the "development of National Bibliography of Nigeria and national bibliographical services, either in a national bibliographical centre or elsewhere." To this end, all publishers, printers, and authors are required by the Decree to deposit a specified number of copies of their publications with the National Library. This is provided for in section 4 of the Decree (Deposit Obligations). Under that section publishers are divided into two categories namely—

- (1) Commercial publishers in private business ;
- (2) Federal and State governments and their statutory agencies.

2. In respect of the first category aforesaid, it is provided that "the publisher of every book published in Nigeria shall within one month after the publication deliver at his own expense to the National Library three copies of the book." In respect of the second category, the Decree provides as follows :—

"Where any printed matter (other than matter of such descriptions as the Director may specify from time to time) is published by or on behalf of any department of government of the Federation or a State, it shall be the duty of the official in charge of the department to deliver forthwith to the Director for the purposes of the National Library—

"(a) twenty-five copies of the publication, if it is published by or on behalf of a department of government of the Federation or

(b) ten copies of the publication, if it is published by or on behalf of a department of government of a State, or such smaller numbers of copies as the Director may determine in any particular case."

3. For the purpose of the Decree—
"book" includes—

(a) all literary works such as books, pamphlets, sheets of music, maps, charts, plans, tables and compilations,

(b) dramatic works,

(c) collective works such as encyclopaedias, dictionaries, year books or similar works, newspapers, magazines and similar periodicals,

(d) any work written in distinct parts by different authors or in which a part or parts of work of different authors is or are incorporated, and every part or division of such a work, and

(e) all forms in which documentary or oral records are published ; and

"publisher", in relation to a book, means any person authorizing or causing the book to be printed and distributed in Nigeria, excluding the Federal Military Government and the Military Governor of a State (or any person acting on its or his behalf), a public officer acting in his capacity as such and any person distributing in Nigeria a book published elsewhere.

4. Failure by any publisher to comply with the requirements of the Decree mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above is an offence and any such defaulter is liable to prosecution under section 4 (4) of the Decree, which provides that—

"If a publisher fails to comply with any provision of subsection (1) or (2) of section 4, he shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £50; and the court before which he is convicted may in addition order him to deliver to the Director three copies of the book in question or to pay to the Director the value of those copies."

5. Publications received in accordance with the provisions of the Decree are listed in the *Nigerian Publications: a current national bibliography* prepared by the National Library. The said publications are issued weekly with quarterly and annual cumulations. The *Nigerian Publications* are distributed not only within Nigeria, but also throughout Africa and overseas.
